

1. ENEMY ARMORED OPERATIONS:

During the night, CG "B" contacted an unknown number of tanks and SP guns. Two (2) tanks were destroyed. A Mk V tank was reported withdrawing NW from A988677 at 1000A hrs. Another tank, 400 yds NW of WOLBACK, GERMANY at 0910A hrs.

2. TANK DESTROYER OPERATIONS:

a. 2nd TD Group - Displaced with XIII Corps closing in new area via NORDKIRCHEN at 011100A March 1945. Coordinated AF defense in Corps sector. APRIL

b. Tank Destroyer Operations:

(1) Changes in Dispositions:

a. 605th TD Bn - Bn relieved from XIII Corps control and passed to control of XIII Corps effective 311100A March 1945.

b. 643rd TD Bn - Bn CP in BECKUM, attached to 83rd Inf Div. "A" Co attached 528th Inf, "B" Co attached 550th Inf and "C" Co attached 531st Inf. All Co's moving - losses later.

c. 702nd TD Bn - Bn (-) moved via KURRICK, GERMANY - closed 3111700A March 1945. "B" Co under Bn control via Bn CP.

Losses of "A" and "C" Co's not known at time of rpt.

d. 801st TD Bn - Bn attached 113th Cav Grp - moved via SENDENHORST.

No report for period received.

e. 802nd TD Bn - Attached 96th Inf Div. Bn moving to 96th Div assembly area at time of this report. One (1) Co remained attached 377th RCT operating w/ 2nd Armored Division.

f. 809th TD Bn - Bn under control of XIII Corps effective 3111800A March 1945. Bn CP via SIEGEN. "A" Co attached CG "A", "B" Co attached CG "B", "C" Co attached CG "C", 8th Armored Div - all companies moving at time of this report.

g. 833rd TD Bn - Bn moving to 100th Inf Div assembly area - enroute at time of this report.



c. 809th TD Bn - "C" Co, fired unknown amount of Ammunition destroying two (2) MG nests. Unit captured fifteen (15) PW's.

d. 823rd TD Bn, - A-2 fired 67 rounds HE and 10 Rounds APC and 12,060 rounds .50 Cal. accounting for five (5) houses organized as strong points, two (2) MG nests, one (1) tower (containing MG nest) and one group of German Infantry.



1. ENEMY ARMORED OPERATIONS:

83rd Infantry Division in taking HORN knocked out one (1) tank. Two (2) more tanks were knocked out at VINSEBACH (E8962). Fighter bombers were reporting column of tanks or armored vehicles moving N and NE at (C0899) between 0930B - 1030B hours. 379th Inf. Regt of 95th Inf. Div. received a counterattack of estimated Co. of Inf. with tanks at DINKE (A1588). OP reports enemy armor moving E at A134365 at 1315B.

2. TANK DESTROYER OPERATIONS:

a. 2nd TD Group - Coordinated at defense in Corps sector. Six (6) TD Bns employed. Operating patrols vicinity Corps CP - captured five (5) PW's during period. Planning for future operations.

b. Changes in dispositions and activities:

(1) 645rd TD Bn (SP) - Bn CP moved to new location in BAD LIPPSPRINGE closing at 1645B hours. "A" Co., N of BAD LIPPSPRINGE in direct support of 329th REGT, "B" Co. SW of BAD LIPPSPRINGE in direct support TF "Biddle" - unit destroyed one (1) Mk IV tank during period. "C" Co. in SANDS, in direct support 351st REGT, location unknown - platoons unknown at time of this report. Bn expended 17 rounds APC and 125 rounds HE on 5 April firing on strongpoints via HAMM (Arms not previously reported and is included in total for today.)

(2) 702nd TD Bn (SP) - Bn CP moved via LEMMO closing 2015B hours. No change in Co's missions or attachments. Co "C" destroyed one (1) Mk V tank during period.

(3) 801st TD Bn (X) - Battalion moving - no report for period received.

(4) 802nd TD Bn (SP) - "A" Co. in NEURECKUM - unit relieved of attachment 377th REGT and reverted to Bn control. "B" Co. NW of AHLEN attached 378th Inf Regt and "C" Co. SE of RECKUM attached 377th Inf - 2-C and 3-C across LIPPE RIVER in direct support and C-1 in indirect fire positions NW of LIPPSPRINGE.



(6) 823rd TD Bn (SP) - Bn CP moved to new location via HOLTER closing 1600 hours. "A" Co on move - location unknown, "B" Co. via HIDDESEN and "C" Co. in STOCKENBROCK - all obs' atbmts no change. E-3 and Pioneer Platoon voluntarily drove and fought their way into a German strong-point to rescue vehicles and personnel of 119th Inf. Service Co., who had been ambushed, and killed eight (8) and captured 22 Germans.





No. 43 (Period 071200B - 081200B April 1945)

1. The 801st and 643rd TD Bns. knocked out one (1) Mk IV and one (1) V respectively. Both of these Battalions are operating in the sector of the 83rd Inf Div. There was a concentration of vehicles reported moving in area C1860 and around 1700B hours. Our planes hit area and observed eleven (11) enemy tanks and some vehicles. Air claims three (3) tanks knocked out. At NEUHAUS (C235520) a number of enemy tanks and other vehicles pulled out of woods heading E. At 0710 hours an unknown number of tanks reported in vic C6295718.

2. TANK DESTROYER OPERATIONS:

a. 2nd TD Group - Coordinated AT defense in Corps sector. Six (6) TD Bns. employed. Operating patrols via Corps CP. Planning for future operations. Assure Tac moved from RHEINBERG to BLOMBERG closing 1100B hours.

b. Changes in Dispositions and Activities:






