. Conclusion:

During the month the hattalien continued occupational duties within the prescribed area, there were no known acts of sabetage and the population seemed willing to return to their work, to clearing away the rubble and to the repair of their homes.

Until the departure of the Russian Displaced Persons from their comp at Eweibrucken, they constituted the greatest security problem. In bands up to twenty they escaped from the comp and would terrorise the Germans. Their activity in this respect increased the last few days that they were here,

Persons detained or brought in from the guard points over the Landkreis were usually violaters of travel restriction and were turned over to Military Government Detachment I GAR.

#### II. CHE SITUATION

#### REPORTS OF OPERATIONS

Location of Troops:

Pattalion Command Post, Company "A", Hendquarters Company and Pioneer Platoon visinity Heider-Ausrbach (Q 748730); Company B Command Post and Besond Platoon at Rimeschwiellar, 1 B at Cantwig, 3 B at Althornback; Company C, Ersbenberg; Reconnaissance Company (-) at Otterburg (H 027005)

The Battalion (-Ren Ce) continued Military Control and maintained law and order in the Sweibrucken, Landkreis. "A" Company supervising the eleming up of the Sussian Displaced Persons Center (No. 62-356). All Displaced Persons (7026) were repatriated on the 19th, 20th and 21st of June. "B" Company maintaining guard Fosts throughout southern sector, and collecting German assumition and equipment. "C" Company maintaining



Guard Posts in northern sector and collecting German semanition and equipment in Area. Ren Co (\* Pioneer Platoon) in 28th Division Artillery reserve and maintaining patrols in 28th Division Artillery areas. Pioneer Platoon engaged in local security of Entalian Germand Post and area reserve.

The mission of the Dattelien was accomplished planning Guard Posts and shock points throughbut the area. All sivilians traveling without proper pass or authority were turned over to Local Kilitary Government Organisation for questioning. "A" Company shipped out all Russian Displaced Persons out, supervised cleaning and guarding of supplies at former Displaced Persons Center.
