SUBJECT: After-Action Report.

TO

: Commanding General, 13th Armored Division, (attention I & E Officer.

1. In compliance with Inter-Office Memorandum dated 5 May 1945, Headquarters 13th Armored Division, subject: After-Action Reports, the following report is submitted:

25 April - The Bn CO, 3-1, 3-4, Lieison Officer and Co billeting parties proceeded to the 13th Arm'd Div. A billeting party from the Bn moved out for the assembly area, (over night camp) vie ARNOTADT. The En passed the IP (GOSLAR) at 0800. The Bn arrived at assembly area in ARNOTADT at 1845. Five M-18's and one Halftrack had broken down during the march. The En maintenance recevered these vehicles and proceeded as far as MULMAUSEN. One hundred and thirty seven miles were travelled this day.

26 Ayril - Billsting party left for PARSHERS and were given assembly area vic LUPBURG.

The BB moved from ARMSTADT and passed IP at 0600. The Bm closed in new ascembly area (LUPBURG) at 2300. One hundred and ninety seven miles covered during the day.

27 April - The Bn attached to CCR. 15th Arm'd Div.

From 0100 to 0400 companies refilled their vehicles with gas and prepared for future operations. During the day all the persennel cleaned up and rested as much as possible.

April - The Bn (-) Rear Sch and Pieneer Platoon of Hon Co passed If at 0245 with the minimum to follow COR and cross the DANCHE River. The closed in its new assembly area vie ONETRAUBLIEG at 2200, all Sumicles were immediately refilled.

89 April - At 0900 Co A stached to CCA, Co B attached to CCB. One Ban platoon was attached to each empany.

The Bn (-) moved with GGE at 1200 to cross the ISAR River. Bn (-) closed in associally aves at RIMBACH on North side of the river. Ge A occupied direct fire positions covering roads leading from MANTIMEAUE

Ron Co (-) attached to TY GALT with mission of maintai-

30 April - The 3rd Ron plateen maintained contact between CCR and CCB. Righty four PW's taken on first patrol.

Ron Co (-) moved to town of PILST NG. Company relieved from task force GALL and reverted to Bn control.

Co A moved to an assembly area vic FRIESEMBORF. First plateon attached to task force SEITH. Their mission was to spearhead CCA to South to seize bridges on ROTT River and move on to seize bridge over INH River. The remainder of the company was given the mission to protect the trains of CCA.

B Coremained in assembly area vic PLATTING awaiting completion of bridge across ASAR River. First platoon attached to task force HALOPE. Third platoon attached to task force MCRAL.

1 May - Bn (-) moved from asweably area vie RIMBACH at 0300 and crossed the ISAR Hiver at PLATTING. Closed in new assembly area vie IGACH FER. Bn (-) then neved and assembled vie KHOHETORF.

Co A (-) moved with CGA supply train, crossed 1SAR River at 0800 then ROTT River at 1800. Co A (-) assembled in vic of PHILMBACH. The 1st Flatoon Leader led his plateon with Task Force SMITH, when he wan upon a small pocket of enemy. The vehicle swerved off the road and overturned, causing serious injury to the officer and driver. The first section of this plateon reached the INN River just as the enemy blow the bridges.

The lat Plat Co B, while moving with Task Force MALONE, a part of COB, destroyed one enemy AA Gun and one 21 ton truck in the vic of MALGERSDOUF. The and plateon moved with COB trains with the mission of protection and security. The 3rd plateon moved with Task Force McRae of OCA.

Co Ho and the attached Hen plateon assembled vic MOGLEFELDEN.

2 May - Bn (-) moved at 0300 from KROHSTORF and closed in EINERG at 1000. Orders received from COR, to clear woods just west of MIRTIG. A small task force was formed consisting of a section of Hon and one plat of TD's under the command of the Bn SX. This force surrounded the woods while parties entered. A complete Hungarian Division Train surrendered their arms.

Rn S-2 reported to the CO that he had with him a Lt. Gen. of the Hungarian Army who claimed to be the Catholio Hishop and Chief Chaplain of the Hungarian Army. He was instructed to bring the general to the CP where the later was informed that he would have to confine his movements to the village of EIEEEG but that within the confines of said village he would be free to continue his religious activities. This general proved to be Lt. Gen. Stepen Hess.

At 1000 Be (-) moved to vie of STANGHAN.

C Co was given mission of guarding the western approaches to town of TAME. Third platoon assigned mission of guarding Hungarian and German prisoners.

A Co moved to assembly area vic of HUMBACH. First platoon reverted to company control on relief from Task Force Mills. Road blocks were occupied out side of HIMBACH for security.

The 1st and 3rd platoons of Co 3 moved to assembly areas vis of EISENFELDEN. The 2nd platoon and one section of how escorted supply vehicles of CCB.

Co Hqs. remained in MGCHNFALDER.

3 May - Bn Ng and Eq Co relieved from assignment to CCk and attached to Div Hq.

C Co plus 3rd hon platoon remained attached to CCR.

Co A with Ren plathon attached remained in assembly area vic SIMLEAR.

uo B (-) remained in assembly area vie BUCHMBRIDER. First and Srd platoons remained in RISEMPERIES.

4 Hey - An OF moved to Elimid.

hen Co (-) moved vicinity MIRENG. Haintenance, and care and cleaning of equipment were in progress.

A Co received orders from CCA to place guards on 4 German Hospitals which contained German wounded. Maintenance and cleaning of equipment in progress.

The 1st and 3rd platoons of Co B blus the 1st Hen section were relieved from attachment to Task Force MALCHN and MONAH and assembled in vicinity of Co Hq at EGGENVENDEN.

C Co relieved as prisoner guard. Maintenance and clauning of equipment in progress.
