- 1. Designation: 812th Tank Destroyer Battalion.
- 2. Date of Organization: 10 April 1942.
- 3. Place of Organization: Camp Gordon, Georgia
- 4. Authority for Organization: Letter, AG 320.2 (2-27-42) MR-N-C WD AGO 15 March 1942 and General Orders #17, Camp Gordon, Ga., April 6th 1942.
- 5. Original Cadre was transferred from 605th TD Bn., Ft. Custer, Michigan, by the 7th Sept. 1942, filler replacements were received in small groups by transfer from, infantry artillery and T.D. organizations. On 5 December 1942, 338 EN were received from Camp Upton, New York, and on 13 December 1942 235 EM from Camp Upton, New York.

### B. Changes in Organization.

- 1. The Battalion was originally organized under T/O 18-25 HV which provided for a strength of 36 Officers and 368 enlisted men. An authorized overstrength of 15% on privates and 25% in officers permitted a strength of 46 officers and 989 enlisted men.
- 2. Re-organization under T/O 18-25 dated 27 Jan. 1943 was completed about 10 June 1943 with an authorized strength of 36 officers, 1 Warrant Officer and 636 enlisted men.
- 3. Cadre: 5 officers and 80 EM left the Battalion for TDRTC, Camp Hood, Texas, 31 May 1943.


