## HEADQUARTERS 771.TH TANK DESTROYER BATTALION APO 1.03 US ARMY

1 February 1945

SUBJECT: After Battle Report.

TO: CG, XX Corps. (thru channels)

The 774th TD Bn. (towed), attached to the 90th Infantry Division and further attached to the 3rd Cavelry Group had the mission of furnishing Anti-mechanised protection of the north flank of the XX Corps area from positions along the OFL at strategic points which the enemy would most likely use for an armored attack in this sector.

The Battelion with CP at Sierck-lesBains, France, QOCh965, employed its Platoons as follows: 1st Platoon, Co. "A" at Borg, 1062006, 2nd Platoon, Co. "A" at Hellendorf, QO65983, 3rd Flatoon, Co "A" at Wechern, 1038012. Co. "B" 3rd Platoon, on high ground south of Eft, QO60973, 1st Platoon, Co "B" in position at Buschdorf and Tunsdorf, QO87977, Q104979 and 2nd Platoon, Co. "B", vic. of Wehingen, Q112965. 1st Platoon, Co. "C", at Besch, 2nd Platoon, Co. "C", at Eft, 1012015, Q065982 and 3rd Platoon, Co. "C", at Apach, Q013965. 1st Platoon, Ron, maintained an OF at Besch. 2nd Ron Platoon, in reserve in vic. of Rn. CP. Except for occasional enemy artillery and mortar fire and small enemy foot patrols the entire area remained very quiet.

On 7 January 1945 the 94th Infantry Division relieved the 90th Infantry Division and at that time the Battalion was relieved from previous attachments and attached to the 94th Infantry Division. The mission assigned the Battalion by the 94th Infantry Division was to continue to furnish Anti-Kechanized protection from the present positions.

On 10 January 19h5 the 3rd Platoon, Co. "A" was relieved by Anti-Tank Platoon of the 376th Infantry and placed in position in vic. of Perl, Q123979 thereby adding depth to the anti-tank defenses of the Division area.

On 21 January 1945 the 3rd Flatoon, Co. "C", under the cover of darkness relieved a Flatoon of the 607th TD Bn in Nenning, 1621643. AT 2000 the town of Nenning was counterattacked by German tanks and infantry. German tanks were estimated at 1 company and Infantry estimated at 1 Battalion. This attack came as a surprise and since friendly infantry was forced to withdraw it was necessary for this Blatoon to defend its positions by small arms fire. After a short and bitter contact, 2 Gun Sections were forced to evacuate their positions on foot and retira in the face of the approaching energy. It is felt that the presence of this Flatoon in Nemning aided materially in repulsing the counterattack and holding the village.

placed in indirect firing positions with a mission to support the fire of the 2h Field tillery Battalion. Co. "C" remained in position and to the end of the period has fired 289 rounds HE and 12 rounds Illuminating.

30 January 1965, 3rd Platoon, Co. "A" was moved into positions formerly occupied by Co. "C", in the vic. of Eft, Q000973.

31 January 1965, 2nd Ron Flatoon established OP at Q100979 and 1st Hon Flatoon was withdrawn to Bettalion reserve at vic. of Battalion CP.
