SUBJECT: Annual Report of Medical Depurtment Activities.

- TO : The Surgeon General, Readquarters, United States Army Forces, Pacific Ocean Areas, APO 950.
- 1. In compliance with paragraph 6, AN 40-1005, the following annual report of the Nattalion Surgeon, 539th Amphibian Tractor Dattalion, is submitted:
- a. The 539th Amphibian Tractor Dattalion was activated on 1h April 19th under T/O & E 17-125, dated 29 April 19th. Pursuant to instructions contained in letter WD AG 32-2 file, subject: "Inactivation, Organization and Reorganization of Medical Units in December 19th and January 19th, the strength of the Medical Detackment was one (1) officer and three (3) enlisted man,
- b. This organization was designed as a Medical Detachment attached to the 539th Amphibian Tractor Buttalion to furnish medical aid to the battalion. Its functions are as outlined below:
- (1) To treat wounded on battlefront through the support of aid men with each company, then evacuating to Aid Station in rear.
 - (2) Further aid treatment at station.
 - (3) Evacuation wounded from Aid Station to Hospital Ship.
- c. On 19 April 19th Captain Doyar, MC, was assigned and joined from the 788th Amphibian Tractor Battalion, Fort Ord, California per paragraph 1, Special Order #3, Headquarters 539th Amphibian Tractor Eattalion, dated 19 April 19th and assumed command of the Medical Detachment as Battalion Surgeon of the 539th Amphibian Tractor Battalion.
- d. Further increase in the strength of the unit was made on the dates and from the sources indicated below:

- e. The training of the above enlisted men before assignment to this organization was as follows:
 - (1) One (1) man had completed Medical Technician Course
 - (2) One (1) man had completed Surgical Technician Course
- (3) Two (2) men were on Detached Service for a period of two (2) months at PSTU Dispensary, Fort Ord, California for 700 men.
- (4) One (1) man had been assigned as a noncommissioned officer (NCO) at a Wedical Department Technician School for one and one-half (1-1/2) years.
 - (5) One (1) man assigned to deneral Hospital unit for two (2) months.
- (6) One (1) man assigned with 407th Infantry Wedical Detachment for three (3) months.

All had completed the required basic training prior to assignment to this unit.

- f. On 16 June 1944 the unit completed its basic MTF6-22 program at Fort Ord, California. The basic MTF6-22 and Physical Fitness Tests were passed successfully by all personnel.
- g. In April, 19th, the unit was assigned to the Army Ground Forces under 13th Armored Group, Fort Ord, California for the first phase of basic training for a period of three (3) months. Included were the basic subjects: Compass Reading, Hiking, Calisthenics, Close Order Brill, Infiltration Course, Semaphore, Radio, and First Aid.
- h. In May, 19hh, Captain Boyer, MD, was relieved and on 1 July 19hh, let Lt Bonner, MD, assumed command of unit.
- 1. In July, 19th, the second phase of training began at Fort Ord, California. Here, further medical training was had such as: classes on the use of; Plassa, Morphine, First Aid to Gas Casualties, First Aid to Gun Shot Wounds, Shock, Splints on Fractures, Bensedrine (used both for mental and physical fatigue), Malaria Control, Water Purification, Atabrine and Quinine, Artificial Respiration, Use of Sulfa Drugs in Prevention of Infection, Use of Tourniquet, Snake Dit Kit, Trench Foot, Veneral Disease, etc. They were all allowed to demonstrate actual techniques amoung themselves—all under the supervision of the Medical Detachment Officer.

- j. The latter part of September 1914 was spent in the final preparation for overseas movement, and the packing and crating of the organizational equipment prior to movement to the staging area.
- k. On h October 19th Captain Fuller, MC, was assigned and assumed command of the unit. Lt. Bonner, MC, was relieved.
- 1. On 10 October 1944 the detachment departed with the 539th Amphibian Tractor Battalion from Fort Ord, California to the FOE for overseas duty. Landing in the Territory of Hawaii on 24 October 1944, the 539th Amphibian Tractor Battalion was assigned to the Mineteenth Armored Group, Koko Head, APO 956.
- m. On h December 19th, the 539th Amphibian Tractor Battalion was moved from Koko Head to Kuiaka Bay. The 539th Amphibian Tractor Battalion was then assigned to the Tenth Army, attached to the 4th Armored Group, APO 957, on 11 December 19th. The remainder of our stay at Kaika Bay Camp was spent in duties as Medical Detachment operating Battalion Dispensary and in the participation of the several activities.
- n. On 5 January 1945, the 539th Amphibian Tractor Battalion was transferred from Kaiaka Bay Comp to Schofield Darracks under assignment to the Tenth Army and attached to the 4th Armored Group.
