

Idrove the M-18 in Europe during WWII and had my tour of duty interrupted by German Tiger Tank 43 years ago! You can imagine how I felt to be invited by the Museum to drive the same vehicle at Aberdeen Proving Grounds during the week of May 11, 1988. The invitation was given at the April Mini-reunion of the 704th and I followed up by visiting the M-18 at the Museum. I was spellbound to find the M-18 in mint condition - original in every detail! I crawled over every inch of her - like I was 18 again!

I arrived at APG Wednesday the 11th, got my security clearance, and went to the M-18. It was

I arrived at APG Wednesday the 11th, got my security clearance, and went to the M-18. It was sitting in a large garage outshining all of the Army's modern day machinery. I put on my WWII fatigues and helmet and climbed up and into the hatch. The TD was numbered and named after Dennis Ambruso's deceased uncle Sals TD - 643rd TD A-15, "Amaz'n Grace". I started out as co-driver with Dennis driving out to the curved test track. My turn to drive, clammy hands pulling down the sticks, I stepped on the throttle, heard the familiar sound of the 9 cylinder, 400 horsepower engine screaming with speeds up to 55 MPH in nothing flat! We then went to the range and did the usual dry run with the rest of the Army's monstrous tanks and self-propelled field pieces.


Friday was our big day! Dennis and John told me we would put on a show for V.I.P.'s, the press, and APG personnel and that I was on my own, start to finish. After "Amaz'g Grace" had her hungry appetite filled with AVGAS, my fumbling hands found the ignition switch, pumped the primer, hit the magnetos and to my delight she responded. After a careful warm-up we wound our way trough the restricted area to the main track and grandstands. We waited while the Abrams M-1 and the Bradley went through their paces. Then, the signal was given for us to run down the track. My pulse beat rapidly: and dry-mouthed, I revved up the mighty engine and released the sticks. With a thunderous roar we raced down the track at a speed over 50 MPH; then braked to a stop in front of the V.I.P. stand, which included the base commander, General Aiken.

Dennis Connors swung the turret through several 120 degree turns. The appliance could be heard above the roar of the engine. I shoved the throttle down and raced to the finish line. It was over, Dennis reached across the transmission to shake my hand; I knew I didn't let anyone down. Thus I have finished my tour of duty.





The above picture shows Camp Hood when I arrived! THIS WAS THE COMPLETE FACILITY! My training was exclusively in anti-tank warfare since April of 1941 where after basic I went to the 628th A-T Bn. Opf the 28th Division. Following manuevers and training at several camps I attended school at Fort Benning. I then was assigned to the Tank Destroyer Training Center at Camp Hood; my first office was in Temple while the camp was being built. From the rank of Corporal thru Master Sergeant in the Academic Regiment I had some part instructing the many Tank Destroyer Battalions passing thru the TD Center.

I attended TD-OCS where after graduation I went to North Camp Hood and then became part of test driving teams for the T-33; our future M-18 Tank Destroyer.

Later 1 was attached to the 809th TD Bn. for service in the ETO. Following VE-DAY we rotated po the US and leaving Fort Dix moved to Texas. (Ed. note: Camp Bowie) The days before VJ-DAY saw the rotated European TD Bns. in the US being reoutfitted for the invasion of Japan. The two bombs cancel (Ed our orders approximately 24-hours before leaving Texas. The hostilities being over, I took my discharge as a First Lieutenant in November of 1945. I took that course since the TD Forces were deactivated. There would be no place in the service where I could feel at home but with the Tank Destroyer Forces.

Therefore, it is understandable how welcome it was to learn of the organization, keeping alive (In history some memory of the Special Force which did not exist, then did exist; and in turn faded away but actually will live forever - mission accomplished!

ERNEST A. CORRADO, born April 15, 1922, Auburn, N.Y., was inducted at Fort Hayes, Columbus, Ohio. Completed basic training at Camp Hood, Texas, in tank destroyers as gunner.

Shipped to Cardiff, England, as replacement gunner. Made the Invasion in Normandy with 803rd Tank Destroyer Battalion, attached to the U.S. 1st Army. Also was attached to the 82nd Airborne, 29th Infantry Division, 28th Infantry Division. Fought at St. Lo. Then reattached to the 3rd Army. 3rd Army broke through St. Lo. We spearheaded all the way to Hasslett, Belgium (ran out of gasoline); after getting gas, rerouted back to city of Luxembourg, then transferred to 811 T.D. Bn., which was overrun by the Germans at Bastogne. Got new TD M18, regrouped and stopped German tanks, pushing them back through Bastogne with the

80th Infantry Division, 101st Airborne, 17th Airborne, 28th Infantry Division, 4th Armored Division. Also our platoon made night attack on Siegfried Line near Wallendorf. Received Bronze Star, Purple Heart and Presidential Citation with 101st Airborne Division at Battle of Bastogne. Also have five Bronze Campaign Stars.

Married to Norma J. Anderson; three sons, two daughters. Retired steel contractor.





IOSEPH WILLIAM BOYER, born February 6, 1920, Cadet, Missouri. Entered U.S. Army November 14, 1941. Began training at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, then stationed at Camp Hood, Texas, and Camp Shelby, Mississippi.

Began overseas duty August 17, 1944, with General Patton in the 609th Tank Destroyer Battalion of the Third Armored

Division. Was a Reconnaissance Tank crewman and truck driver.

Participated in the battles at Argonne, the Rhineland, Ardennes, and Central Europe. In December 1944, during the Battle of Bastogne, was hit in the leg and foot by a piece of shrapnel. With shells bursting all around us, I had advanced to the front of the line to attempt the rescue of a close companion from the line of fire. I knew nothing more until I awoke in an ambulance bound for the hospital. For this deed, I was awarded the Purple Heart.

Also awarded three bronze stars, Good Conduct Medal, European, African and Middle Eastern Theater Campaign Ribbons, two overseas bars, and American Defense Service Ribbon.

Retired truckdriver, live in Kimmswick, Missouri with wife Margaret. Son, Randall, and daughter, Suzanne Short. Six grandchildren.


