SUBJECT: Action Against Enemy, Report After/After Action Report

The 644th TD Bn, less Co's A, B, and C, continued attachment to 8th Div Arty. All units of the Division continued mission of holding within VIII Corps Sector. Co "A" was attached to CT 121; Co "B" to CT 13; and Co "C" to CT 28. On 9 November 1944, Rec Co, 644th TD Bn, was attached to CT 28, and reassigned mission of patrolling sector between WILHELMSTAD and TROISDORF, and maintaining contact with friendly patrols of 13th and 28th Infantry Regiments on left and right.

Beginning the 15 November 1944, the 8th Infantry Division interchanged locations with 28th Infantry Division, protecting left flank of V Corps. Division, when relieved, passed to the V Corps control. CT 13 with Co "B", 644th TD Bn attached, was relieved at daylight on 16 November '44. CT 121 with Co "A", 644th TD Bn attached, was relieved in place by CT 109 (28 Inf Div) at daylight on 16 November '44. CT 28 with Co "C", 644th TD Bn attached, was relieved in place by CT 110 (28 Inf Div) at daylight on 18 Nov '44. Rec Co, 644th TD Bn, reverted to HQ control and the 644th Bn left area of WILHELMSTAD, Luxembourg at 0645 on 17 Nov '44.

On 17 November 1944 at approximately 1500 hours, 644th TD Bn arrived in new area (929344) and relieved HQ platoons. Upon arrival, or during next 14 hours, taken over from units of 28th Inf Div.

On 18 November 1944, Co "A", 644th TD Bn, was attached to 13th Infantry Regiment; Co "B", 644th TD Bn, was attached to 28th Infantry Regiment; and Co "C", 644th TD Bn, was returned to HQ control. The 644th TD Bn (less Co B + C) attached to Div Arty.

On 21 November 1944, the V Corps started attack to seize and hold KLEINNAU and HURIGEN and the connecting road between these towns against enemy attack from north, east and southeast. Co "A" 644th TD Bn, attached to 121 Inf Reg't, fought through Phase I of this attack. Co "B", attached to 13th Infantry Reg't, with mission of supporting that Regiment to hold on right flank and maintain patrols. Co "C", 644th TD Bn, attached to 28th Infantry Regiment.

On 26 November 1944, the Dr (less Co "A") was attached to 121st Inf Reg't. Co "B" in close support of 1st Bn, 13th Inf (also attached to 1st), supporting the 121st Inf, moved into HURIGEN. Co "A", in close support of 2nd Dr, 121st Inf, moved into HURIGEN.

On 29 November 1944, one platoon, Co "A", attached to 1st Bn, 13th Inf Reg't to hold KLEINNAU, Co's "B" and "C" attached to 121st.

Co "A", moving over circuitous route, reached northern edge of HURIGEN at approximately 290200 Nov '44 to carry out mission of supporting the 1st Bn, 121st Inf Reg't. Co "A" arrived in position less two (2) destroyers. All are now operational.

Co "G", following the tanks of 709th Tank Bn, arrived on their objective in MUNSTER with the infantry riding the TD's. Buildings and other targets in the town were fired upon and MUNSTER was taken by our forces. Co "C" suffered loss of nine, (9) M-10's, due to mines and the difficult terrain and arrived in MUNSTER with only three (3) destroyers, however, by 1500 of the same day, five (5) M-10's were operational and the company now has a total of eleven (11) M-10's operational. Three destroyers were recovered and put in working order by this unit.

Co "B" continued support of 13th Inf Reg't throughout the period. Mission of holding force only.

On 22 November 1944, at 1700, Co "F", moved one destroyer let platoon, to fire on M-4 tank used by Germans to bring heavy MG fire upon leading elements of the infantry screen in that sector. This M-4 tank was destroyed.

On 23 November 1944, Co "A", 644th TD Bn, sent one (1) destroyer up road #1 - HU 7111 road to (022342) for purpose of firing at the site of a mortuary. On 23 November 1944, Co "D" sent one destroyer or the platoon to (087304) for purpose of locating enemy gun, by search, and firing counter-battery direct fire at enemy gun.

Co "C", following the tanks of 709th Tank Bn., arrived on  
main objective in mission with the infantry riding the TD's.  
Buildings and other targets in the town were fired upon and  
several gun teams by our forces. Co "C" suffered loss of nine,  
(9) M-10's due to mines and the difficult terrain and arrived  
in mission with only three (3) destroyers, however, by 1500 of  
the same day, five (5) M-10's were operational and the company  
now has a total of eleven (11) M-10's operational. These  
destroyers were recovered and put in working order by 81mm unit.

Co "B" continued support of 13th Inf Reg't throughout the  
period. Mission of holding force only.

On 22 November 1944, at 1700, Co "A", moved one destroyer  
per platoon, to fire on M-4 tank used by Germans to bring heavy  
MG fire upon leading elements of the infantry company in that  
sector. This M-4 tank was destroyed.

On 23 November 1944, Co "A", 644th TD Bn, sent one (1)  
destroyer up CHETTER - HUTCHIN road to (028342) for purpose  
of firing at targets of opportunity. On 23 November 1944, Co  
"B" sent one destroyer of 3rd Platoon to (087204) for purpose  
of locating enemy gun, by flash, and firing counter-battery  
direct fire at near-by guns.
