


- l. /In compliance with letter Headquarters, First United States Army dited 13 July 1944, Subject, same as above, this inization submits the following report of its activities during the month of October 1944.
 - 2. The 612th Tank Destroyer Bn was in active operation from 4 October 1944 to 31 October 1944. This bn. was relieved of assignment to NINTH U.S. Army and assigned to FIRST U.S. Army effective 22 October 1944, attachment to VIII Corps and 2nd Infantry Division remained unchanged.
 - 3. (1) From 10 October to 21 October one (1) gun was engaged in indirect fire.

 From 21 October to 30 October two (2) guns were engaged in indirect fire.
 - (2) Six thousand seven hundred and minety eight rounds (6798) were expended while in indirect fire position.
 - (3) All targets were of harrassing nature.
 - (4) Fires were not observed.
 - 4. (1) During the period 4 October to 22 October 612 Tank Destroyer En (less Co's B & C) with Co. K 9th Inf., Cannon Co 9th Inf., Co D 741st Tank En and Co. HAMUR, Belgium Secret Army attached, constituted TASK FORCE "X". Co B was attached to C.T. 23, to give close fire support and AT protection. Co C (less 2nd plt) attached to 35 Infantry Regt., to give close fire support and AT protection. 2nd Plt. Co C attached 9th Infantry Regt., to give close fire support and AT protection.
 - (2) A total of ninety-seven (97) rounds were expended at targets with direct lire.
 - (3) The following targets were engaged and believed to be destroyed:
