Ren Co plus 1 pltn of Ren attempted to clear Liffol le Grand of 60 enemy but were driven away by arty fire. Time 1900. No casualties. A Co operating with CTS moved forward with inf. but stopped by arty and SA fire on high ground at CR NE of Foussey at 1900. Tee 5 Brignac, motorcyclist (RIA) by enemy arty fire at 1850. B Co operating with CTS marched towards Charmes with Inf. 1 Sec 3rd pltn in firing position at Coussey (404802) and 1 Sec at Soulesse, (514787) from 1200 to 1850. No action except light enemy arty fire. Co closed 1 mile W of Saccourt (885783) at 2100. 2nd pltn in position 803783. 1st sec, 1st pltn in position at (882730). No action. C Co. operating with CTS engaged enemy vicinity of Neufchateau. One M-10 No'd at 1145 at 418741 by 7.5cm AT gun. No casualties.




