Dear Mrs. Golden:


Reference is made to your letter addressed to the Adjutant General's Office, Washington 25, D. C., requesting additional information regarding the death of your brother.

Information now available confirms the previous report of death of your brother, Private First Class Edward A. Dabulas, Army serial number 13 116 145, Infantry, and shows that he received shell fragment wounds, of the head, and burns of the head, neck and body in action 19 August 1944 in the vicinity of Brignoles, France. He was evacuated to the hospital where he received the very best medical care available but death occurred 22 August 1944 as a result of those wounds. I regret that no further details were given.

The Quartermaster General of the Army, Washington 25, D. C. has jurisdiction over matters pertaining to the burial of our military personnel who die overseas. A copy of your letter has accordingly been forwarded to that officer for necessary action.

Permit me to extend my sympathy.
