

No. 49 (Period 131200Z - 141200Z April 1945)

**1. TANK DESTROYER OPERATIONS:**

a. 2nd TD Group - Group remained in charge of Corps Reserve. Task Force consisting of Troop "A", 115th Cav cleaned pocket of resistance in a woods, capturing thirty-one (31) PW's. Coordinated AT defense in Corps sector. Operating security patrols via Corps CP. Captured eighty (80) PW's via Corps CP.

**b. Changes in Dispositions and Activities:**

(1) 643rd TD Bn (SP) - Bn CP in CALW, GERMANY. "A" Co across ELBE RIVER. "B" Co via BENZINGRODE in support of 115th Cav protecting Corps S flank. 2 Plato of "C" Co crossed ELBE RIVER. Normal attachments continued.

(2) 702nd TD Bn (SP) - Bn moved to new location in BENZINGRODE closing 1400 hours. Bn has one (1) plat., 789th Tank Bn atched for mission in sector of CG "A". Co "D" via BAD-SALZUFLAND w/plato disposed NE - N - NW of BAD-SALZUFLAND in AT posns protecting assay area and prepared to cross ELBE RIVER on orders. 1st Co maintaining roving security patrol in BAD-SALZUFLAND for purpose of keeping civilians off street.

(3) 801st TD Bn (SP) - "A" Co on road block mission S of GOSSLAR. "B" Co maintaining road blocks via OHLA and WILDEHAUSEN and Co "C" continued operations with 115th Cav Sqdrn in 80th Inf Div Zone of Action.

## - ARTILLERY REPORT -



No. 50 (Period 141200H - 151200H April 1945)

1. TANK DESTROYER OPERATIONS.

a. 2nd TD Group - Group remained in charge of Corps Reserve - no change in attachments. A Task Force consisting of Troop "A", 115th Cav cleaned the woods via Y1005 - finding no enemy. Task Force returned to assembly area in LANGENWEDDINGER. Corps Reserve operating security patrols via Corps GP with Troop "A", 113 Cav and Co "A", 823rd TD Bn patrolling NORTH and SOUTH areas respectively. Coordinated AT defense via Corps sector. Captured sixteen (16) PW's during period.

## b. Changes in Dispositions and Activities:

(1) 643rd TD Bn (SP) - "A" Co via BARBY, GERMANY, w/plats across ELBE RIVER in direct posns SW of WALTERNIENBURG. "B" Co via BARBY with B-1 and B-3 across ELBE RIVER SW of WALTERNIENBURG and B-2 via BARBY. Co "C" via BARBY with plats across ELBE RIVER SW of WALTERNIENBURG. Unit destroyed one (1) tank - type undetermined.

(2) 702nd TD Bn (SP) - Bn (-) moved via NETTINGEN. Co "A" (-) under Bn control fired 250 rds harassing fire (90mm HE) on targets selected by Div Arty. Co "A" relv'd indirect fire missions and moved Bn assembly area. Co "B" atchd CC "A" via IRILICHEN, GERMANY, remained in support of Task Forces prepared to cross ELBE CANAL on order. Co "C" atchd CC "B" remained on road blocks protecting assembly areas with C-1 via SCHLDE, C-2 via LICHENBERG and C-3 via NETTINGEN, GERMANY.

(3) 801st TD Bn (SP) - "A" Co in ILSMENBURG w/plats on road block mission SE & S of WINGERODE and E of BAD HARZBURG. "B" Co W of BAD HARZBURG with plats on road blocks S of WINGERODE, and NE of BAD HARZBURG. "C" Co cont'd operations with 125th Cav Sqdrn operating in 30th Inf Div Zone of Action.

1. TANK DESTROYER OPERATIONS:



## - ARTILLERY REPORT -

No. 52 (Period 161200H - 171200H April 1945)

1. TANK DESTROYER OPERATIONS:

a. 2nd TD Group - Group remained in charge of Corps Reserves. At 162400H Troop "A", 113th Cav plus one (1) Plat, "A" Co, 823rd TD Bn moved to via DE487 to stop a reported counter-attack of 500 enemy infantry attempting to cross ELBE RIVER and attack the 53rd Inf Div's bridge site from the rear. The threat was found to be a strong enemy patrol and situation was restored. The Troop returned to same location (DE0388) LANGENWEDDINGEN. "A" Co (-), 823rd TD Bn relieved of attachment 2nd TD Group 162400H April 1945 and moved via N of VANLDONF, A-2 atchd Troop "A", 113th Cav and is located via Troop "A" SP. Coordinated AT defense in Corps sectors.

## b. Changes in Dispositions and Activities:

- (1) 843rd TD Bn (SP) - "A" Co no change. "B" Co atchd CG "B" 161600H April 1945. Co destroyed 2 SP guns and lost one (1) M-18 and had one (1) man killed and 4 wounded. "C" Co no change, in dispositions or missions - unit destroyed two (2) Mk IV's and one (1) Mk V during the period.
- (2) 703rd TD Bn (SP) - Bn alerted 161900H April and sent Task Force to K1, OTTERSBURG, outposting the town with TD's and Hags. Co "B" moved to SCALISCHWITZ in AT posns protecting CG "B" assembly area. Co "C" no change.
- (3) 801st TD Bn (SP) - No change.
- (4) 809th TD Bn (SP) Co "B" - No change.
- (5) 823rd TD Bn (SP) - "A" Co (-) relieved attachment 2nd TD Group and moved to North of VANLDONF, GERMANY. A-2 atchd Troop "A", 113th Cav in Corps Reserves. "C" Co moved via HOBENWALDEN. "B" Co no change.

## 1. TANK DESTROYER OPERATIONS:

a. 2nd TD Group - Group remained in charge of a Corps Reserve. A-2, 823rd TD Bn was relv'd attachment to Trp "A", 113th Cav and moved via OLIVENSTEDT, GERMANY. Coordinated AT defense in Corps sector. Operated security patrols via Corps CP.

## b. Changes in Dispositions and Activities;

(1) 648rd TD Bn (SP) - No change. "A" Co knocked out one (1) G & T car expending 1 rd HE. "C" Co destroyed one (1) SP gun and one (1) HT on April 16 (not previously rptd).

(4) 809th TD Bn (SP) - Bn (-) via WOLKENSHUTTEL carrying on maintenance and rehabilitation. "B" Co sent'd road block mission protecting Corps S Flank. "C" Co via BRAUNSCHWEIG - unit assisting CG "R" in security of area. "C" Co turned in remainder of M-18's drawing M-36's.

(5) 823rd TD Bn (SP) - "A" & "C" Co's atchd 117th Inf closely supporting attack on MAGDEBURG, with platoons moving in on MAGDEBURG from the EAST through NILHEIMSTADT. 

## **1. TANK DESTROYER OPERATIONS**

a. 2nd TD Group - Remained in charge of a Corps Reserve consisting of Troop "A", 113th Cavalry attached. Operating security patrols via Corps CP. Coordinating AT defense in Corps sector.

### b. Changes in Dispositions and Activitiess

(1) - 643rd TD Bn (SP) - "A" Co in WALTERNIENBURG atched 329th RCT, with platoons in direct fire positions N of NUTHA and S of GUTERGLUCK. "B" Co in FLOTZ atched 320th RCT with platoons in direct support between FLOTZ and GODNITZ, W of GHERDEN and W of GUTERGLUCK. 




