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

628th Tank Destroyer Battalion (SP)

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A. Original Unit.

- (2) Date of Organization - 28th Division Anti-Tank Battalion (Provisional), 10 July 1941. Redesignated 628th Tank Destroyer Battalion 15 December 1941.

- (c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Camp Shanks, New York at 1700 hours 28 January 1944 via rail to Hoboken, New Jersey, via ferry to U. S. Lines Pier, New York City, and boarded Aquatania at 2130 hours 28 January 1944, sailing from New York Harbor at 0700 hours 29 January 1944, arriving at Grenoch, Scotland at 0900 hours 6 February 1944 then via rail to Hampton-in-Arden, England, arriving at 2100 hours 6 February 1944.

- (a) Purpose - Movement to Brecon Beacon Artillery Range.
- (b) Length of Daily March - Total Distance 130 miles.
- (c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Packington Park, England at 0600 hours 17 March 1944 and arrived at Hirwaun, Wales at 1630 hours 17 March 1944.
- (d) Condition of Roads - Hard Surface. Weather Fair.

- (3) Hirwaun, Wales to Packington Park, England.

- (a) Purpose - Return movement from Brecon Beacon Artillery Range.
- (b) Length of Daily March - Total Distance 130 miles.
- (c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Hirwaun, Wales at 0600 hours 2 April 1944 and arrived at Packington Park, England at 1700 hours 2 April 1944.

(5) Dorchester, England to Lychett-Minster, England.

- (a) Purpose - Movement to new station, Marshalling Camp D-2.
- (b) Length of Daily March - Total Distance 24 miles.
- (c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Dorchester, England at 1300 hours 4 July 1944 and arrived at Lychett-Minster, England at 1430 hours 4 July 1944.
- (d) Condition of Roads - Hard Surfaced. Weather Clear.
- (e) Remarks - None.

(6) Lychett-Minster, England to Corfe, England.

- (a) Purpose - Movement to Kimerage Artillery Range and Return.
- (b) Length of Daily March - 20 Miles round trip.
- (c) Points between which marched with dates - Left Lychett-Minster, England at 0700 hours 23 July 1944 and arrived at Kimerage Range at 0800 hours same date. Left Kimerage Range at 2000 hours 23 July 1944 and arrived at Lychett-Minster, England at 1100 hours same date.
- (d) Condition of Roads - Hard Surfaced. Weather Clear.
- (e) Remarks - None.

(7) Lychett-Minster, England to Puddletown, England.

- (a) Purpose - Movement to Marshalling Area Camp D-3.
- (b) Length of Daily March - Total Distance 22 Miles.
- (c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Camp D-2, Lychett-Minster, England at 1400 hours 25 July 1944 and arrived at Marshalling Area Camp D-3, Puddletown, England at 1530 hours same date.
- (d) Condition of Roads - Hard Surfaced. Weather Rain.
- (e) Remarks - None.

(8) Puddletown, England to Portland, England.

- (a) Purpose - Movement to Portland Hards and Embarkation for France.
- (b) Length of Daily March - Total Distance 18 Miles.
- (c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Marshalling Area Camp D-3, Puddletown, England at 0600 hours 27 July 1944, and arrived at Portland Hards, Portland, England at 0745 hours same date and loaded on boats starting at 0900 hours.
- (d) Condition of Roads - Hard Surfaced. Weather Clear.
- (e) Remarks - Completed loading of Battalion on three (3) LST's and one (1) LCT by 1200 hours 27 July 1944. Left Portland Harbor at 0600 hours 28 July 1944 enroute to Omaha Beach, France.

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(9) Omaha Beach, France to Bricquebec, France.

- (a) Purpose - Movement to Assembly Area.
- (b) Length of Daily March - Approximately 36 miles, total distance.
- (c) Points between which marched, with dates - Debarkation from boats at Omaha Beach, France completed by 1000 hours 31 July 1944. Battalion closed in assembly area at Bricquebec, France by 1500 hours 31 July 1944.
- (d) Condition of Roads - Hard Surfaced. Weather Clear.
- (e) Remarks - None.



(10) Bricquebec, France to Les Sommeres (LeMans), France.

- (a) Purpose - Exploitation of Avaranches Break-Thru by Third U.S. Army.
- (b) Length of Daily March - Approximately 33 miles per day average; total distance 165 miles.
- (c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Bricquebec, France at 1830 hours 2 August 1944. Route included St. Martin (near Avaranches), 3 August 1944; St. James (4-5 August 1944), Fougères, Vitre, Cosse-le-Vivien, Houssey (6 August 1944), St. Loup-du-Dorat, Arnage, arriving at Les Sommeres (Le Mans), France at 1600 hours 7 August 1944.
- (d) Condition of Roads - Hard Surfaced. Weather Clear.
- (e) Remarks - Column subject to sniper fire and machine gun fire en-route after Vitre. Column held up due to enemy action number of times approaching Le Mans area.

(11) Les Sommeres, France to Sees, France.

- (a) Purpose - To help XV Corps endeavor to close Falaise-Argentan Gap.
- (b) Length of Daily March - Approximately 21 miles per day average. 42 miles total distance.
- (c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Les Sommeres, France at 0200 hours 10 August 1944. Route included Bonnetable (11 August 1944), Mamers and Le Mesle arriving at Sees, France at 2000 hours 12 August 1944.
- (d) Condition of Roads - Hard Surfaced. Weather Clear.
- (e) Remarks - Some enemy resistance at Le Mesle, not serious.

(12) Sees, France to Le Boullay-Mivoye (Dreux), France.

- (a) Purpose - To apply pincers to enemy troops withdrawing through Falaise-Argentan Gap.
- (b) Length of Daily March - Approximately 54 miles total distance.
- (c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Sees, France at 2000 hours 14 August 1944. Route included Mortagne, Senonches and Le Boullay-Novoye (Dreux), France, arriving at 1230 hours 15 August 1944.
- (d) Condition of Roads - Hard Surfaced. Weather Clear.
- (e) Remarks - None.

(13) Le Boullay-Mivoye (Dreux), France to Cravent, France.

- (a) Purpose - To destroy enemy forces attempting to retreat across Seine River.

(b) Length of Daily March - Approximately 24 miles Total Distance.

(c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Le Boullay-Mivoye (Dreux), France at 1400 hours 18 August 1944. Route included Germainville, Havelu, Breval, Les Bussus (19 August 1944), Lomoye and arrived at Cravent at 0230 hours 19 August 1944.

(d) Condition of Roads - Hard Surfaced. Weather Rain.

(e) Remarks - Some enemy action enroute, not serious, column strafed at night near Breval, no casualties suffered.

(14) Cravent, France to Guerville (Mantes), France.

(a) Purpose - To destroy enemy forces attempting to retreat across Seine River.

(b) Length of Daily March - Approximately 36 miles total distance.

(c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Cravent, France at 1100 hours 24 August 1944. Route included Chaufour, Douains, LaChapelle, arriving at an assembly area, Les Butoirs, near Gallion at 1300 hours. Left Les Butoirs at 1800 hours and continued on route through LaChapelle, Douains, Cravent, Breval, Septeuil, Arnouville, arriving at Guerville (Mantes), France at 0030 hours 25 August 1944.

(d) Condition of Roads - Hard Surfaced. Weather Rain.

(e) Remarks - No enemy action enroute.



(15) Guerville (Mantes), France to Conde, France.

(a) Purpose - To drive to Belgium Border.

(b) Length of Daily March - Approximately 50 miles per day average. Total distance 150 miles.

(c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Guerville (Mantes), France at 0800 hours 30 August 1944. Route included Aubergenville, Ecquevilly, Paris, St. Denis, Ecouen, Senlis (31 August 1944), Compiègne, Noyon (1 September 1944), Guiscard, Ham, Savy, Gricourt, Beaurevoir, Walincourt, Fontaine-an-Pire, St. Hilaire, Haspres, Louchy, Valenciennes, arriving at Conde at 2330 hours 2 September 1944.

(d) Condition of Roads - Hard Surfaced. Weather Clear.

(e) Remarks - Met enemy action enroute, particularly in Compiègne Forest and Noyon areas.

(16) Conde, France to Ermsdorf, Luxembourg.

(a) Purpose - To seize Dutchy of Luxembourg.

(b) Length of Daily March - Approximately 20 miles per day average. Total distance 162 miles.

(c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Conde, France at 1200 hours, 4 September 1944. Route included Le Cateau, Guise, Vervins, La Romagne (5 September 1944), Signy l'Abbaye, Sormonne, Dammuzy (6 September 1944), Mezieres-Charleville, La Theux, Vivier, St. Menges, Floing, Illy, Givonne and Daigny. Were held up at Daigny until 7 September 1944 while Sedan, France was cleared of enemy troops. Left Daigny at 1300 hours 7 September 1944 and continued on route through Givonne, Villers-Gernay, Francheval, Messincourt, arriving at Florenville at 1700 hours 7 September 1944. Were held up east of Florenville, Belgium while forward elements of



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column had engagement with retreating enemy elements. Left assembly area east of Florenville, Belgium at 0900 hours 9 September 1944 and continued route through Pin, Jamoigne, Rossignie, Muller, Habay-la-Vielle, Habay-la-Neuve, Dottert, Metxert, Guirsch, Belgium, Beckerich, Luxembourg, Rippweiler, Useldange (10 September 1944, Saeul, Mersch, arriving at 2000 hours 10 September 1944 at Schrondweiler, Luxembourg, laid over there until 1500 hours 11 September 1944 and left Schrondweiler arriving at bivouac area on Brucherhof Farm 2 miles NW of Ermsdorf, Luxembourg at 1430 hours 11 September 1944.

(d) Condition of Roads - Hard Surfaced. Weather Generally Clear, some Showers.

(e) Remarks - Some action at Illy, also in Sedan area. Column under light enemy artillery fire at Metxert, but no casualties. Column held up outside of Mersch due to enemy action and Air Corps strafing fleeing enemy columns from Mersch to Schrondweiler. Also had to wait outside Mersch while engineers built bridge across Alyette River at that point.

(17) Ermsdorf, Luxembourg to Freilingen, Germany.



(a) Purpose - Penetration of Siegfried Line.

(b) Length of Daily March - Total Distance 12 Miles.

(c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Brucherhof Farm 2 miles NW of Ermsdorf, Luxembourg at 0900 hours 14 September 1944, arriving at assembly area at Reisdorf, Luxembourg at 1030 hours same date, remained in bivouac over night and left Reisdorf at 1500 hours 15 September 1944 and continued on route through Wallendorf, Germany, Biesdorf, Cruchten, Hommerdingen, Freilingen to Hill 408 approximately 1/2 mile NE of Freilingen arriving there about 1700 hours 15 September 1944.

(d) Condition of Roads - Hard Surfaced and cross-country. Weather Clear.

(e) Remarks - Siegfried line at Wallendorf, Germany had been penetrated by Combat Command "R", 5th Armored Division on 14 September 1944 so column had no difficulty in negotiating ford across Our River at Wallendorf or in advancing to Hill 408, however, enemy artillery commenced shelling Hill 408 shortly after arrival and shelling increased in intensity early in morning of 16 September 1944 so at 1000 hours Command Post Group was moved to new bivouac area 500 yards West of Freilingen, Germany, while gun companies held positions in vicinity of Stockem, Germany and Hill 408.

(18) Freilingen, Germany to Stegen, Luxembourg.

(a) Purpose - Withdrawal from Germany.

(b) Length of Daily March - Total distance 12 Miles.

(c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left bivouac position 500 yards West of Freilingen, Germany at 0930 hours 19 September 1944, continued back across country by-passing Cruchten and Biesdorf, crossed Our River at Wallendorf, Germany, then to Bettendorf, Luxembourg to new assembly and bivouac area 1 mile East of Stegen, Luxembourg, last elements closing in vicinity of Bettendorf about 0500 hours 20 September 1944 and arriving at bivouac area vicinity of Stegen about 1000 hours 20 September 1944, after temporary rest halts.

(d) Condition of Roads - Hard Surfaced and cross-country. Weather Clear.

(e) Remarks - Accomplished mission of penetrating Siegfried Line and in drawing enemy elements from other fronts. Heavy enemy artillery and mortar fire and intense counter-attacks on North, East and South of penetration bulge as well as periodic cutting by enemy forces of rear lines of communication made withdrawal feasible at that time.

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## (19) Ermsdorf, Luxembourg to Faymonville, Belgium.

- (a) Purpose - Regrouping of 1st Army troops in Northern Sector.
- (b) Length of Daily March - Total distance 60 miles.
- (c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Stegen, Luxembourg, at 1000 hours 5 October 1944. Route included Ettelbruck, Wiltz, (Luxembourg), Trois Vierges, (Belgium), Bovigny, Salmchateau, Vielsalm, Burtonville, Waimes, arriving at bivouac area 1 mile SE of Faymonville, Belgium at 1500 hours 5 October 1944.
- (d) Condition of Roads - Hard surfaced. Weather Rain.
- (e) Remarks - A purely non-tactical march.

## (20) Faymonville, Belgium to Kalterherberg, Germany.

- (a) Purpose - To move closer to active front for purpose of control over gun companies performing indirect artillery missions.
- (b) Length of Daily March - Total Distance 12 Miles.
- (c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Faymonville, Belgium at 1000 hours 23 October 1944. Route included Butgenbach, Eisenborn and arrived at billets 1 Mile west of Kalterherberg, Germany at 1130 hours 23 October 1944.
- (d) Condition of Roads - Hard surfaced. Weather Cloudy.
- (e) Remarks - A purely non-tactical march.



## (21) Kalterherberg Germany to Rotgen, Germany.

- (a) Purpose - To move closer to active front for purpose of controlling gun companies.
- (b) Length of Daily March - Total distance 20 miles.
- (c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Kalterherberg, Germany at 1000 hours 18 November 1944. Route included Mutzenich, Germany, Eupen, Belgium, Eynatton, Raeren, arriving at billets in Rotgen, Germany at 1230 hours 18 November 1944.
- (d) Condition of Roads - Hard Surfaced. Weather Cloudy.
- (e) Remarks - A purely non-tactical march.

## (22) Rotgen, Germany to Hahn, Germany.

- (a) Purpose - To evacuate V Corps Area and relocate in VII Corps Area.
- (b) Length of Daily March - Total distance 8 Miles.
- (c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Rotgen, Germany at 0900 hours 8 December 1944 via Walheim, arriving at billets at Hahn, Germany at 1000 hours 8 December 1944.
- (d) Condition of Roads - Hard Surfaced. Weather Cloudy.
- (e) Remarks - A purely non-tactical march.

## (23) Hahn, Germany to Erezee, Belgium.

- (a) Purpose - To move into tactical positions for purpose of opposing German breakthrough in Belgium.
- (b) Length of Daily March - Total Distance 42 miles.
- (c) Points between which marched, with dates - Left Hahn, Germany at 0600 hours 24 December 1944. Route included Eupen, Verviers, Theux, Louveigne, Remouchamps, Aywaille, Barvaux, Belgium and arrived at billets in Erezee, Belgium at 1430 hours 24 December 1944.

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(d) Condition of roads--Hard surfaced; Weather clear and cold.

(e) Remarks--Gun companies were withdrawn from Hurtgen Forest, Germany sector and entire Battalion attached to 3rd Armored Div. for tactical control. Gun companies immediately went into positions on arrival at Soy, Erezee, Manhay, Belgium front combating German Armored attacks that night. Enemy air activity over column enroute but were not strafed.

(24) Erezee, Belgium to Belle Vue, Belgium.

(a) Purpose--To move C.P. Elements closer to location of 3rd Armored Div. Arty Hq.


