WHEN the Germans surrounded Pfc James Davenport, of Paducah, Ky., and Co. A, 801st TD Bn., XIX Corps, he took refuge in a barn and did some valuable snooping for the Army. He watched for 12 hours as the Jerries set up a CP in a building next to the barn. When dark came he slipped back to American lines, killing one Jerry en route and barely escaping burp gun fire as he jumped a hedge. At a regimental CP of 99th Div., he told about the new enemy Hq., which American artillery set about to destroy.
