Narrative 1 - 31 March 1945.

The period opened with units engaged with the enemy supporting the drive of the 83d Infantry Division towards Neuss, Germany. Zone of action along left bank of Rhine River. Company A was attached to 329th Infantry, Company B the 330th Infantry and Company C the 331st Infantry. Each company had one platoon of self-propelled and two towed. Company C engaged in battle 1 March 1945, in Honnefendorf, Germany, knocking out one Mark IV tank and aiding in the repulse of an enemy counter-attack.

The second of March at 0200, the third platoon (SP) of Company C reached the Rhine River at Oberkassel, Germany. They were the first TD unit to reach the Rhine in the Ninth and First Army fronts. The second platoon of Company C was ambushed near Kapellen, Germany on 2 March 1945 losing most of their equipment and 30 men killed, wounded or missing. Company A was in Lorrpling, Germany, Company B was in Kreuzthal, Germany and Company C was in Holzheim, Germany during the final assault of Neuss, Germany. The self-propelled platoons entered Neuss, Germany with the leading infantry elements and assisted in clearing the city. The unit moved into Dusseldorf, Germany the 3 - 4 March 1945 after all enemy opposition had been overcome.

During the period 6 - 20 March 1945 the unit completed its conversion to self-propelled concurrently with the firing of long range interdictory and harassing fire into Dusseldorf, Germany from positions in Neuss, Germany. Conversion to self-propelled was completed 13 March 1945. During the period targets of opportunity were also engaged firing across the Rhine River into Dusseldorf, Germany from positions on the west bank of the Rhine River.

The unit left Neuss, Germany, 21 March 1945 under artillery fire and moved to Gangelt, Germany for training and maintenance. Five men were wounded by the fire. The period 21 - 26 March 1945 was spent on necessary repairs to materiel, refresher training, and firing in Gangelt, Germany.

Alerted on the 26th and moved on the 27th to Anrath, Germany. Moved from Anrath, Germany the evening of the 29th, crossed the Rhine River south of Wesel, Germany and billeted in Friedrichsfeld, Germany. Left for Baltern, Germany early the morning of the 31st. Departed Baltern, Germany the same evening and billeted in the vicinity of Lüdinghausen, Germany.

The period closed without any contact with the enemy east of the Rhine River, although the pursuit was carried as far as orders permitted.
