NEW TANK DESTROYER PUBLICATION The Combat Studies Institute, US Army Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas publishes the Leavenworth Papers. The Istitute's 12th paper is a 92 page soft cover book entitled, SEEK, STRIKE, DESTROY: U.S. ARMY TANK DESTROYER DOCTRINE IN WORLD WAR II by Dr. Christopher R. Gabel. The book is available from the U.S. Government Printing Office for \$2.50 (postage and handling included) and is catalogued as 1986-652-003/22152. The book analyzes the origins of the tank destroyer concept and equipment with which tank destroyers fought, and assesses the effectiveness of the tank destroyer in battle. Written for the professional soldier of the 1980's, the tank destroyer experience yields some important lessons concerning the pitfalls of formulating doctrines. Good text TDA Viceand few pictures.
