SECTION III - REPORT AFTER ACTION AGAINST ENEMY

1 January, 1945

1. SITUATION:

a. Battalion attached to 8th Infantry Division with Company A supporting the 28th and 121st Infantry Regiments; Company B supporting the 13th Infantry Regiment; and Company C supporting the 113th Mechanized Cavalry Group.

3" guns are dug in for anti-tank defense coordinated with 8th Infantry Division anti-tank defenses. Alternate positions have been selected and prepared to meet any possible enemy attack from adjoining sectors. A number of guns are used for firing Star Shell (illuminating) missions in cooperation with 8th Division Artillery units. Five forward observation posts are maintained by our Reconnaissance Platoons of Headquarters Company.



COMPANY A -- Continued work on defense of area. Put 13th 3-inch gun into position, between HURTCEN and CERMETER.

RECONNAISSANCE PLATO(NS -- Moved one M-8 emplacement to area west of KLEINHAU. Moved CP of second platoon to same area. Continued operation of outposts. Sighted a 10 man enemy patrol at 0930 hours at 07153175. Placed 75-mm PAK gun in position and Ren personnel manning it.

5. ENEMY ACTIVITY:

a. Enemy aircraft were active over our installations, strafing in the KLEINHAU, HUPTGEN, GERMETER areas. One ME 109 was seen shot down by friendly AA unit. Enemy artillery fire was moderate in all sectors. Small scale infantry attack was attempted by the enemy in the BERGSTEIN sector but was repelled by friendly infantry with artillery in support. Small enemy patrol attempted to infiltrate Division lines at F 01052900. The patrol was dispersed and repelled by friendly infantry.

One plane believed to have been firing rockets made a direct hit upon a house in BRANDENBURG.

B in BOCHEIM challanged an officer and seven men in a jeep who were unfamiliar with password and states they were from Troop E. Officer gave his name as Lt. Richardson and convinced guard of his identity and was allowed to continue. A check with 113th Cav reveals they have no officer by that name in Troop E. Adjoining units warned to watch for these men.

COMPANY C -- Continued to maintain and improve defenses of area.

RECONNAISSANCE PLATCONS -- Continued to maintain and operate outposts. CP #1 was pushed back with 309th Inf on an enemy attack. Ground was regained by 309th and our OP remanned later in day.

3. ENEMY ACTIVITY:

a. Our CPs reported heavy vehicular traffic vicinity 117376. The enemy made a small attack in vicinity of 010304 at 1125 hours. It consisted of a heavy artillery barrage followed by a small infantry attack upon friendly infantry pillboxes in that vicinity. The attack was repulsed by infantry-artillery team with no ground lost. Enemy artillery upon other sectors of the division front was light. No armor was reported in the sector.

13 January, 1945

After considerable exchange of small arms fire and with aid of friendly artillery the attack was repulsed with considerable losses to the enemy. Armored vehicles were not reported opposite the division sector

14 January, 1945

a. Five tanks were observed in NIEDERAU 12484215 at 1430 hours. Friendly artillery placed sernade on town. Results unknown. No enemy air activity was evidenced. Heavy vehicular activity was reported on the SOLLER-STOCKHEIM highway by our OP 5. Friendly artillery placed fire on this road.
