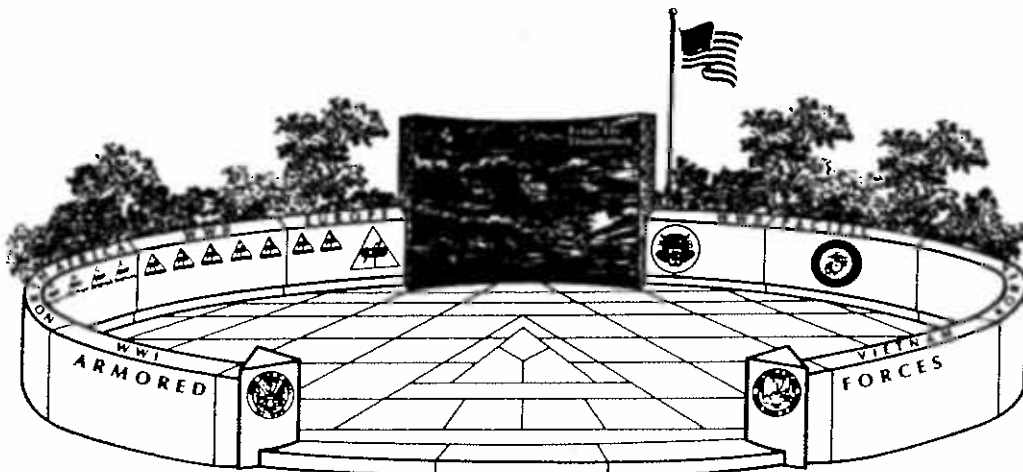

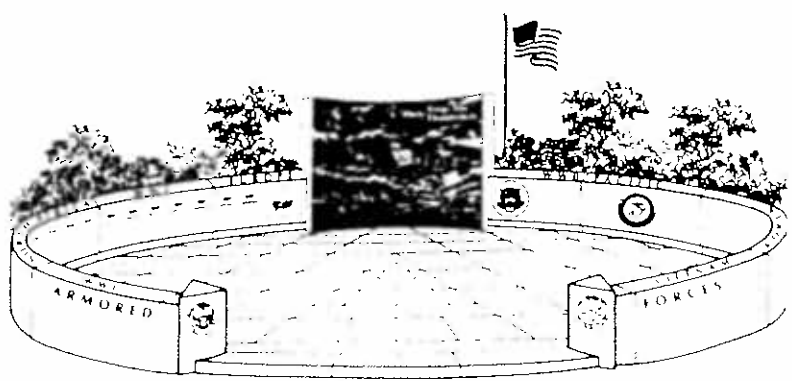
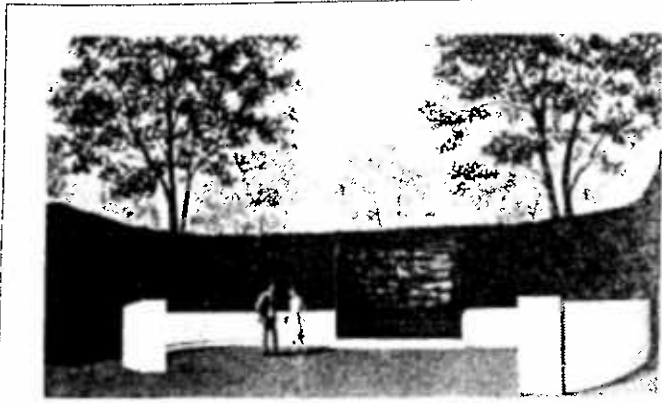

FROM THE CAVALRY thro WW I, WW II, KOREA, AND VIETNAM.



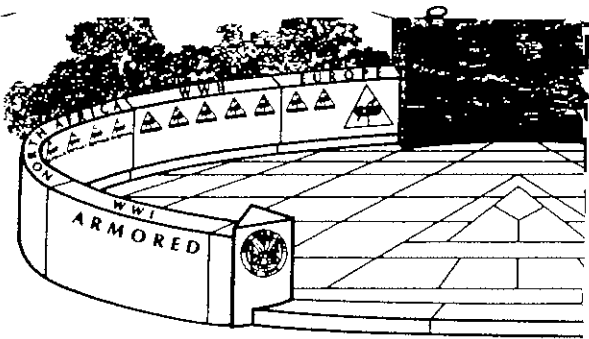

THE MEMORIAL: The memorial honors the dedicated and valorous service on the part of "men of Armor". Located on Memorial Avenue, the Avenue of Heroes, at the entrance to Arlington National Cemetery, Arlington, Virginia. Designed by Harold Schaller, distinguished architect of national memorials, who includes the 101st Airborne Memorial among his many works

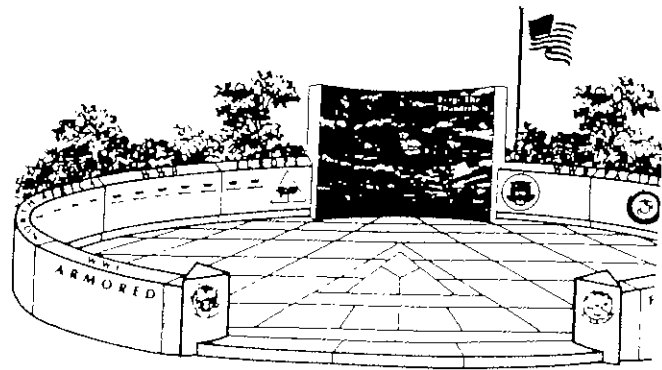
