II. AWARD OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL.

By direction of the President, under the provisions of Executive Order No. 9419, 4 February 1944 (Section II, Bulletin 3, WD, 1944), a Bronze Star Medal is awarded by the Commanding General, 41st Infantry Division, to the following officers and enlisted men:

First Lieutenant LOWELL HARDIN, (01822268), Infantry (Armored), United States Army. For heroic achievement in connection with military operations against the enemy on Mindanao, Philippine Islands, on 10mMarch 1945. During the landing of the assault waves under fire of enemy artillery and mortars, First Lieutenant Hardin noticed one of the vehicles of his command hung on a coral reef and that the enemy had apparently spotted this particular vehicle for they began to adjust fire on it. First Lieutenant Hardin's vehicle and one other went to the disabled vehicle's assistance. He dove into the water with a cleves and fastened two cables together thus enabling the two vehicles to tow the disabled vehicle off the reef. By his disregard for his own personal safety and his outstanding devotion to duty, First Lieutenant Hardin saved both the crew and the vehicle for but a few minutes later enemy shells fell on the exact spot where the vehicle had been. EXTRACT

II - SILVER STAR.—By direction of the President, under the provisions of the act of Congress approved 9 July 1918 (Bul 43 WD 1918), a Silver Star for gallantry in action at Cebu, Philippine Islands, is awarded to the following named officer:

CAPTAIN DANIEL LADD Oll69209, Field Artillery, United States Army. Leading his company of amphibious vehicles which were carryin the Infantry for the assault landing on Cebu on 26 March 1945, CAPTAIN IADD found the beach to be heavily mined and thick with antitank obstacles. Due to enemy mortar firs landing near the water edge explosion of the mines were believed to be mortar fire. Seventeen of the amphibious vehisles were damaged by mines. As a result the assault waves bogged down and many infantrymen dismounted from the vehicles. Mines were pressure type set for both personnel and vehicles. Realizing the absolute neckssity of getting the vehicles moving forward. CAP-TAIN IADD dismounted from his own vehicle which was out of action and proceeding through the heavily mined beach in spite of the danger of detonating the mines, reorganized the remaining vehicles into waves. He then commanded another vehicle and led the reorganised waves forward to the objective. By his actions he not only aided in accomplishing a difficult mission, showing complete disregard for his own safety, but he instilled confidence and determination in the men about him.
