tion and is also possessor of a citation awarded by the British government, has been recommended for the distinguished service cross for extraordinary heroism in action.

The recommendation states in part: "On or about May 29 while his platorn was in direct support of a compony in an attack on strong enemy positions in the vicibity of Lanuvio, Italy, First Lt. Siercks' tank destroyer was oper-

ating over an open road when it was taken under fire by enemy guns at a range of 250 yards. Lt. Siercks had pulled his vehicle out in front of the jeading infantry elements and had cone under intense enemy small arms end anti-tank fire.

"Even though his vehicle was hit and disabled by the close range anti-tank fire, First Lt. Siercks or dered the crew to open fire and succeeded in destroying the enemy anti-tank gun. He was then taken under fire by two enemy tanks from tre immediate vicinity of the destroyed gun which his gun set or fire. With the vehicle burning and unable to move First Lt. Siercks stayed by the gun and directed fire against the tanks. On-

on fire. With the vehicle burning and unable to move First Lt. Sierche stayed by the gun and directed fire against the tanks. Only when the enemy tanks had been destroyed did he abandon the tank destroyer and lead his crew through the intense fire of automatic weapens to the leading elements of friendly infantry. Under intense fire and in the fact of grave danger First Lt. Siercks remained calm, giving orders quietly and precisely, and displayed great courage and intrepidity.
