Action of "A" Company, 26 Pobruary - 7 March 1945.

During operations of the 3rd Armored Division in its attack from the ROER River to COLOGER, Germany, "A" Company was attached 30 C Cond "A". The following narrative covers its action during this attack.

let Platoon

The First Platoon was attached to 27 KARE, and on Pobracy 25, assembled in the vicinity of DUREN (Fl247) in preparation for the attack the following morning. During the first several days of the attack the platoon remained in TF Reserve, maintaining defensive road blocks, and had no offensive role. On 26 February, the platoon moved to BUIR (F192517), on 27 Pebruary, to HIPPENDRF (F230578), and on 28 February to ZIEVERICH (F218618) where it remained until 2 March, for a bridgehead to be established across the ERFT Canal into BEROHBIN (P231622).

On 2 March, the task force attacked toward OBERHAUSSEN (1259645), where the platoon maintained road blocks, and on 3 March, secured BUSDORF (9281665), by-peaced Fleisteden (9302665), took MANSTEDIEN (9320659), and PULKEIM (9345670). During the attack on BUSDORF the TD's covered the tenks from the high ground to the south of the town, and fired two roands of APCEDF, range 2000 Fards, at a tank alongside the railroad track just south of RESIDE (9265685). Only one of the TD's was in position to fire at the tank, and this TD was in such a position that, although the TD Commander could see the tunk ever the erest of the Aill, the gumer could not see the tunk through the sights. The Commander directed the fire by observation, and the tank withdraw through an underpose, after the second round had been fired.


Late in the afternoon the platter reached PURRIN, and remained there for two days. On 5 Mar the tank force attacked cost through OFR (7564682) and AUVELIER (7581675), and then moved south into COL-

OGHE, where it reached the HHISE River on 6 March 1945.
This ended the operation for the task force, other than the maintenance of road blooks and road patrols, until they were relieved on 16 Mar. At this time the platoon reverted to Company control. and moved to an assembly area in vicinity of KHAPSACK (7576507).

2nd Platoon

The Second Flatoon remained with the Company OF in O Comd "A" reserve throughout the operation, and can no action whetherver. On 26 Pobracy thay remained in DURBE (RLB47), on 27 Pobracy at MERSHED (FLB487), on 28 Pobracy at MARRIE (RCB506), and on 1 March and 2 March at BERRENDORF(P-197794). While at this location the term was bended and strafed on the might of 1 March by enemy almorate, but the plateous received no committee.

On 5 March 18 moved to EMPTH (7239618), 4 March to CHREADE (7259645), 5 March to PUZZEZE (7345670), 6 March to EMCELIMEN (642), and on 7 March 1880 COLOGER, when the operation ended.





3rd Platoon

The Third Platoon was attached to TF "I" (Battle Group ORR) and on 26 Pebruary took positions just south of ERZENICH(7148487), covering the attack on GOLZHEIM(7187495). When GOLZHEIM (7187495). force attacked BLATZHEIM P224515 and the TD's moved into the town and went into road block positions overnight. On 27 February the Task Porce attacked BTRGTRHAUSEN (P235522), the TD's covering the attack from the east end of BLATZHEIM. After dark they moved into BYRGYRHAUSE taking up positions covering the right flank of the task force, and remained there the rest of the night. The following afternoon they moved to THOR (P225605), and went into a rest position until 2 Hardh.

On 2 Harch the platoon crossed the ERFT Canal under heavy artill-

ery fire, arriving at OBEREAUS. MR (P259645) at dusk, and they remained there that night. The following morning the task force continued the attack, and at FLEISTEDEN (P502665), moved into positions covering the attack on the towns of GRYEN (P502665), SINTHERN (P528645), and MANSTEDEN (F520659). From this position the plateon fired 5 rounds of HE, range 800 /ards, knocking out a machine gun nest in the scator of the 104th Infantry Division to the south, and 9 rounds of HE and 4 rounds of /P at possible anti-tank positions in MANSTEDERN. The range was 3200 yards, results unobserved. At 1430 hours, they moved into GEYEM, and fired 3 rounds of HE at 300 yards range, into a bern suspected of housing enery.

on 4 March the plateon moved to PUIHRIM (F545670), and relieved some tanks on road block at a factory at F565658 for the night. The following morning they moved to BROCKLEMUND (P390642), protecting the right flank of the task force, and in the afternoon moved again to

BICKUNDORF F-415628 for the night.

on 6 March the plateon split into sections, each section moving with a Combat Team into COLOUNZ. During the attack the lat section fired 7 rounds of HE, one of the rounds having a 9-105 fuse, at two enemy strong points behind a railroad treatle, and a short distance further on, fired 9 rounds of HE into buildings from which snipers had been firing. The 2nd section fired 3 rounds of RH at a meehing

gun nest, and knocked it out.

The task force remoked the RHINE River that night, and the platoon remained on road block positions vicinity of COLOGHE, until they were relieved on 16 Earch 1945.

Action of "B" Company, 26 Pedruary - 7 March 1945.

During operations of the 3rd Armored Division in its attack from the RORR River to COLOGHE, Germany, "B" Company was attached to 0 cond "B". The following narrative covers its action.

let Platoon

The Pirst Platoon remained in C Cond "B" reserve during the entire attack and was not committed during the operation. However, on 7 March, they joined TP LOVELADE, relieving the 5rd Platoon, and moved on 5 March to KOTTINGEN 7540452, where they remained until the next operation.

2nd Platoon

The second Platoon was attached to TF WRLBORN and moved in task force reserve to RTZWEI LER (F172570), where it maintained road blocks that night. Until 5 March the plateon saw no action, and moved successively to RISDORF (F180605), GLESCH (F197645), HIEDERAUSSEM (F251-658), BUSDORF (F681665), PUINEIM (F545670), SINFERSDORF (F585690) and the task force attacked toward RSCH (F585690) and

when it had been secured the destroyers took up covering positions for the tanks, moving toward LONGERICH (M47668). One destroyer sighted a German tank just west of the railroadthack at LONGERICH, and fired two rounds of APO. At almost the same time the artillery placed smake on the town and the results of the firing were unobserv-**•4**.

This was the only action in which the platoon took part during the eperation. On 6 March the destroyers took positions in the vicinity of the Ford Motor Plant (3455660), and on 7 March returned to LOWSERION with the Company OF.

Ird Platon

The 3rd Flatoon was attached to TT LOYELADE and moved out on 26 Pebruary as far as H.S. TANKER (F182569), taking positions covering temars the East. At this location they captured 14 PV's from e Chateur. On 27 February the platoon moved to BERRENDORF (F195594)

and remained there until the morning of 1 March 1945.

On 1 March the TD's moved to PAPPENDORF F208654 remaining there for two days. On the morning of 5 March the teak force erosed the

for two days. On the morning of 3 March the tesk force exceed the METT Canal, moved through MIRIMPHAUSSEM P251658 into BUSDORF P281-665. puring operations of the 3rd Armored Division in its attack from the ROER River to COLOGNE, "C" Co (minus the lat Platoon) was attached to C Comd Reserve, and the lat Platoon was attached to Task Force YEOMANS, under division control. The following narrative covers its action.

1st Platoon

TF YEOMANS moved out at 0400 hours, 26 Mabshary, from DURUN, and by 1700 hours had reached MUNHETM (F202542), where the works established road blocks for the night. At 0600 hours the next morning they moved toward BERRENDORF F193594 where they received heavy srtillery fire. One round struck the house in which the Platoon GP was located, killing Pvt Papinou and wounding Pvt Davis. From PERSENDORF the task force attacked GROUVEN F205603, and was unable to take the town. After regrouping they attacked again and seized the town. The lat section remained in GROUVEN while the 2nd section continued with part of the task force to attack LIEVER-ICE F218618 that night. The following morning the 2nd section returned to GROUVEN and rejoined the platoom.

On 1 March, at 2030 hours, the TD's shows the WRFT Canal at BUNGHMIM F231622, and moved into a northeast of BUNGHMIW to support the attack on HOLDING shows.
