





GUARD ORDERS

1. General:

a. The purpose of the guard is to provide local security and fire protection for the buildings, tents, vehicles and all property within the Battalion tent area and Battalion Motor Parks.

b. Composition of the Guard:

- (1) One (1) Officer of the Day
- (2) One (1) Sergeant of the Guard
- (3) Three (3) Corporals of the Guard
- (4) Nine (9) Privates of the Guard

c. Posts: There will be three (3) single sentry posts, sketch attached.

d. Hours: (1) The Guard will be posted from 6:00 P.M. to reveille daily, except Saturday and Sunday.

(2) The Saturday Guard will be on duty from 12:00 noon Saturday and be relieved at 12:00 noon on Sunday.

(3) The Sunday Guard will be on duty from 12:00 noon Sunday until reveille Monday.

e. Guard mounting will be held daily, except Saturday and Sunday, at 5:30 P.M. in the area North of Battalion Headquarters, weather permitting, (alternately area, gravel motor park South of Battalion Headquarters). On Saturday and Sunday the Guard mounting will be at 11:45 A.M.

f. Post of the Guard: The Guard will occupy the mess hall adjoining and in the same building with the Battalion Supply Room.

g. Uniform: Khaki, rifles and cartridge belts. The Officer of the Day may prescribe raincoats if advisable.

h. One (1) one half ton C & R truck will be furnished the Officer of the Day.

1. Men will take their own blankets to the Guard Room.

1. The Guard mounting will be informal and in accordance with Paragraph 3, appendix I, P.M. 26-5.

2. Officer of the Day:

a. He will be familiar with and follow the provisions of P.M. 26-5.

b. The old and new Officer of the Day will report to the Commanding Officer at 11:45 A.M. daily except Sundays.

c. He will sleep in the Battalion Area and will inspect the three meals.

d. He will make at least one inspection of the Guard before dark, another before midnight and one between midnight and reveille.

e. He will receive the roll call reports at reveille and retreat.

f. He will sign for and be responsible for guard property.

3. Duties of the Sergeant of the Guard:

a. He will be familiar with and follow the provisions of P.M. 26-5.

b. He will be responsible for the property in the Guard Room.

c. He will be responsible for the police of the Guard Room. The Officer of the Day will inspect the Guard Room at 8:00 A.M. The guard will not leave the Guard Room until released by the Officer of the Day following this inspection.

4. Duties of the Corporal of the Guard:

a. He will be familiar with and follow the provisions of P.M. 26-5.

b. The Corporal of the Guard on relief when not engaged in mounting or inspecting his relief will remain near the telephone at Battalion Headquarters, and answer by saying, "325th Tank Destroyer Bn."

6. Company Commanders are responsible that members of the Guard have been thoroughly instructed in their duties before being detailed.



Subject: Transfer of Tank Destroyer Battalions to Camp Hood, Texas, for Training.

To : Commanding Generals,
Second Army,
IX Army Corps.

1. It is desired that you issue the necessary instructions to transfer the following tank destroyer battalions from the stations shown (or from present temporary stations) to Camp Hood, Texas. Units will move so as to arrive at Camp Hood, Texas, not earlier than August 1, 1942, and not later than August 2, 1942.

2. These are TEMPORARY changes of station.

3. Movement will be made by rail, and will be via Gatesville, Texas, unless otherwise requested by the Commanding General, Tank Destroyer Command. Coordinate rail movements with the Chief of the Transportation Division, Services of Supply, through the Post Quartermaster at the point or points of origin. Personnel not required to accompany troops may be authorized to proceed by privately owned conveyance under the provisions of paragraph 1 i, AR 35-4820, August 4, 1937.

4. Advise the Commanding General, Tank Destroyer Command, Camp Hood, Texas, of the strength, dates of departure, mode of travel, and expected hour and date of arrival of all elements. Direct communication, consistent with the RESTRICTED classification of this order, is authorized between interested commanders. Commanders concerned will report departures and arrivals to this headquarters by telegraph or telephone.

5. Elements moving by rail will be under the control of the Commanding General, Services of Supply, for the rail movement, to include entrainment and detrainment.

6. Procurement authority: Obligate ED 34 P 434-99 A 0425-23, inserting appropriate purpose numbers as prescribed in Circular No. 206, WD, June 26, 1942.

7. Attention is invited to Section II, Circular No. 220, WD, 1941, which directs that extract copies of RESTRICTED orders without RESTRICTED markings will be furnished to the unit personnel section or other reporting source in order to permit the preparation of reports of change (WD AGO Form 303) for units or individuals covered by such RESTRICTED orders.

8. The machine records units servicing the present stations and the machine records units servicing the stations of destination will be notified.

9. The provisions of Section IV, Circular No. 122, WD, April 25, 1942, will be complied with where applicable.

10. Attention is invited to paragraph 8, AR 30-930 and paragraph 4, AR 30-945.




