SUBJECT: Action Against Enemy; Reports After/ After Action.

TO : The Adjutant General, Washington, D. C.  
(THRU Channels)

1. In compliance with letter Headquarters First United States Army, dated 13 July 1944, Subject, same as above, this organization submits the following report of its activities during the month of November 1944.

2. The 612th Tank Destroyer Battalion was in active operation from 1 November to 30 November, occupying defensive positions in Belgium and Germany. Attachment to VIII Corps and 2nd Infantry Division remained unchanged.

3. During period 1 November to 6 November 612th, less Co's A, B, 2nd platoon Co C, and 1st and 2nd Rcn platoons, was attached to 2nd Division Artillery. Co B, attached to 23rd Infantry, furnished anti-mechanized protection. 2nd Platoon Co C, attached to 9th Infantry, furnished close-in fire support and anti-mechanized protection. Co C (less 2nd platoon) in close support of 38th Infantry, furnished close fire support and anti-mechanized protection. Co A, plus 1st and 2nd Rcn platoons, attached to Task Force "X", used in infantry role, held defensive positions in assigned section.

On 6 November Co B and 2nd platoon Co C were relieved of their attachments and put in direct support. Missions unchanged.

Co A captured 11 prisoners during period.
