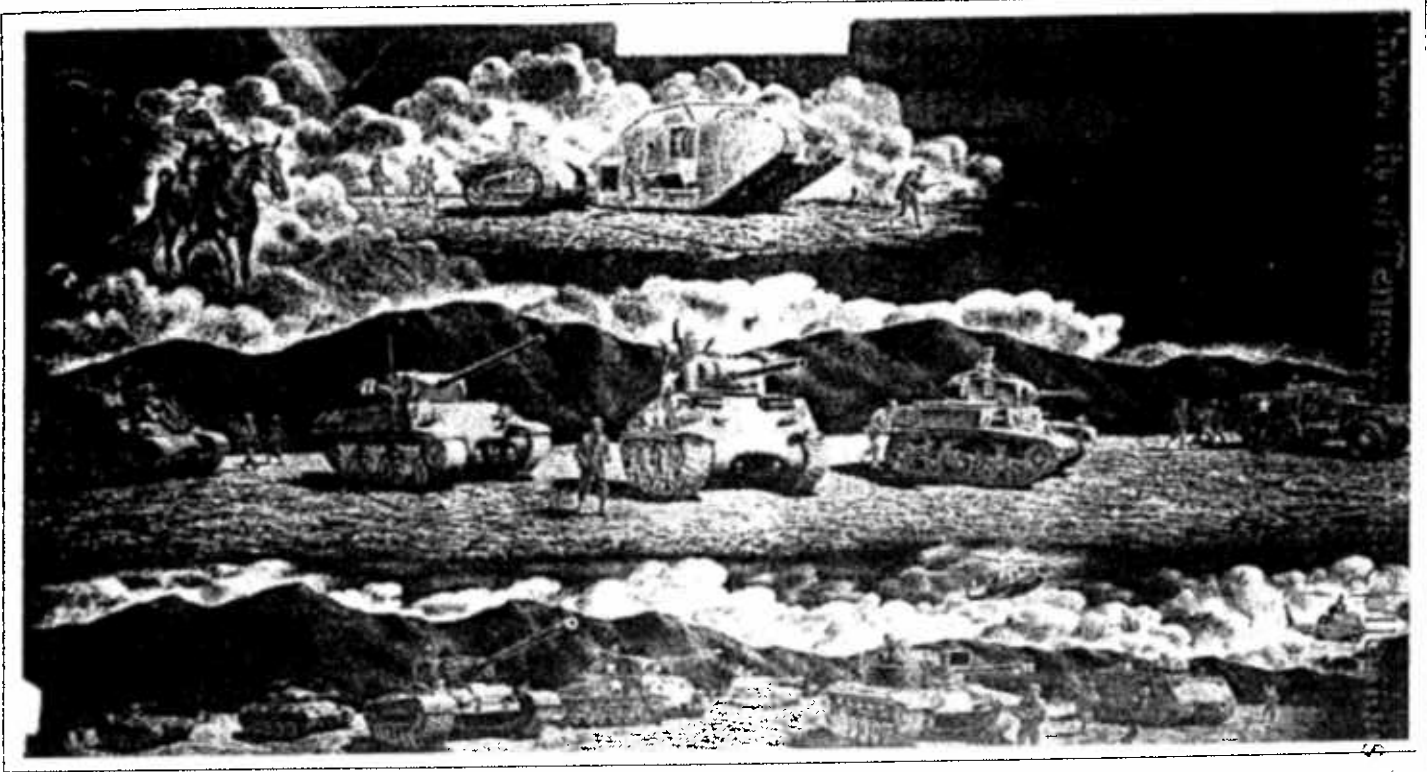
- \* To tell the story (a history) of the Tank Destroyer Forces. (by TURNER PUBLICATIONS)

- \* To establish a memorial dedicated to the Tank Destroyer Forces of WW II. (FORT HOOD, TEXAS)
- \* To collect and disseminate information to the veteran and dependents regarding rights and benefits to which they may be entitled. (WE HOPE WE HAVE DONE WELL.)

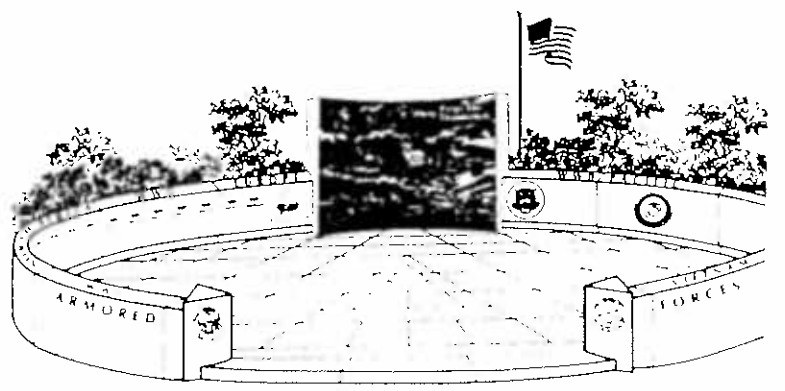
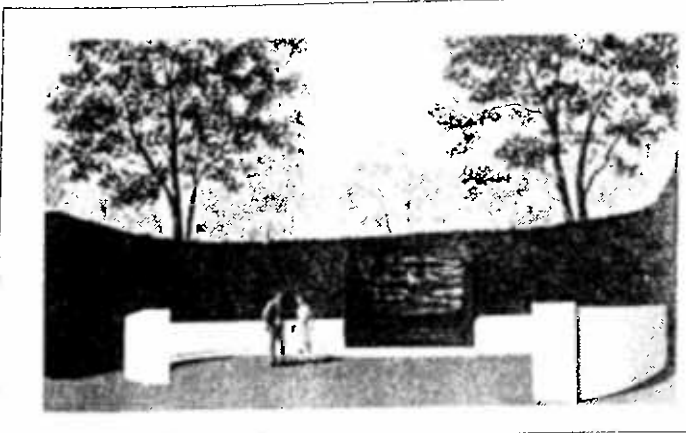

## Ninety-ninth Congress of the United States of America

AT THE SECOND SESSION

begun and held at the City of Washington on Tuesday, the twenty-first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eighty-six

### Joint Resolution

Authorizing establishment of a memorial to honor the American Armored Force.  
Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled.

#### SECTION 1. ESTABLISHMENT OF MEMORIAL.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Subject to subsection (c), the organizations specified in subsection (b) are authorized jointly to establish a memorial on Federal land in the District of Columbia or its environs to honor members of the American Armored Force who have served in armored units. The memorial shall commemorate the exceptional professionalism of the members of the American Armored Force and their efforts to maintain peace worldwide.

(b) ORGANIZATIONS.—The organizations referred to in subsection (a) are: the Armored Force Monument Committee, the United States Armor Association, the United States Field Artillery Association, the World War Tank Corps Association, the Veterans of the Battle of the Bulge, the 11th Armored Cavalry Regiment Association, the Tank Destroyer Association, the 1st, 2d, 3d, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th, 13th, 14th, and 16th Armored Division Associations, the Council of Armored Division Associations, and the National Association of Uniformed Services.

(c) STANDARDS.—The memorial shall be established in accordance with the standards set forth in H.R. 4378, as passed by the Senate with amendments on September 10, 1986, and further amended by the House of Representatives on September 29, 1986, except that section 6(b)(1) of H.R. 4378 shall not apply to the memorial.

#### SEC. 2. PAYMENT OF EXPENSES.

The United States shall not pay any expense of establishment of the memorial.

SUPPORT ERECTION OF THE ARMORED FORCES MONUMENT AT THE ENTRANCE AREA OF ARLINGTON NATIONAL CEMETERY AS A MEMORIAL TO HONOR OUR ARMORED FORCES. This is an urgent call to action to support Resolution 327 passed by the delegates at the 90th National Convention of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States in Las Vegas, Nevada, August 18-25, 1990.

With a scheduled dedication date for the Armored Forces Monument on Veterans Day, November 11, 1990, the Armored Forces Monument Committee has stated, "400,000 is needed to erect the Monument and approximately \$200,000 has been raised." Accordingly, total funding must be completed to permit construction to begin in June 1990.

This monument is funded entirely by private funds for veterans by veterans as a gift to the American people in the spirit of:

"THEIR VALOR IS YOUR HERITAGE"

The U.S. Army Armor Center and Fort Knox was host to 10,000 visitors July 10 for a day-long celebration in honor of the 50th anniversary of the creation of the Armored Force.
