Dear Marion & Skip - Got your letter yesterday in which you said you had received the perfume from Saks. Hope you like it. It impressed me as about your style. Sent you a cable yesterday. Let me know if you got it. Will try to find you a souvenir from England soon. This country is much as we have pictured it. The roads are good but narrow and meandering. At no place is a road allowed to occupy precious tillable soil. The countryside with its hedges, trees, neat houses and stone fences presents a beautiful picture. There are still many halls and castles and some picturesque, large cathedrals. The towns are well condensed with rather narrow streets. The stores are interesting. One has to become familiar with such names as Chemists shop for drug store, hair dressers for barbershop and pub for tavern. Took in some money yesterday to be changed to pounds, half-crowns, florin, schilling, sixpence, threepence, pennies and halfpennies. None of it fits my bill fold! But it spends alright. Had a shag last night by some British soldiers and I think it was the best I ever saw. Will quit now in favor of going to bed. So long and love, Neil.
