Aug. 11, 1944—Departed United States for European Theater of Operations.


Aug. 23, 1944—Arrived Liverpool, England.

Nov. 15-19, 1944—Drive south along east bank of Moselle River into Metz, France with Task Force Bacon (95th Division).

April 1-20, 1945—Defense of Rhine River bridges, Wesel-Duisberg area April 5, 1945—Re-converted to selfpropelled battalion, M-18's.

April 25-May 3, 1945—Attached 3rd Army, III Corps. Drive with 86th Infantry Division in Bavaria from Ansbach, Germany to Erding, Germany.

May 3-6, 1945—Attached 7th Army, XV Corps. Drive with 86th Infantry Division from Erding, Germany to vic. of Salzberg, Austria.

May 8-12, 1945—Attached 86th Infantry Division. Set up Military Government vic. of Burghausen, Germany.

May 14-June 20, 1945—Hockenheim, Germany, XXI Corps. Maintenance of equipment. Athletics and Recreation. Preparation for redeployment to Pacific.

June 11, 1945—Alerted for Redeployment through U. S. to Pacific Theater.

June 21-29, 1945—Camp Miami, Chalons, France, assembly area.

July 1-6, 1945—Staging area, Le Havre, France. Camp Lucky Strike, St. Valery, France.

July 7, 1945—Sailed from Le Havre, France for U.S.A. on USS Marine Pobin

July 16, 1945—Arrived Hampton Roads, Virginia. Camp Patrick Henry, Virginia.

July 17-Sept. 4, 1945—Personnel on 30 day Rehabilitation, Recuperation and Recovery.
