SUBJ 201: 9-5 Summary, Period 1 April 45 to 4 May 45.

To : Adjutant General, Washington 25, D. C.

During period 1 - 4 April 45, Bn(-) was attached to 113th Cav Sp. Co C was attached to 1 Regt, "P", 125th Cav Sqdrn. Bn(-) moved into 113th Cav Regt's Zone of Action and established roadblocks.

On 5 April, Bn(-) moved to 33rd Inf Div Zone of Action. "Y" and "Z" platoons of 453rd AAA Bn were attached to the Bn and reverted to Cos A and C respectively. The Bn was redesignated as Bn 21 Bn(SF) on this date. A team Co consisting of 3 Non Plts, a former platoon Co Hqs was forwarded overseas of personnel from the line companies. One Non Plt, each was assigned to Cos A, B and C, respectively. Status of primary weapons was thirty-four(34) towed 3" guns and two (2) self-propelled M-18's.

On 6 April, 113th Cav Co with Col T. Bn(-) attached was attached to 33rd Inf Div and received mission of protecting Div South Flank on it's advance through Germany.

During period 7 - 20 April, Bn(-) continued mission of protecting Div South Flank by clearing small towns and occupying roadblocks at strategic points. In accomplishing this task many W's were captured.

At 201200 April, Bn(-) was relvd from 33rd Inf Div and Co C was relvd from 125th Cav Sqdrn and ordered to proceed to assembly area vicinity LINDAU. Cutouts manned by Bn were relvd by elements of 8th Armd Div. "Y" and "Z" platoons of 453rd AAA Bn reverted to 453rd AAA Bn control. Status of primary weapons throughout period remained at thirty-four(34) towed 3" guns and two(2) SP's(M-18's).

The 21st and 22nd April, were spent on maintenance of equipment. On the former date six(6) M-18's were received from ordnance.

On the 23rd April all 3" towed guns and excess vehicles were turned in to ordnance and on 24 April Bn received orders to proceed to LINDAU by water on the 25th April and report to 13th Armd DIV, Third Army. Bn received the balance of its M-18's and two(2) SP's on this date, completing conversion, less one(1) M-32.

A company commander's meeting was held at 0800 on 25 April discussing route of march to Third Army. Route of march was designated by 04, XIX Corps and divided into a two-day march. Bn sent an advance party to the 13th Armd Div and bivouacking parties to the new division areas.

On 261300 April, Bn started in assembly area via LINDAU. 334 miles were traveled with the loss of only five(5) M-18's and two(2) Halftracks.

Bn was attached to "C" P, 13th Armd Div on 27 April and prepared for forthcoming operations.

On 27 April, Bn, less Army liaison which remained at LINDAU, received "C" P across the ALBACH RIV and crossed at 220 at 0815H131111.

On 29 April, Co A was attached to "C" P and Co B was attached to "C" P, with one Non platoon attached to each company. Bn Bn(-) was attached to IV BATT with mission of maintaining contact between "C" P and "C" P. Bn(-) moved with "C" P at 1200 and assembled in LINDAU.

(b-3) Summary, Period 1 April to 4 May 1945, continued)

On 30 April, Bn Co(-) moved to town of LESTING and reverted to Bn control.

1 May 1945, Bn(-) crossed the ISAR RIVER at PAILING and assembled vicinity ISARTHAL. At 1500 Bn(-) moved with CO's F/ and assembled vicinity of KROSTORF.

At 021000 May, Bn(-) cleared in assembly area vicinity 418.50 and received mission from CO's F/ to clear woods West of 418.50. A small task force (under command of Bn S-X) composed of one Bn platoon and one IP platoon surrounded the woods. One Hungarian Div Train surrendered to this force. At 1930 Bn received orders to move to vicinity STAFFAN and was alerted to cross the INN RIVER to protect the bridgehead vicinity STAFFAN. At 2200 this mission was cancelled and Co C was given mission of guarding up reaches to town of FAETZ.

On 3 May, HQ and Hq Co was relvd from assignment to CO's F/ and atchd to Div Hqs.

On 4 May Bn C and Bn Co(-), moved to vicinity of 418.50. Maintenance and care and cleaning of equipment were carried out. Co C was relvd from its mission on this date.
