During the month the Battalion continued occupational duties within the prescribed area, there were no known acts of sabotage and the population seemed willing to return to their work, to clearing away the rubble and to the repair of their homes.

Until the departure of the Russian Displaced Persons from their camp at Zweibrucken, they constituted the greatest security problem. In bands up to twenty they escaped from the camp and would terrorize the Germans. Their activity in this respect increased the last few days that they were here.

Persons detained or brought in from the guard points over the Landkreis were usually violators of travel restriction and were turned over to Military Government Detachment I 6A2.

II. OUR SITUATION

REPORTS OF OPERATIONS

Location of Troops:

Battalion Command Post, Company "A", Headquarters Company and Pioneer Platoon vicinity Heider-Auerbach (Q 748730); Company B Command Post and Second Platoon at Rimeschwieller, 1 B at Cantwig, 3 B at Althornback; Company C, Erbenberg; Reconnaissance Company (-) at Otterburg (N 025005)

The Battalion (-Pan Co) continued Military Control and maintained law and order in the Zweibrucken, Landkreis. "A" Company supervising the cleaning up of the Russian Displaced Persons Center (No. 62-356). All Displaced Persons (7026) were repatriated on the 19th, 20th and 21st of June. "B" Company maintaining guard Posts throughout southern sector, and collecting German ammunition and equipment. "C" Company maintaining



Guard Posts in northern sector and collecting German ammunition and equipment in Area. Men Co (Pioneer Platoon) in 28th Division Artillery reserves and maintaining patrols in 28th Division Artillery areas. Pioneer Platoon engaged in local security of Battalion Command Post and area reserve.

The mission of the Battalion was accomplished planning Guard Posts and check points throughout the area. All civilians traveling without proper pass or authority were turned over to Local Military Government Organization for questioning. "A" Company shipped out all Russian Displaced Persons out, supervised cleaning and guarding of supplies at former Displaced Persons Center.
