AFTER ACTION REPORT FOR THE MOMEN OF PERMIARY 1915

I SUMMARY OF OPERATIONS

- 1. MASS VII: Preparation for the Attack on the Noer River Line.
- a. During the period, 1 February to 26 February 1965, the 621st Tank Destroyer Battalien remained attached to the 29th Division Artillery.
- (1) At the beginning of the period, elements of the 621st Tank Destroyer Enttalion were employed in the Division some as follows:
- (a) Company "A" was in accombly position in the vicinity of Durbonlar, was coordinates 2557.
- (b) The let Plateon of Company "B" was in a training area in the vicinity of Mariadorf, map coordinates 9152, converting from "Towed" to "Self Propelled". The 2nd Plateon was in indirect fire position in the vicinity of Pattern, map coordinates 0056. The 3rd Plateon was in direct fire position in the vicinity of Schopheven, map coordinates 0553.
- (e) The let and 3rd Plateons of Company "C" were in direct fire positions, the let Plateon in the vicinity of Mersenhausen, map coordinates 9860; the 3rd Plateon in the vicinity of Freialdenhoven, map coordinates 9559. The 2rd flateon was in indirect fire position in the vicinity of Freialdenhoven, map coordinates 9559.
- (d) Reconstiseance Company, less the 3rd Platoon, was in assembly position in the vicinity of Hongan, map coordinates, 7253. The 3rd Recommissance Platoon was maintaining an 0.P. in the vicinity of rier, map coordinates 7552. The 0.P. at Pier was abandoned on 3 February 1965 and the 3rd Platoon joined the company at Hongan.
- b. During the period, 1 February 1945 to 22 February 1945, the C21st Tank Destroyer Mattalian continued to essupy defensive positions and to fire indirect harassing and interdistery fires. A total of 749 rounds was fired indirect during this period.
- (1) On 8 February 1915 the Battalian was alerted for participation in the attack on the worr liver line. All efficers and enlisted man were briefed on the impending operations. In addition to maintaining defensive positions and firing indirect missions the Battalian engaged in intensive training in preparation for offensive action. Vehicles and equipment were maintained for imperiate employment.

- (3) Company "A" and Company "C" crossed the Room River on the 21th. Both companies immediately went into direct fire positions in direct support of Infantry begineents of the 29th Division. The 3rd Flatoon of Company "O" fired 25 rounds of HE and 1 rounds of APC at energy heavy mortar positions in the vicinity of Statternich. The energy positions were neutralised. - (h) One Recommissance Platoon was attached to each Destroyer Company for recommissance and additional security. The let Recommissance and additional security. (5) On 25 Pebruary the Division Bridgmend was severe and had already began to push to the north of Julish. On this date the remaining elements of the Battalian, with the exception of the Bear Scholon, crossed the Roer Siver.

(a) In support of the lat and 2nd Entalions of the libth infantry's attack on Statternich, map coordinates 3660, Wellderf, map coordinates 3762, and Queten, map coordinates 3861, on the 25th, the 2nd and 3rd Platoons of Company "3" fired ho rounds of HE and 31 rounds of Art direct. The fire was directed at enemy sum emplacements, all types of buildings suspected of housing the enemy and targets of opportunity. 



BATTLE LEGIT BUT IS AND CONCLUSIONS

- 1. Then %-10 Destroyers are nit and set on fire by enemy guns, the open tarret enables crew cambers to escape from the ourning vehicle. The open tarret, however, is vamerable to enemy mortar and artillery fire when not on the move. Our sen swear by the open tarret and do not want any form of covering when soving out to engage enemy armor. When the vehicle is parked in a position of resdiness or is obscupying defensive positions a covering for the turret is improvised by the use of boards and sand bags. It is material is readily obtainable and can be easily removed when the Destroyers move out for the attack.
- 2. Every man in the i-10 crew should be armed with a pistol. Rifles and carbines are assumed to handle while fixing the 3° gam. When a Destroyer is not by enemy fire the crew may have to have the vehicle too fast to stop for their juns. This heaves them to face enemy infantry unarmed. Side arms would also live the crew members of a knocked out Destroyer more freedom of action in handling the Bazooka against enemy tanks.
- 3. M-10 Destroyers are equipped with machine gas mounts on the rear, primarily for protection against energy aircraft. Our Destroyers have been modified by equipping them with an alternate mount on the front of the terret. In many instances when moving forward in an attack on enemy positions the machine gas on the forward mount was used effectively on enemy ground troops. Fire from the machine gas was especially effective in close-in fightin, in towns.
- 4. Assumition trailers for M-10's should never be used while advancing agrees country where there is danger of mine fields, this is emperially handrous at night. Maneuverspility is impaired due to the fact that, with the trailer, the Destroyer earnet be backed out of the minefield. Destroyers in such a position provide a perfrect target for enemy artillary.
- 5. Training in Infantry, Tank and Tank Bestroyer coordination in attacking across open terrain proved its worth during the sapid advance of the current operations. One specific instance alongly demonstrated this fact. On the 27th of February, Infantry, Tanks and Tank Destroyers were nowing in an attack from Ouston to Amelia when an enemy tank fired on our tanks. The energy tank was concealed from our Destroyers by a key stock but was spected by the mussle flack. The Destroyers fired a round of EE into the key stack, setting it on fire. The enemy was apparently confused as to where the fire was coming from and moved to the Destroyer's side of the key stack and was clearly silhousted against the burning key. At a sample of 2,500 years the enemy tank was an easy target.
