3. Information of Adjacent Units and Supporting Troops: Bn attached to CCA, 8th Armd Div
4. Operations for the Period:

1 April to 11 April

- At the opening of the period, one TD Co was with ea CC of the 8th Armd Div and moving E. By the 3rd of April when the Div moved forward to attack the Ruhr pocket from the NE ea TD Co saw action with their respective CC. After UNIA (A975265) was taken, ea Co was withdrawn to SOEST (E270295) when they turned in their M-18's and drew M-60's mounting the 90mm gun.

11 April to 21 April

- At beginning of period ea TD Co marched to Vic WOLFSBURG (C915998) with their respective CC's. Co P saw action while COF was taking HEMIG (D1960) and FLAMMENWURF (D1261). Remainder of Bn maintained rd blocks and guard of fixed installations within the Div area.

21 April to 30 April

- Entire Bn attached to CCA and moved to Vic ILSENBURG (D0367). Cleaned out assigned sector of the Harz Mountains and occupy and govern assigned area.

SUPPLY

1. Supply: Class I, III, and V supply for units of Bn attached to CC's was handled by S-4's of CC's. During latter part of period supply was handled by Bn. Supply was excellent.

2. Transportation: The organic transportation of the Bn was not sufficient to handle Bn's basic load of gas and oil and ammunition without overloading.

3. Evacuation:

a Personnel - Bn was furnished with ambulance from 78th Med Bn Armd which was entirely adequate to handle all evacuation made thru Bn Aid Station.

b Materiel - From Bn to higher echelon without difficulty.

4. Roads and Circulation: Excellent.

5. Salvage and Captured Material:

a Salvage - Only small quantities of Class II items were salvaged during month.

b No material was captured.
