SUBJECT: Action Against Enemy, Reports After Action Reports.

1. In compliance with AR 345-105 the following report is sub-

I April - Solet T.D. Bn (-) assembled vic SEMDELHONST in Gy reserve. B Co. securied road blocks on main reads from SELDENHORET.

C Co. moved in vis of OTTMARS-BOCHATT, placed two platoons in recorve while the third established road blocks in that area.

At 1500, Bm (-) moved and closed in HEWHECKUM.

B Co received mission of Gp security and occupied road blocks East of town.

The 2nd Ren platoon which was attached to B co, patrolled the roads between the road blocks.

A Co still attached to the 113th Cav Squadron.

2 April - Ba advance with Co B meved to the town of VARL.

B co occupied road blocks on main roads leading into town. The 2nd Ron plateon patrolled the road net around town and established contact with friendly elements in near-by towns.

Co A moved to a new location approximately 10 miles North of VERL. The 2nd and Srd platoons eccupied road blocks while the attached Ron platoon petrolled and made contact with them.

C Co moved to vis. RHEDA. The 1st platoon occupied indirect fire positions at GLARHOLZ. The 2nd platoon direct fire positions at HELEEROZK. The 3rd platoon attached to troop A 125th Cav Squadron established Fred blocks with one section at FRECEERCRST and its second section at WESTQLRCHEN. The attached Ron platoen conducted road patrols.

3 April - The Bn Fwd closed in VIRL and united with the advance. Go A was relieved of attachment to the 113th and attached to the 125th Cav Squadrom.

Co B with its attached Ren plateon received orders to support the 125th Cav Squairon in clearing the town of BILLEFALD. B Co fired 5 rds of APC and 20 rds of HZ at enemy troops located in houses. Casualties were observed.

C Co moved to vie of GUTERSLOH. Its 1st and 3rd plateons occuried road blocks while its 2nd plateon and attached Ren plateon remained in reserve vic UMERLL. Thirty one Fa's were captured by the 3rd plateon. A Co captured 12 Pate vie FATEDICHSDONF.

4 April - Bn CP moved to the vio of OERLINGHAUSEN.

5 April - Bn redesignated as Solst T.D. Bn. Self Propelled per par 1, S.O. No. 91 Ng. 9th U.S. Army dated 29 March 1945.

Co A moved to an assembly area vic of MERENHERKEN.

Co B occupied road blocks in the vic of HOLZHSN-RETIEN-RECNTORF. A small enemy force attacked this positions about 1200 noon. Five enemy killed, one wounded and 50 prisoners were taken. Thirty five rds of HE and small arms amounition was expended.

Co C eccupied read blocks in the vic of KACHTEN. The 3rd platoon was attacked by approximately 100 infantry. Four wore killed, 4 wounded and 54 prisoners were captured. Platoon received one casualty.

Bn assembled in its present locations and moved South to the 83rd Div sone of action. The Bn CP closed in the term of MIL-HEIM. A, B, C Cos assembled in the vis of MEUENHERCEN.

Letter of instructions Hq XIX Corps attaching Y and S platoons 453rd AAA In to this organisation. These platoens were further attached to Ges A and C respectively.

6 April - Letter of instructions Ho. 137 Hq. XIX Corps stashing 113th Cav Gp with the SOL TD Bn attached, to the Sard Inf Div. The Bn CO contacted the GO of the Sard Inf Div, received the mission of protecting Div right flank on its advance through Germany. Div boundaries were received. A plan was drawn up by this Hq to place road blocks on all reads leading into the Div sector from the right flank. Every road block was numbered. This plan was submitted to Higher Hq.

A do moved to new positions in the vic of NEVENBUREN. The lst platoon cleared town of NAWITZEN, encountering small arms fire, then occupied positions in the vic of BAD-DRIBURG.

Co B occupied positions in the vic of HOHCHAUS. Third platoon occupied road blocks nos 13 and 14. Une section of the Ren platoon outrosted these road blocks.

C Co moved to the vie of NIEMPIN. The first and 2nd platoons established road block in the vie of BELLINSEN, ABHENBURG and ALTEREDUCTION. The 3rd platoon occupied road blocks vie of EILVERENE. The attached AAA platoon assisted in this mission. Twenty four prisoners were captured in this vicinity.

7 April - At 0700 all three Ron plateons were detached and placed wader company control.

Ren Co was given the mission to elear the following terns of enemy: HEMENBURG, STRINHERGEN, QUENLISH, ENTRUP, POHRE and QUENLUSEN. Patrols were organized and reconnaissance through these towns commenced. Mission accomplished at 1715 with no casualties. The plateons were again establish to their respective companies. A Co relieved of all sead blocks and assembled vie of BAD-INTINES.

B Co occupied read blocks 13, 14 and 15 in the vie of ALBAXEN. THE 2nd platoon fired 4 rds of HE at approximately 40

enemy on bycicles. Casualties were observed. The 1st platoon destreyed one Mark IV tank located near HOLZMINNEN with four rds of AFC. Fifteen rds of HE were also expended on house which appeared to be enemy CP. Approximately 50 enemy were observed in this vioity.

The Bn CO received orders from the CG 63rd Div to clear town of OVENHAUSHE. This town was situated on the right flank of the Div and had been by-passed by the infantry because a considerable amount of resistance had been received on the initial attack.

The Bn CO organised three small task force each consisting of a TD platoon and a Ren platoon. These task force were to approach the town on main roads from the North, the West and the South. At 1705 the three forces met in the center of town with vesy little opposition. A total of 29 prisoners were taken. C Ge established road blocks with one platoon on the East side of town.

The ken Co with its remaining platoon patrolled the area South of the Div sector and made contact with Srd Armored Div, the unit on the right flank of the Div.

One platoon of Inf was attached to the 1st platoon of Co B to assist in maintaining the road block in the vig of ALRANEN.

At 2200 one platoon of Co C plus two attached AAA plateons were given the mission of protecting and securing the bridge at OROHNDE.

8 April - The Bn less Co A, 2nd plat of Co C, let Ren plat and two attached AAA platoons moved to an ascembly area East of the Veser River to HOLZEN. At 0800 the 2nd platoon of Co C and the two AAA platoons occupied positions in the vie of GROMNEE to protect the treadway bridge across the Weser River from ground and air attacks.

Co A moved to HOXTER and took up positions covering the main roads into town. The 1st Ron plateen reconncitered routes from BOSSENBORH to HOXTER. A small energy force was contacted by this plateon of which small arms manumition was expended. One officer and 5 EM were taken prisoner by this plateon. During the march to HOLZEN the En was straffed by 12 ME-109. No casualties were received.

9 April - Co A remained in position in the vie of HOXTER.

The 2nd platoon of Co B fired 12 rds of HE into the town of SCHOREDRE. The 3rd platoon of Co B fired 22 rds of HE at energy personnel located on the high ground EE of SCHOREDRE. Several cosualties were observed. The 3rd platoen escupied direct fire peaitions in the visibility of HEIMAN.

C Ce was attached to 125th Car Bedrn and received orders to assemble at BOITER. At 1900 C Co received orders from the 125th Cav Sqdrn to guard & septured German anne dump near GIESEN. The 3rd Hon plateon was detabled from C Co and attached to B Co fer rations and operations. Their mission was to proceed and occupy the town of HEINADE. At 1500 the town was entered by this plateom with

no operation whatseever. One section saw enemy movement on the SE pert of town and opened up fire. Casualties were observed. One man from the 2nd Hon platoes was killed in this action by panserfaust fire. One marauder platoon from 83rd Inf Div reinforced the 3rd misteon of Co B.

10 Awril - Bn CF moved to vie WENZEN closed at 1140 and again at 1830 moved to town of CANDERSHEIM closing at 1700. The En plus two plateons of the 455 AAA less Co C attached to 330 Inf Hegt.

The 2nd Ron platoon was given the mission to hold the tewn of BRACH. Then at 1800 was attached to B Co. Co A meyod to vis of DANNHAUSEN. Platoons occupied road

blocks to the South and SE.

Ce B moved vie DEENSIN. The 1st platoon occupied direct fire positions vie GREAR. The 2nd and 3rd platsons moved to assembly positions vie GANDERSEEIM.

C Co assembled in the vic of ALCENE SSIN. At request of Div Commander, 10 EM remained as guards on amao dump.

Orders received from Squadron Commander to move C Co to MUNSTEDT.

11 April - The Bn CP moved to GEESEN elosed at 1100 then moved to COSLUC closing at 1540.

The 1st and 2nd plateons of Co A moved to an assembly area vic COSLAR. The 2nd platoon moved to town of DUDERODE and OLUMERODE. These towns had not been cleared. As a result the platoon expended small arms emmitten and captured 46 PV's.

Co B moved from assembly positions at GAUDERCHEIM to assembly area bic SERSEN. The 2nd and 3rd platoons occupied direct fire positions in the vie of LAUFTENTHAL. Mine TW's were taken in this area.

At 1700 the Bn less Co C was attached to the 330th Inf Rogt.

C Co moved to assembly area vie of TANDEBURG and then to MEVERED. The 1st and 2nd platoons securied road blocks to the South and East of this town. A small enemy force attacked these road blocks. Thirty two rds of HE and small arms annunition were expended. Results of firing, 7 killed, one wounded and 30 taken prisoners.

12 April - First platoon of Co A maintained road block No. 23. The 2nd and 3rd platoons of Co A maintained road blocks 18, 19 and 20.

B Co's CP remained in SEESEN. The first platoon occupied direct fire positions in the vic of ORER. The 2nd platoon occupied road blocks vic BOCHWEISS, and the 3rd plateon vic WILDEMAN.

The lat platoon of Co C moved to vic WAGGUM to hold and secure a captured airport. The 3rd plateon moved to LEHRE and esta-blished road blocks with troop F. The 2nd plateon received the mission to safemuard allied PW's in a consentration camp vic WAGOUM. Co C CP moved vic LEHRE.

13 April - Bn CP moved to vie BAD-HAREBURG.

Bn Rear Echelon located vie GOSLAR captured 36 PW's.

Co A located wis GOSLAR, the three platoons occupied road blocks to the SOUTH of GOSLAR. Thirty PW's were captured by this Co. Go B moved to vic GOSLAR and established read blocks 19,

20 and 22. Thirty nine "W's were captured by this company.

Ren Co moved to town of BAD-HANZBURG. First platoon attached to Co A moved from GOSLAR providing security for the 3rd platoon of Co A. Two Shi from the 2nd Ren platoon were injured by Arty fire while on a security mission for A Co.

C fo moved to vie LEHRE. The 3rd platoon received small arms fire from approximately 20 enemy. Four PW's were taken and two enemy killed.

At 1950 a task force was formed which included one section of light tanks and one TD section from the 3rd platoon to round up enemy in the vie of VENDHAUGEN. A small arms fight developed. Forty one PW's were taken.

14 April - The 1st platoon of Co A plus stissied Ren platoon and AAA guns established food blocks on the Mastern approaches of WERHIGERODE. The And platoon of Co A established road blocks South of WERHIGERODE. The 3rd platoon plus attached Ren and two gunds of AAA securied road blocks at STAPELBURG and ILSEBBURG. Co A GP moved vie ILSEBBURG.

Co B septured 89 Germans in the vie of their road blocks South. of GOSLAR.

C Co relieved from present assignment by 35th Inf Div. At 2030 company accembled vie LERRE. A total of 26 prisoners were taken.

15 April - The lat Ron platoon covering the road junction South of ILSUMPLAC captured a platoon of enemy complete with equipment.

One section of the 3rd platoon of Co A received orders and moved further inte woods. Eleven PV's were taken by A Co in this period. Five drivers reported to Bn rear to pick up M-18's.

Co B remained wie GOSLAR. Wifty six pw's taken during this period.

Co C moved to vic COLBITZ in assembly area. Eleven TW'S were taken during this period.

16 April - One section of the let platoon of Hon Co reconnoitered a route to a road junction South of WERNIGHTONE. During this mission they encountered enemy machine guns and shall arms fire. Thirty seven rds of cenister and small arms semunition were expended. One officer and 17 enemy marks emptured and approximately 11 killed.

One section of the 3rd platoon of A Co and one section of Hen platoon worked the previously reconnoitered road junctions. Five Fills taken define period.

Five To's taken define period. Co B remained in same position. Two officers and 19 EM taken prisoner during the period.

At 1130, C Co received orders to employ 2 platoons as read blocks at MEUHALDENSLEHEN. At 1200 the Co moved to this town and employed their unit as ordered. Twenty PW's taken during this period.

17 April - Ron Co captured 23 enemy during this period.

Co A layed wise for communications with read block 24B. This read block was located about six miles in the woods and as a result radio communication could not be made. Thirty-three PS's taken during period.

B Co remained in same location and captured 11 enemy during period.

C Co remained in same location and captured 17 enemy during period.

18 April - Bn CT moved vic MINNIGERODE.

Ren Co CT moved to WERNIGERODE. Its ist platoon supporting Co A. Second and 3rd platoons supporting Co B. T. irty two TW's taken during period.

A Co was contacted at road block No 24 by elements of the 26 Regt. Sixteen DW's were taken during period. The 2nd platoon received 2 M-18's making a total of four.

B Co moved via BAD-HARZEVED. Ron was made for firing positions. Hill 1142 the highest point in the HAEZ mountains contained a somewhat large force of energy which caused a considerable amount of trouble to elements in that vicinity. These positions had to include the top of Hill 1142 in its field of fire. Twenty TW's were taken during period.

C Co remained in same lession. One platoon was moved SE of BORE to guard enemy signal supply depot.

19 April - The 2nd plateen of Ce A changed positions with the lat plateon of Ce A. Due to the fast that the 2nd plateen had M-16's and the area they had to cover was heavily wooded, a change was made so as to place the M-18's in the open where they could have mobility. Four TW's were taken during this period.

B Co moved to vie ILSENDERG. The 1st platoon moved to WERNIGERODE. The 3rd plateon placed 2 guns in the pre-selected firing positions to accomplish its mission of firing on Hill No. 1142. Hinsteen rds of HE were expended on this point with results unknown. Sixteen priseders were taken during this period.

C Co remained in some location. Seven DW's were taken during period.

The Fioneer platoon of Ren Co blew a small ammo dump in the vio of WERNIGERCOME.

20 April - At 1990 the Dn was relieved from the 83rd Div and ordered to proceed to an assembly area vie IMANARODE. Units of the Bn were relieved from outpost positions by elements of the 8th Arm'd Div. The two platoons of the 453 AAA Bn were detached. The Bn less C Co closed in the vis of IMARAFORM at 1445.

C Co was relieved of attachment to the 125th Cav Sedra., reverted to Bn control and arrived in INCENDINE at 1500. A Sotal of 1417 prisoners were captured this month to this date.

21 April - Preparations were being made to convert the Bn to a SP unit. First echelon maintnance and cleaning of equipment was the strictly enforced. Reorganization of the personnel of the In was in progress. Six M-18's were reseived from Ordnance which were second-hand. As a result the Ba maintenance and Co mechanics had to pull all the motors for inspection and repair.

22 April - Kaintenance and cleaning of equipment in progress.

23 April - Over strength personnel transferred from unit. Excess. same due to conversion turned in to ordnance. All three inch guns and excess vehicles turned into ardnance.

24 April - The Ba reseived a copy of a message from CG Ninth US Army to CG XIX Corps directing the Ba to proceed to MSCHEMAU by motor on the 25 of April and report to 13th Arm'd Div. Third US Army.

The Bn 60 held a staff and company commander's meeting and discussed a movement order including routes of march, order of march, march dissipline and time intervals.

- En received 18 M-16's and two M-32's completing the major items of equipment.

25 April - The Ba CO, S-1, S-4, Lisison Officer and Co billeting parties proceeded to the 13th Arm'd Div. A billeting party from the En moved out for the assembly area, (over-night camp) vie ARMETADT. The Bn passed the IP (GOSLAR) at 0800. The Bn arrived at assembly area in ARNSTADT at 1845. Five K-18's and one Halftrack had broken down during the march. The Bn maintenance recovered these vehicles and proceeded as far as MULHAUSEN. One hundred and thirty seven miles were travelled this day.

26 April - Billeting party left for PARSHERG and were given assembly area via LUPBURG.

The Bn moved from ANNEXATT and passed IT at 0300. The In closed in new assembly area (INPRING) at 2300. One hundred and ninety seven miles severed during the day.

27 April - The Ba alighed to CCR, 13th Arm'd Div.

From 0100 to 0400 companies refilled their vehicles with gas and prepared for future operationes During the day all the personnel cleaned up and rested as much as possible.

28 April - The Bn (-) hear Eck and Fioncer Flatoon of Hen Co passed IF at 0245 with the mission to follow CCH and cross the DAUGE Hiver. Bn closed in its new assembly area vic OBERTHAUELING at 2200, all vahioles were immediately refilled.

29 April - At 0909 Co A attached to CCA, Co B attached to CCB. One Ron platoon was attached to each company.

The Ba (-) moved with CCR at 1200 to cross the IDAN River. Bn (-) closed in assembly area at RIMBACH on North side of the river. Co A cocupied direct fire pod tions covering roads les-

ding from MARTINGHAUN.

Co B moyed with CCB and assembled in town of FLATTING.

Ecn Co (-) attached to TF GALE with mission of maintaining contact with CGA and CCR.

30 April - The 3rd Ron platoon maintained contact between CCR and COB. Cleary four Pyle taken on first patrol.

Ren Co (.) moved to town of TILSTING. Company relieved from task force GALE and reverted to Bn control.

Co A seried to an assembly area via FRISSENDONF. First platoon attached to task force SMITH. Their mission was to spearhead CC4 to South to seize bridges on ROT. Hiver and move on to seize bridge over INE River. The remainder of the company was given the mission to protect the trains of CCA.

B Correctioned in assembly area vio PLATTING swaiting completion of bridge across ISAR River. First platoon attached to task force MALCHE. Third platoon attached to task force MeLAE.

1 May - Ba (-) moved from assembly area vie LEBACH at 0300 and crossed the ISAR Biver at FLATTING. Closed in new assembly area vie ISARDETH. Bu (-) then moved and assembled vie REDUSTORF. Co A (-) moved with CCA supply train, crossed ISAR River

Co A (-) moved with CCA supply train, crossed ISAL River at 0000 then ROTT River at 1800. Co A (-) assembled in vic of PRIENEAUL. The lst Platoon Leader led his platoon with Task Force SHITH, when he ran abon a small poolet of enday. The vehicle swerved off the road and overthrmed, causing serious injury to the officer and driver. The first section of this platoon reached the ISH River just as the enemy blew the bridges.

The lst Flat Co T, while moving with Task Force MiLONE, a part of CCB, destroyed one enemy AA Gun and one 24 ton truck in the vic of MALGEREDORF. The 2nd platoon moved with CCE trains with the mission of protection and security. The 3rd platoon moved with Task Force MoLAE of CCB.

So Eq and the attached Bon platoon assembled vio EGGREFFLDEV.

8 May - Rn (-) moved at 3300 from KROHSTORF and closed in ElkERG at 1600. Unders received from CCR, to clear woods just west of Elsendaria a small task force was formed consisting of a section of

Ren and one plat of TD's under the command of the Bn SX. This force surrounded the woods while parties entered. A complete Hungarian Division Train surrendered their arms.

En S-2 reported to the CO that he had with him a Lt. Gen. of the Hungarian Army who claimed to be the Catholic Bishop and Chief Chaplain of the Hungarian Army. He was instructed to bring the general to the CP where the later was informed that he would have to confine his movements to the village of EINERG but that within the confinee of said village he would be free to continue his religious activities. This general proved to be Lt. Gen. Stepen Hess.

At 1000 mm (+) moved to vie of STANGHAM.

C Co was given mission of guarding the western approaches to town of TANN. Third platoon assigned mission of guarding Hungarian and German prisoners.

A Co moved to assembly area vic of SIMBACH. First platoen reverted to company control on relief from Task Force SUITH. Road blocks were occupied outside of SIMBACH for security.

The 1st and 3rd platoons of Co B moved to assembly areas vic of DischFELDER. The 2nd platoen and one section of Ron esserted supply vehicles of 3CB.

Co Hqs. Femained in ECCENYMIDER.

3 May - Bn Hg and Hg Co relieved from assignment to CCR and attached to Div Hq.

C Co plus 3rd Ren platoon remained attached to CCR.

Co A with Ben platoon attached remained in assembly area vic SIMBACH.

Co B (-) remained in assembly area vic EGOENFREDER. First and 3rd platoons remained in EISENFREDEN.

4 May - Bn CP moved to ETERAG.

Ron Co (-) moved vicinity EIRERG. Maintenance, care and eleaning of equipment were in progress.

A Co received orders from CCA to place guards on 4 German Hospitals which contained German wounded. Maintenance and cleaning of equipment in progress.

The lat and 3rd platoons of Co B plus the lat Ron section were relieved from attachment to Task Force MALONE and MERAE and assembled in vicinity of Co Kg at MCCENFELTER.

C Co relieved as prisoner guard. Maintenance and cleaning of equipment in progress.
