AFTER ACTION REPORT FOR MONTH OF FEBRUARY

1 February 1945 - Battalion bivouaced in vicinity of Buchy, France. Staff Section: Captain Copeland, Battalion S-2, left Buchy with 9 Officers and 15 Enlisted Men for Battalion front line destination as the Advance Party. Weather cold and cloudy.

2 February-_--- Staff Section: Lt Colonel Mains, Battalion CO, departed for Seventh Army Head warters. Captain Copeland visited Chief of Armored Section, at Seventh Army Head warters. Major Bishop, Battalion S-3, contacted Block "G" Head warters in Forges for movement orders. H , A, B, and C Companies cleaned weapons and performed maintenance on vehicles in preparation for road march to Battalion front line destination. Weather cold and clear.

3 February - Battalion moved from vicinity of Buchy to front line destination. The Reconnaissance platoons as the first element of the march crossed the I.P. at 0900 hours. The remaining elements in the following order: A, B, H, & C Compani Cleared the I.P. (Forges) at 1015. Staff Section: Lt. Colonel Mains visited the G-3 and Chief of the Armored Section, Seventh Army Head warters. Captain Copeland reported to G-3, A. Corps and received verbal assignment to 63rd Infentry Division. Later reported to opr. Division G-3. Advance party moved to Hamback to secure billets for the Battalion. Battalion closed into Bivouac area at 1700 hours at Soissons. Weather cold and rainy.

I February - Battalion moved from bivouac at Soissons at 0730 hours. March to Verdun completed at 1800 hours, where Battalion was billeted for the night. Staff Section: It. Colonel Mains reported to G-3, XV Corps Head warters. Later visited 5th TD Group and 63rd Division Head warters. Weather cold and clear.

5 February - Battalion cleared Verdun at 0800 and closed in Hambach at 1530 I urs. The Battalion completed the 312 mile march very successfully under the command of Major Kemp, Battalion Executive. Staff Section: Lt. Colonel Mains joined the Battalion at Hamback. Major Bishop contacted the 63rd Division for information of the situation. The Command Post was set up for operation and the CP group billeted in vicinity. Head uarters Company - located at Hamback, billete personnel and established a guard for the área. 1st Reconnaissance platoon was given the duty of placing the guard around the CP. "A" Company located at Roth, billeted all personnel and placed guards on the area. "C" Company located at Hambach, billeted all personnel and placed guard on area.

6 February - Battalion located at Hambach. Lt. Colonel Mains and his staff met with Company commanders at 0830 hours.⁴ The Battalion Commander issued verbal orders placing "A" Company in direct support of the 253rd Infantry Regiment, "C" Company in direct support of the 255th Infantry Regiment and "B" Company in suppor of 63rd Division Artillery. Staff Section: Major Kemp to 253rd Infantry Regiment CP and to sector assigned Company "A". Major Bishop to CP 255 Infantry Regiment

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and to serior assigned to Company. "C". H. Company performed maintenance on vehicles and weapons throughout the day. "A" Company Commander accompanied Battalion Executive to CP 253rd Infantry Regiment and later reconnoitered sector assigned for gun positions. "A" Company performed maintenance on weapons and vehicles. "B" Company located at Woustviller. Company commander to Siltzheim to reconnoiter for indirect firing positions. Company cleaned weapons and performed maintenance on vehicles. "C" Company located at Hambach. Company commander accompanied Battalion S-3 te CI 2017rd Infantry Regiment and thence to assigned sector for reconnaissance.

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7 February - Staff Section: Major Kemp to 253rd Infantry Regiment's CP at 0800 hours. Later visited "A" Company gun positions and returned at 1430. Major Bishop to 253rd Infantry Regiment's CP and "C" company gun positions at 0800 hours. Returned 1330 hours. Lt. Colonel Mains to 70th Division CP at 0900 hours. Visited CG 70th Division, returned 1715. At 1530 hours Colonel Jacoby, CO 5th TD Group visited Battalion CP. Captain LaBrode, Battalion S-4, contacted 63rd Divisic 6-4 and 5th TD Group S-4. H . Company - 1st Reconnaissance platoon continued to g: rd Battalion CP. 2nd Reconnaissance platoon operating OP's and listening posts i 253rd Infantry Regiment's sector. Company "A" - CO and platoon leaders complete . connaissance for primary mission positions. Gun crews started digging gun posit Company "B" - Closed in indirect fire positions near Siltzheim at 0500 hours ions. At 2030 hours 1st Platoon, 2nd Squad fired the first round into enemy territory (Platoon Sergeant Raymond Wrigley, Gun Commander Sgt. Ned Rose, Gunner Cpl. Ellis Cole). Company fired 32 indirect harrassing missions from 072030 February 45 to 080600 February 45. 63 rounds expended. Company "C" - Gun positions being dug. Further reconnaissance continued in sector to strengthen anti-tank defenses of the Division and coordinate the fires of "A" and "C" Companies.

8 February - Staff Section: Major Bishop to Company "C" CP at 0830, returned at 1000 hours. Captain Copeland to 70th Division CP at 0830, returned 1000. Captain Wadle of 776 TD Battalion and Captain Merril, 5th TD Group visited Battalic CP at 1000 hours. Three CIC officers from the 63rd Division visited CP to instruct S-2 on handling of civilians. Lt. Colonel Mains to "A" & "C" Company gun positions at 1350 hours, returned at 1700 hours. Major Bishop to 63rd Division CP at 1726 hours, returned at 1830 hours. H. Company - 2nd Reconnaissance platoon continued to operate OP's and listening posts in 253rd Infantry Regiment's sector. OP hit by mortar f wounding Tec. 5 Gilman. Company "A" - Company, less three guns of 3rd platoon, losed into prepared positions at 2400 hours. 3 guns unable to occupy prepared positions due to weather and terrain difficulties. Three alternate positions were prepared and will be occupied after darkness 9 February 45. Company "B" - Departed 63rd Infantry Division sector at 1630 hours and bivouaced at Tentelingen enroute to join 70th Infantry Division. Captain Frantz continued reconnaissance for gun positions in 70th Division sector. Company "C" - Improved positions and made further reconnaissance of sector. Company started moving into prepared positions at 1830 hours. Weather cold and rainy.

9 February - Staff Section: Major Kemp to Company "A" positions at 0845 hours, returned 1500 hours. Captain Copeland to 70th Division CP at 1040 hours, atturned at 1155 hours. Major Bishop to 63rd Division CP at 1330 hours, returned 1440 hours. Lt. Colonel Mains to 70th Division Head uarters, returned at 1730 hours. Lt. Sanford, 776th TD Battalion, visited CP at 0945 hours. Major Stiver, 5th TD Group, visited CP at 1440 hours. Company "A" CP at Sarreguemines(521-575). Completed occupying prepared positions in 253rd Infantry Regiment's sector at 2200 hours. Company "B" - CP located at Thedingen. Started movement to new positions in 70th Division sector. Company "C" - Remained in position in 255th Infantry Regiment's sector. Weather cold and rainy.

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10 February - Staff Section: Captain Copeland to 63rd Division CP at 1000 hours. Returned 1130 hours. Lt. Colonel Mains to A & C Company gun positions at 0930, returned 1140 hours. Lt. Ittner, Liaison #1, to Redding at 1530 hours, returned 1730 hours. Major Bishop to 776th TD Battalion at 1400 hours, returned 1730 hours. 1st Lt. Junkins, Liaison #2, to 63rd Division CP at 1430 hours, returned 1530 hours. Major Kemp to Company "B" gun positions at 1530 hours, returned 1530 hours. Captain Merril, 5th TD Group, visited CP at 1400 hours, H. Company - 1st Reconnaissance platoon established liaison with each front line Battalion in 70th Infantry Division's sector. 2nd Reconnaissance platoon guarding Battalion CP. Company "A" remained in position in 253rd Infantry Regiment's sector. Company "B" closed in 70th Division sector with 10 guns in firing positions and 2 guns in mobile reserve at 0200 hours. Gompany "C" remained in position in 255th Infantry Regiment's sector. Weather cold and rainy.

11 February - Staff Section: Lt. Colonel Mains met with CO, "A" Company at 0900 hours and "C" Company CO at 1000 hours. Plans made for future operations for both companies. Captain Copeland to "B" Company gun positions at 1300 hours, returned at 1600 hours. Lt. Colonel Mains to "A" and "C" Company gun positions at 1325 hours, returned at 1830 hours. It. Ittner to Sarralbe at 1340 hours, returned st 1700 hours. Major Kemp to "B" Company gun positions at 1300 hours, returned at 1500 hours. Lt. D.Witt to Sarralbe at 1300 hours, returned at 1700 hours. Colonel Jacoby and Captain Merril, 5th TD Group, visited CP at 1500 hours. Lt. Colonel Brooks, G-1, 63rd Division, visited CP at 1500 hours. Hg. Company - 1st Reconnaissance platoon continued to maintain liaison with each front line Battalion in the 70th Infantry Division sector for Company "B". 2nd Reconnaissance platoon guarding Battalion CP, rear echelon, and assigned bridges. Company "A" continued to improve their positions in 253rd Infantry Regiment's sector. Company "B" in support of 70th Infy Division, remained in previously occupied positions with 10 guns. 2 guns held in mobile reserve. Company "C" remained in and continued to improve their prepared positions in 255th Infantry Regiment's sector. Weather cloudy and cold.

12 February - Lt. Ittner to 63rd Division CP at 0900 hours, returned at 1000 hours. Lt. Ittner to A, B, C, Companies at 1000 hours, returned at 1200 hours. Major Bishop to "G" Company CP and gun positions at 1200 hours; returned 1630 hours Major Kemp to "A" and "C" Companies with Captain Moses from 63rd Division I.G. Of ice. Visited CP's and gun positions. Captain Moses and Warrant Officer Nangold of the 63rd Division I/G. Office conducted an inspection of H., A; and C Company kitchens, quarters, and supply sections. Major Bush, XV Corps G-3 visited CP at 1600 hours. Captain Merril visited CP at 1530 hours. Hq. Company - Reconnaissance plateens continued to operate on assignments at Battalion CP and in 70th Division sector: "A" Company remained in support of 253rd Infantry Regiment. "B" Company continued to improve positions in 70th Division sector. Ist Platoon moved one gun to an improved position. Company "C" remained in position in 255th Infantry Regiment's sector. CO and Battalion S-3 went forward to reconnoiter gun positions. Weather cool and cloudy.

13 February - Staff Section: Lt. Colonel Mains instructed Company "A" platoon leaders on the use of the illuminating shell. Lt. Ittner & Lt. Worrell to 63rd Division Rear echelon at 0935 hours, returned at 1130 hours. Lt. Colonel Mains to "A" Company, 63rd Division, and 70th Division CP's at 1035 hours, returned 1200 hours. Major Bishop to "A" Company "Prat 1035 hours, returned at 1200 hours.

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Lt. Ittner to 117th Evacuation Hospital at 1320 hours, returned 1730 hours. Lt. DeWitt to 63rd Division rear echelon at 1410, returned at 1610 hours. Captain Copeland to "B" Company sector and forward in the 255th Infantry Regiment's sector to reconnoiter for possible gun positions at 1410 hours, returned at 1630 hours. Colonel Mains to 63rd Division Artillery and the 253rd Infantry Regiment to observe firing of the illuminating shell by "A" Company. Time out 1630 hours, returned at O400 hours 14 February 1945. Major Bishop to "C" Company CP and to OP to observe illuminating shell firing at 1800 hours, returned at 0845 hours 14 February 45.... Captain Kirby to obersve firing of illuminating shell at 1800 hours, returned at 0400 hours 14 February 45. Major Kemp to OP's in the 253rd and 255th sectors to observe firing. Out at 1900 hours, returned at 0355 hours 14 February 45. "A" Company moved first gun of first platoon to indirect fire position near Siltzheim. At 2100 hours gun fired five rounds illuminating shell in 253rd sector. At 2180 hours fired 5 rounds illuminating shell in 255th Regiment's sector. CO Company "B" and platoon leaders continued reconnaissance for better positions. Company "C" remained in support of the 255th Infantry Regiment. Enemy mortar shell lended within 75 yards of first gun, first platoon. No casualties. Neather cloudy and rainy.

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14 February - CP Staff Section: It Colonel Mins discussed future plans with staff officers and Company commanders of "A" and "6" Companies. Lt. Ittner to "A" Company CP and gun positions at 0824 hours, returned 1130 hours. Lt. Colonel Maine to 63rd Division CP at 0825 hours, returned 0945 hours. Captain Copeland to 70th Division CP at 0924 yours, returned 1345 hours. While returning from 70th Division. CP Captain Copelance connoitered for possible gun positions in the woods northwest of Woelferdingen. As approximately 1310 hours he set off an energy booby trap receiving a slight wound in the left arm. Major Bishop visited the 255th Infantry Regiment at 1335 hours, returned 1605 hours. 1st Lt. Hewis from Division G-1 offic visited CP checking on available billets in Hambach at 1130 hours. Captain Merrill visited CP at 1530 hours. 1st Lt. Borland, 253rd Liaison Officer, visited CP at 1530 hours. Hq. Company performed vehicle and weapons maintenance. The 1st Reconnaissance platoon maintained liaison with each front line Battalion in the 70th Division sector for Company "B". 2nd Reconnaissance platoon continued to guard the Battalion CP, rear echelon, and assigned bridges. "A" Company continued to improve their positions in 253rd Infentry Regiment's sector. "B" Company remained in s port of 70th Division. Company Commander reconnoitered forward areas for future airect fire positions. "C" Company continued to improve their positions in the 255 Infantry Regiment's sector. Weather clear and cool.

15 February - Staff Section: Lt. Colonel Mains to the amphibious proving : ground to supervise experiment of transporting and firing the gun, 3", M5 from an an amphibious dukw. 1st Lt. Ittner to 63rd Division and 5th TD Group CP's at 0905 hours, returned at 1410 hours. Major Bishop to 63rd Division CP at 1335 hours, returned 1455 hours. Lt. Junkins to 63rd Division CP at 1430 hours, returned 160905 Feb. 45. Lt Colonel Mains to 8B" Company gun positions at 1630 hours, returned 1755 hours. Major Bishop to 255th Infantry Regiment's CP and Company "C" gun positions at 1530 hours, returned 1630 hours. Lt. Colonel Mains to 253rd Infantry Regimental CP and Company "A" CP at 1830 hours, returned 2130 hours. H., Co - Performed vehicle and weapons m intenance. 1st Reconnaissance platoon maintained liaison with each front line Battalion in 70th Division sector for Co. "B". 2nd Reconnaissance platoon guarding Battalion CP, rear echelon, and assigned bridges. Company "A" remained in and continued to improve their positions in 253rc

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Infantry Regiment's sector. Sergeant Acrey and grew successfully conducted experiment of firing 2 rounds APC from the gun, 3", M5 mounted on 2½ ton amphibious dukw after being transported across the river. At 1600 hours the 1st Platoon CP was hit by what was believed to be 120 mm mortar. No casualties reported. Company "B" remained in support of the 70th Division. CO reconnoitered forward areas for futur direct fire positions. Company "C" remained in and continued to improve prepared positions in 253rd Infantry Regiment's sector. Weather clear and cool.

Company "A" remained in and continued to improve their positions in 253rd Infantry Regiment's sector. Company Commander reconnoitered forward areas for future primary mission direct fire positions, Company "C" remained in and continued to improve positions in 255th Infantry Regiment's sector. Company "A" - Supporting 253rd Infantry Regiment remained in 8 prepared positions, prepared and occupied 3 new positions. Company CP moved to Auersmacher. Company "B" - 2 platoons released from 70th Infantry Division moved to Woustviller to meet Battalion S-3, thence to Sarreguemines. Closed in bivouac at "A" Company's former CP area at 0700 hours. One section of 2nd and one section 3rd platcons remained in support of 70th Infantry Division. Company "C" remained in and continued to improve their positions in 255th Infan Regiment's sector: Hu- 1st Reconnaissance platoon continued to maintain lilison with each front line Battalion in 70th Division sector. 2nd Reconnaissance platoon: 1st section in support of Company "A" to assist in road clearance of mines, and 2nd section guarding Battalion CP, rear echelon, and assigned bridges. Weather cloudy and cool.

Company - Established forward CP at Sarreguemines at 1800 hours. Ist Reconnaissance platoon guarding forward CP, 2nd Reconnaissance platoon guarding CP in Hambach. Company A - Prepared and occupied positions in 253rd Infantry Regiment's sector north of the Sarre river. Company "B" - Located at Sarreguemines (521-575).
