HISTORICAL REPORT FOR 26 AUGUST-1 OCTOBER 1944



Company still at Saider New Guinea waiting 26 August - 29 August 1944 transportation to Altape. Company had PAS and Supervised athletics. Company was alerted and made prepartions to move 30 August 1944 to Aitape New Guinea. Company leaded their ammunition and Bulk stores 31 August 1944 on Liberty Ship. Company was paid at 0830K. Company loaded M-10 s and vehicles on Liberty Ship 1 September 1944 "George Inks." Company area was policed in preparation for move. Company left area near Air Strip at 030L and moved 2 September 1944 to a Bivouse camp near Liberty Ship Docks. Remainder of Company Vehicles were loaded Aboard Ship. Organizational equipment still remaining with troops 3 September 1944 was leaded aboard Ship. Company left Bivouse Area at 1145L. Personnel went aboard at 1300L. Ship left Saidor at 1430L Aboard Ship "George Luks" Personnel in Good Health September 1944 Good Sailing weather. Ship anchored at 0830L. Company Personnel unloaded 5 September 1944 in L.C.M. s at 1430L and arrived at Company area which had been prepared by our lat Platoon Men at 1500L Company had care and cleaning of equipment less lst 6 September 1944 platoon, 1st Plt had instruction on Mi's and M-10's 15 EM Trfd to Rotation Detachment, 5 EM trfd to 43d Inf Div. Company had PMS on M-10's and erected Tents. 7 September 1944 Company furnished details for QM Dump and Remainder 8 September 1944

Lectures on the organization of a T D Co and the duties of each man were given to Co. Tests were given. Technique of fire for 3" guns. PMS also.

Command inspection of small arms, qrs and vehicles. Company received new half tracks.

Company turned in 3/4 Ton Trucks. Company worked on Half Tracks. Co prepared M10's for firing

Company fired 3" Guns and also MG's from Half Track in a four phase problem 1st & 2d Platoons finished their firing and returned to Gun Park with M10's.

3rd Platoon fired their problem and returned to Gur Park. Balance of Co had care and cleaning. 27 September 1944
