Charactar of Mostile Oprosition:

Enemy opposition from the beach to Financpoan was spasmodic, some sectors were heavily defended while in others there was no opposition. After turning South from Pinamopoen toward Ormos opposition was exceptionally heavy with the enemy occupying excellent positions. Enemy raiding parties wire active during entire campaign.

Summary of Lessons Learned!

Troops which we worked with knew very little about combined Infantry TD tactics. As a result of this our actions in many cases were not as effective as they could have been had there been a better understanding of this operation. By the nature of the terrain our actions consisted mainly of firing from the road. The to the fact we had no terrain on which to deploy, there were very for lessons on tectios to be learned. The fact that the company was under fire a great deal and that the men know what it is like being under fire should prove of great value in future operations.

6. Special Data of Value:

The half-tracks proved exceptionally good vehicles for our purpose, their mobility was good and the armor gave excel ent protection against snipers and light sachine guns. The fire power of Helf-Tracks with one 50 Cal and one 30 Cal Machine Gun proved adoquate. The tracks which we have on MIOs at present are deteriorating rapidly. The type of track which we have, when used with grousers, is not as good as the rubber chevron or steel tracks which werr used by M. Tanks operating with us. It is recommended that either steel or chovron be made available. A Tank recovery vehicle which is authorized by T/B whould be made available to each company. In many cases this vehicle would have speeded up remains of broken tracks by several hours.

7. Narrative Chronological Report:

On 23 September the Company received 8 Helf-Tracks and apent the day in care and cleaning of equipment.

> 24 September 1944. Company spent the day on care and cleaning and gothing the Mio's ready for firing.

Compan - fired 3" guns in a 3 phase firing 25-26 September problem and fired 30 and 50 cal machine guns.

27-30 September Company prepared equipment to go for record.

- 1 5 October 1944 Company still preparing to go for record. PMD was also held each day.
- 6 October 1944 Company still making preparations to move. Company went to a Battalion formation and heard a talk by General Cill of the 32d Infantry Division.
- 7 9 October 1944 Company still making preparations to go for record.
- Tents were struck and area policed. The Company left at 07301 for LST Slot arriving there at 10001. The Company was Joined by personnel of Healquarters and Reconnaiseance Companies for transportation to destination unknown. LST #459 docked at 13001 and at 13451 the bulk stores were loaded. At 23001 the boat ramp broke and was taken to Hollandia for regains, personnel already on the boat left also. There were 78 Enlisted Men and 7 Officers.
- 11 October 1944 Balance of Company and attached units still at bivouse area waiting for the boat to return.
- 12 October 1944 The LST arrived at 20201 from repairs at Hollandia. The Company loaded some bulk stores and the remaining vehicles.
- 13 October 1944 Aboard LST #459. Personnel loaded on the LST at 01251. LST left at 01451 for Hollandia arriving there at 11001 and joined rest of convoy, which left at 14001 for Leyte Island.
- 14. 19 October 1944 Personnel aboard LST. Company learned at this time that Leyte. Philippine Islands were to be their destination. While aboard ship the personnel had schools on the characteristics of Leyte Island, possible tectics of our forces, explanation of Battalian SOI, censorship regulations, strength and disposition of the energy.
- or any enemy action took place, the plane received a marm reception and that was all that case over for the rest of the day. Fromptly at 0700I the navy began shelling the beach, and this lested for three hours. At about 0300I the smaller landing crafts began to swarm in the bay, the bay was full of all kinds of boats including troop transports. At 0900I the Navy air attack started, this lasted to 1000I. LST #459 was to beach at 1115I but due to the shallow beach it grounded 300 yards from shore and it was impossible to unload because of the dayth of the water. The LST pulled out into the bay where it remained until the following day. All personnel remained aboard the ship.
- At 0930I the equipment and personnel was started to be unloaded on to a LCT as the LGT was unable to beach. Soon as the equipment and personnel reached the beach they went into a bivouse area, 2 miles North East of Palo. This city was also to be the objective for the Company. Per VOCO Rover, one platoon was ordered to support Dandy Plus. The original plan was for this Company to support Dragon and A Company to support Dandy, but our elements were on the beach first and they were consisted with Dandy. Entire Company was been placed in direct support of Dandy

co to support Dandy Blue and platoon was assigned mission by Gompany CO to support Dandy Blue and platoon leader reported to GO at Dandy Blue at 13001. The attack pushed off at 14301 with the first platoon following the attack with the support of the Company. Newly rifle, machine gun, and A.T. fire encountered by the leading elements. One of our Destroyer Commanders observed the position of an A.T. Gun and fire was placed in this area. Results were unobserved at the time, but the next day it was found that three 75 M Mountain Guns had been knocked out by our fire. The platoon returned to their area at 17301. One of the Destroyers was slightly damaged but no casualties.

22 October 1944

Company was alerted to move to a new assembly area. Recon party left at 0930I to find an assembly area in the vicinity of Falo. No area was available there so an alternate area was picked near Hill 522. Company moved into this area at 1330I, after the area was cleared of snipers. The recon party left again to find an area in the vicinity of Falo. Company moved into this area in the city of Falo at 130I and was ready to support Dandy. Company dug in for the night and they were kept on the elect all night as Jap snipers had worked into the city. There were no casualties within the Company.

23 October 194%

Company still at Palo per VCCO Dendy. The third plate in was easigned mission of destroying pill boxes along route #1 SH of Palo by order of Company CO. Platoon moved down road 500 yards from present area. Pill boxes had already been taken. Platoon returned to area. At 1900 the 2d platoon proceeded South of Palo approximately 1000 yards accompained by a platoon of Infantry. At this point an enemy force estimated as one Company was engaged in a fire fight which lasted for 45 minutes. Five enery emplacements were destroyed and approximately 30 Japa killed. Snemy Mortar fire forced a withdrawal. Dandy called for air strike on point of enemy positions. Platoon returned to Company area. No casualties.

24 October 1944

At ONLSI Company was assigned a mission by the CO of Dandy to advance down route #2 West of Palo. 3rd Platoon left as eably area at OS25I to a point on road one and one half siles West of Palo road cleared to this point. Platoon was forced to stop because of friendly mortar fire and air strike on Hill O. Platoon returned to Company assembly area at O915I. Report made to GO of Dandy. No enemy opposition and no casualties or rounds fired.

25 October 1944

CO of Dandy assigned mission to Company CO to send one Platoon down route #2 to the foot of Hill B to determine if road was Cleared. The mission was assigned to the first platoon. The platoon left Company assembly area at 03451 to the foot of Hill B1 where strong fire from enemy Machine Gons were encountered, two Machine Gun nests were knocked out. Platoon withdrew to Company area at 10051. The fact that the road was still blocked was reported to CO of Dandy. Two sen were slightly wounded by sniper fire. At 09001 CO of Dandy ordered one elatoon to support Dandy Blue in their mission of beking Castilla. 2d platoon

6 October 1944

Principled with one platon of Infant to reconnoiter route in advance of main body and encountered sniper and Machine Gun fire at foot of Hill B. Spirers and Machine Gun nests were kneeked out in a fight which lasted 45 minutes. Wein body of Datvalion moved up and advance was continued to Sastilla. At 12457 main body of Battalion moved in and set up perimeter for the night. 2nd platoon remained in Castilla over night end were to continue in direct support of Dandy Blue. At 15001 00 of Dandy assigned mission to Company CO for one platoon to convoy 4.2 Worter Company to Castilla. The Sith Chemical Morter was contacted and preparations were made. 3rd platoon was assigned mission by Company CO. Convey left at 1600I and proceeded to Castilla without opposition. Flatoon returned to Company area at 180 I with-out casualties. Company less the 2nd platoon set up a perimeter. and spent the night in Palo. Three men were slightly wounded during energy air-raid at 14301, Hen were treated by Company Aid Men.

26 October 1944

Recon party reconnectored reads leading into Castilla and Pastrana. Preparations were made for movement to a new Bathalion assembly area. At 16001 00 of hover ordered Company to remain in present assembly erea in city of Palo. 2d Thetoen remained in Castilla in direct support of Dandy Blue. Company less 2d plateon set up perimeter for the night.

27. October 1944

Recon party reconnectored reads leading to Castilla and Pastrana. Bridge still out between Castilla and Pastrana delaying Company from moving to a new assembly area near Pastrana. 2d platoon remained in Castilla. Company less 2d platoon set up perimeter for the night.

28 October 1944

At 1000I CO of Rover elected Company to be ready to move to new assembly area in the vicinity of Alangalang. Company less 2d platoon left assembly area in Falo at 1130I. 2d platoon joined Company one mile West of Falo. Company arrived in the vicinity of Alangalang at 1645I. Distance traveled about 11 miles. One destroyer was towed back to Falo for repairs on track. For some dug in and perimeter for the night was established.

29 October 1944



Combat pairol was sent out to elear area of snipers. Demaged Destroyer was returned repaired. Recon party reconnectered reads and bridges South and Southwest to Pastrana to determine if Company could proceeded there to continue operations with Dandy. It was impossible for Destroyers to get to Pastrana because of a ten ton bridge. 60 of Dandy was contacted and informed of situation on bridge and it was suggested by Company CO that Half-Tracks be sent down to pairol reads South and Dest of Pastrana. This suggestion was accepted and two Half-Tracks and two M3's were to report to GO of Dandy at ORGOI 30 Detober 1944.

30 October 1944

Two Falf-Tracks from 3rd platoon and two M8's from Recon Company proceeded to Pastrana and patroled roads from that point to points one mile South and two miles West. Company was alerted to move to new area.

31 October 1944

Company was alerted at 073CI in preparation for move to the vicinity of Jaro at 083CI. Company left ascembly area at Alangalang and moved to Battalion Divotes one mile Southeast of Jaro arriving there at 0945I. Distance traveled approximately 5 miles. Combat patrols were sent out to secure perimeter from enemy anipers.

1 Mavember 1944

Company at Jaro. Company and two natives join them for Recomduties. Company waited in assembly area for further orders.

2 November 1944

Company elerted at 07301 to move to new area in the vicinity of Tunga. Company moved by platoons with 5 minute intervals between serials. The first serial leaving at 08301 and arriving in new assembly area one mile Sautheast of Tunga at 09301. Distance traveled approximately 5 miles. Combat patrols were sent out to clear area of snipers. Personnel dug in for the night.

3 November 1944

A school was conducted for the fire direction personnel. In the afternoon a patrol of 17 men from the Company were sent out to investigate a report from the natives which stated that 20 Jars were seen approximately 2 kilometers outside of Tunge. They encountered an ambush but suffered no casualties, approximately 12 Japs were killed on wounded. Company was put on 15 minute alart notice, due to report from S-2 that a Jap column was proceeding Mortheast between Trace to Capigara. A recon party was sent to reconnecter possible approach for enemy armor through pass towards Jaro. Company left assembly area at 15301 for Jaro upon orders of the CO of Dandy for indirect fire mission laying down a harmasing fire upon enemy positions West of Jaro. Company registered in at 17301 and continued to fire all night. Security perimeter was set up around gun positions.



4 Movember 1944

Company continued in direct firs rission on enemy positions West of Jaro until 06001. Gens remained in positions for further orders. Service echelon rejeined Company at Gun positions.

5 November 1944

Company remained in bivouse area near Jaro until 1500I at which time the Company was ordered back to the Battalion assembly area in the vicinity of Tanga. Recon party reconncitered teach positions in the vicinity of Carigara. Company placed in reserve waiting for further orders.

6 November 1944

Company elerted to move to new Battalion essembly area in the vicinity of Carigara. Company moved by platoons with 5 minute intervals between platoons. The first serial left at 09551 arriving in new area at 11001. Company was attached to Diamond per VOCO Rover for operations from Pinamopoun to Ormoe and made reconnaissance for firing positions and assembly area.

7 November 1944

Company elected to move to new area in the city of Pinasopean. 1st plateon left at 08151 and the remainder of Company left at 08451. CO Diamond ordered one section to report to CO Diamond White for mission, 1st section 1st plateon reported.

# BEGREE

7 November 1944

The section was then put in position in the vicinity of CF. Direct fire mission with Machine and 3" Guns were carried out from this point. Two bunkers were definitely destroyed. Area which was reported by Infantry to be held by the energy was thoroughly shelled. Section them supported advance of Geograpy & who had the mission of securing high ground in our direct front. Wission was completed at 1730I and reported back to the area. 124 rounds of 3", 1000 rounds of 50, and 400 rounds of 30 cal aumo were fired. No casualties were reported.

8 November 1944

1st section of 2d plateon reported to 00 2d Battalion at 06301 and was ordered to stand by. Company received mission at 14301. Mission was to advance down road and fire on targeto that were to be designated by the Infantry. Section advanced to a point approximately one and one helf miles fouth of Pinamorean before firing positions were reacted. Section undervent heavy enemy Machine Con and Small Arm fire. Section continued to advance and engage targets that were designated and also sovered areas where enemy fire was being received. After scotion completed mission they withdrew approximately 300 yards to a position near the advance Dettallos CP. At this time the Infantry made a disorganized withdrated to a count behind the Destroyers. Captain Sawer and Captain Micha of Rover reorganized the Infantry line during which time to be troper section held the ground that had already been gained. Wher the line was reorganized they reported that one SCR 300 and a trailer load of some was left in energy territory when they tere forced to withdraw. Jection then 📝 advenced up road and recovered radio and asso which ore loft behind. The section was releived of wission at 1700I and reported back to Company assembly area.

9 Hovember 1944

Ad section of 3rd plateon reported to the 60 of 2d Dathalien at the Battalien CP at a point approximately 2 miles South of Pinamopean. Section was extered to stand by for further orders. Raving received no edsairs the plateon was releived at 17001 and reported back to Company assembly area.

10 November 1946

2d section of let platoon reported to 00 of 2d Sat alion that Battelion OP was at a point approximately 2 miles South of Pinamopoan. Section ordered to stend by for further orders. Received no mission the section reported back to Company area. For VOCO Rover, Company was ordered to reconnector positions for Beach Defense from Calabsian Foint to Pinamopoan.

11 November 1944

2d section of the 2d plateon reported to the CU of the 1st
Battalian at the 1st Mattalian CP at a point approximately 2
miles South of Pinamopean. The plateon was ordered to stand by
until bridge was remained. At 13-01 the first plateon was
ordered to report to the first Pattalian CP. The plateon was
under heavy sniper fire several times during the day. The plateon
received no mission and was releived at 17001 and reported back
to the Company assembly area.

12 November

3rd platoon reported to the 60 of lat Battalien at 66301.

- 12 November 1944 The platoon was ordered to stand by for further orders. The platoon received no mission and was ordered back to Company assembly area.
- lat platoon was ordered to report to 00 1st Battalion, at a point approximately 2 miles South of Financepoan at 06301. Flatoon was ordered to stand by. Enemy Artillery shelled near the Company assembly area. Flatoon received no mission and reported back to Company assembly area.
- 14 November 1944 0945I the 2d plateon was ordered to report to the CO 2d Sattalion at a point approximately 2d miles South of Pinamopoan. Plateon was ordered to stand by for further orders. Several Artillery shells fell in the area. Received no mission so reported to Company assembly area at 1700I.
- Par FO Remrod dated 15 November 1944, Company was releived of attachment with Diamond and attached to Resor for direct support of their operation towards Ormoc. CO of Company had a conference with CO of Ramrod and CO of Ramor. The Executive Officer of Slugger was named coordinator of armored units attached to Rasor. No missions were contemplated until high ground South of Limon was secured.
- 16 November 1944 lst plateon was ordered to be in readiness in Company assembly area for any assignment with Rezor.
- 17 Hovember 1944 2d platoon was ordered to be in readiness in Company assembly area for any assignment with Rasor. Company assembly to secure area of snipers and also to contact friendly troop Artillery. Shells were falling in the Company area. Company furnished guards for ration dump.
- 18 November 1944 3rd platoon was ordered to be in readiness in Company area for any assignment with Rason. Assembly area was under enemy Artillery and small arms fire. Company furnished guards for ration dump.
- 19 November 1944 lat platoon was ordered to be in readiness for any assignment with Razor. Combat patrols were sent out to secure area of any smipers. Enemy snipers were firing over area at LCM's when they attempted to beach. Enemy Artillery shells were still landing in Company assembly area.
- 20 November 1944 Company furnished 60 EM to Resor for the purpose of carrying rations and armo to the front lines. Japs out our line of communication from Colaision Point West toward our position, adequate security measures were taken by the Company in setting up a strong parimeter around Company area.
- 21 November 1944 Company furnished 35 Em to Emzor for the purpose of carrying ammo and rations to the front lines. Company furnished communication from this point to Division throughout Battalian radio net.

22 November 1944 Commany furnished 20 men to Resor for the purpose of carrying rations and supplies to the front lines.

- 22 November 1944
- 17 men reported to QM Dump for the purpose of cut ing bandoo for donage. PM was held on all vehicles. 3rd platoon moved the Dostroyers to the beach to form a barracale for the LGM's protecting them from major fire while being unloaded.
- 23 November 1944
- Company furnished 15 men to Reser for the purpose of carrying supplies to the front lines in the vicinity of Limen. By the order of the Commanding General, Company Commander recommendated areas for direct and indirect firing missions near Limen. Recomparty was under Small Arms fire two hours. As a result of the recommissance it was recommended by the CO to the Commanding General that immediate employment was impossible mainly because of terrain obstacles. It was reported at 2000 that enemy Tanks were in the vicinity of Limen. 3rd platoon was alerted to be in readiness for any assignment.
- 24 November 1944
- At 0015 I one Half-Track and personnel reported to the Executive Officer of Slugger and escorted him to the vicinity of bison to investigate the report of energy Tanks in that sector, it was found that the Tanks had withdrawn. Flatoon reported back to assembly area at 07301.
- 25 Movember 1944
- Detail of 20 men reported to Rezer for the purpose of digging graves and 29 men reported to the Qil Dump.
- 26 November 194/.
- Detail of 40 men for the purpose of carrying rations to the front lines.
- 27 November 1944
- One Destroyer of the Ird plateon was ordered to report to the base of OP Mill to be ready to fire at any targets of opportunity from the crest of OP Mill. At 1000I the remainder of the plateon was ordered to report. The to terrain and we ther the vehicles were unable to proceed to the firing position on the crest of the hill. Plateon withdres to the base of the hill and waited for further orders. The plateon remained in that position for the night.
- 28 November 1944
- Detail of 20 men reported to the anno dump. 3rd plateon made further attempts to proceed to firing positions on the crest of OP Hill but due to the difficult terrain they again withdrew to the base of the hill.
- 29 November 1944
- Detail reported to Resor Amno Dump. 3rd platoon remained at the base of OF Hill.
- 30 November 1944
- The Company was releived of its assignment with Report and was ordered to report to the Battalion assembly area at Capecoan. Ind plateon rejoined Company at assembly area near fine nomena. Due to the poor read conditions only the wheel vehicles were able to report to the Battalion assembly area. Remainder of vehicles and personnel remained on the road one mile East of Pinamopoan and waited for the road to be repaired.
