Technician Fifth Grade ALBERT R. KLINGERMAN Jr 35176060, 638th Tank Destroyer Battalion (attached 84th Infantry Division), United States Army. For gallantry in action against the enemy in Germany, 8 April 1945. When his tank destroyer commander was wounded by rocket fire while directing the movements of the vehicle by periscope, Technician Fifth Grade Klingerman, serving as driver, with complete disregard for his safety, opened the hatch and continued to drive forward in the face of the hostile fire. As he brought his destroyer into position to fire upon two enemy antitank guns, an enemy rocket hit directly in front of the vehicle, killing Technician Fifth Grade Klingerman instantly. The daring action, cool courage and superior performance of duty displayed by Technician Fifth Grade Klingerman aided materially in the reduction of the hostile resistance and are in accordance with the finest traditions of the armed forces of the United States. He left the vehicle only when ordered to do so. The determined fighting spirit, disdain for danger and loyalty displayed by Corporal Depoy prevented possible loss of life and are in accordance with the finest traditions of the military service of the United States. The tank returned the fire but he manned the machine gun, which had jammed three times, until his comrades cleared the vehicle and was himself forced to withdraw. One man was wounded and six others captured by the enemy, but Private First Class Mason escaped through the woods and returned to his company two days later. The fighting spirit, courage and bravery under fire displayed by Private First Class Mason reflect high credit upon himself and the armed forces of the United States.
