SUBJUCT: Report of Operations for the Period 1 -- 31 January 1945

TO : Commanding General, 3rd Infantry Division, APO 3, US Army.

# a. SUITARY OF OUR OPERATIONS:

At the beginning of the period the Battalion was attached to the 3rd Inlantry Division providing anti-tank defense for the infantry who held a line on the edge of the VOSGOU OUTTAINS overlooking the COLMAR Plain with each company in general support of its respective Regiment: "A" Company in support of the 7th Infantry Regiment, "B" Company in support of the 15th Infantry Regiment, "C" Company in support of the 30th Infantry Regiment, and Reconnaissance Company in support of the 30th Infantry Regiment.

During the First half of the period the Battalion's main mission was to provide the Division with adequate anti-tank protection. The majority of the guns were kept well forward in gug-in or hidden positions covering the entire Division front with protective fire. Several platoons in the Battalion were kept in the rear area as mobile reserve and from where they fired indirect night harassing missions. These guns were also used as roving guns moving to forward positions and firing harassing direct fire at enemy infantry positions. During this entire defensive period no enemy tanks attempted to penetrate the perimeter defense of the Division.

During the latter half of the period the Division went on the offensive with the objective of clearing out all enemy resistance in the COMMAR Pocket. While the infantry forced river crossings over the FECHT River and I'LLL River, the Battalion took up both direct and indirect fire positions, firing on known targets and targets of opportunity. Upon completion of the bridges each gun company moved across with its respective Regiment and supported the Infantry on its attacks on HOUSSEN and RIEDWIHR. During the entire attack the guns of the Battalion gave the Infantry assault fire on enemy strong points, pill boxes, and houses which helped materially in the advance. A number of German counter attacks developed during the offensive which consisted of infantry supported by tanks and tank destroyers. These counter attacks proved costly to the enemy for from well chosen positions the Battalion was able to knock out many enemy tanks and kill or wound innumerable enemy infantry.

When all resistance North of the COLMAR Canal had been wiped out the guns of the Battalion again moved to direct and indirect fire positions from which to support the Infantry as it crossed the COLMAR Canal and upon completion of bridges over the Canal the companies supported their regiments in establishing a sizeable bridge-head across the Canal

# b. ENEMY OPERATIONS FOR PERIOD:

During the first half of the period while the Division was on the defensive, enemy operations consisted only of artillery fire placed on forward areas and small patrols sent to harass our forward troops.

When the Division went on the offensive, the enemy reacted violently in attempts to prevent friendly armor from supporting the Infantry. The enemy utilized natural obstacles to the utmost by blowing all bridges and mining roads and trails. Because of the frozen condition of the ground, friendly armor was able to move across country, consequently the mined roads did not hold up the advance of armor. The enemy used anti-tank guns in comparatively large numbers in an attempt to half the armor. On one front of less than 1000 yards the enemy had emplaced 6 large anti-tank guns. The enemy for the first time used tank destroyers in large numbers in an attempt to halt our advance. From well chosen positions supporting the enemy infantry these destroyers were able to KO many pieces of our armor. However, when these enemy destroyers were used to counter attack our positions many of them were KO'd and burned. On three occasions the enemy counterattacked using tanks and tank destroyers to drive us away from our newly-won positions. From well hidden positions the Battalion was able to KO 14 tanks or tank destroyers and thus help drive back enemy attacks.

The personnel loss in the Battalion in comparison to the tank destroyers hit was comparatively light. This can probably be accounted for by the fact that the Germans either do not have or do not use an APC shell. All reports from our gun crews that were hit were that the shell that hit them was a solid AP shell; undoubtedly if the Germans had used an APC shell much higher casualties would have been sustained by this Battalion.

# c. SITUATION AT AND OF PERIOD:

At the end of the period the Battalion occupied direct fire positions in support of the Division which held a bridge-head over the CCLMAR Canal. "A" Company was in direct fire positions in support of 7th Infantry Regiment, "B" Company in direct fire positions in support of 15th Infantry Regiment, "C" Company in direct fire positions in support of 254th Infantry Regiment, and Reconnaissance Company patrolling the left flank of the 254th Infantry Regiment.

# d. STATUS OF PERSONNEL AND MATERIAL:

During a 24-hour period from January 24 to January 25 the Battalion suffered a number of casualties both in personnel and in tank destroyers. Personnel casualties were for the most part replaced by RTU's that came in during and after this period. Therefore, at the end of the period, the Battalion was only 19 men under strength. During the entire period 14 tank destroyers were disabled by enemy fire but only 6 were lost beyond repair. The remainder were put back into action anywhere from 24 hours to 72 hours after recovery by the superior work carried on by Battalion maintenance. At the end of the period the Battalion had 29 tank destroyers operationally fit and employed on the front lines.

# e. COMMINTS AND LESSONS LEARNED:

- l. The splitting of armor into small groups and attaching them to infantry units while operating in open "tank country" proves costly and expensive to friendly armor. When country such as this prevails all armor should be massed and instead of the armor conforming to the infantry plan, the infantry should be made to conform with the armored plan. Only by massing armor can suitable protection be provided for all concerned.
- 2. Because of the open turret which allows snow to fall inside upon the breech mechanism, care must be taken to prevent firing mechanism from freezing. During combat operations, when the turret could not be covered, this condition was overcome by keeping breech and firing mechanism covered as much as possible and cleaning all parts at every available opportunity.
- 3. While operating in winter weather the tanks of this Battalion were painted white in a camouflage design. This design was found to be better than all white for it blended with wooded back ground or houses which the tank destroyers used for concealment
- 4. White smoke shell for initial adjustment on a background of smow was found to be useless. HE shell against snow background served the purpose perfectly.
- 5. With the shortage of acetylene it was impossible, according to the standard method, to remove old type counterbalances from the turret in order to replace them with the new type. This was handled by drilling a hole in the center of the top surface of the block and inserting 2 pounds of dynamite. The resulting blast neatly broke the counterbalance away from the turret.

6. During a night attack one platoon commander in this Battalion borrowed two B.A.R. men for each of his tank destroyers and placed them on the rear of his tanks. These men with their rapid firing weapons killed an enemy bazooka team and drove off another enemy attempting to destroy the tank destroyers. By placing these men on the backs of the tank destroyers, all around security was provided, allowing the destroyer crews to concentrate on firing their principal weapon, the 3" gun.
