WINT SMITH
635TH COMMANDING OFFICER
1941-1946

The 635th Tank Destroyer Battalion was commanded by one man, Lt. Col. Wint Smith, during its entire existence. Smith served as an Anti-Tank Officer during World War I and was familiar with the needs of the US Combat Forces for Anti-Tank equipment and trained troops. The 635th was organized at Camp Robinson in December 1941 under the command of Col. Smith. The Troops came from the 60th Field Artillery Brigade Regiments, 127th FA, 160th FA and 130th FA. Anti-Tank Platoons from the mentioned Regiments along with some Infantry Anti-Tank personnel in the 35th Div. made up the core of the new Battalion. After the war, Col. Smith was elected to Congress and served six terms as a Representative from the 6th Kansas District. He retired in 1960 and returned to his home in Mankato, Kansas. The "Old Man" passed away in 1976 in Wichita, Kansas.

635th T/D REUNIONS

NO. 1 - 1946 Kansas City, Missouri with Headquarters at the Continental Hotel.

In 1946 Harold Pellegrino was aware of the fact that the 35th Infantry Division was planning their first Post War Reunion in Kansas City, Mo. in October of that year. As the 635th was one of the original elements of the 35th Division, we were invited to attend. Pellegrino conceived the idea that it would be appropriate for the 635th to hold our first get-together at the same time and place. He consulted with Col. Wint Smith and a few of the Troops in Topeka and it was decided to go ahead with a reunion. The Continental Hotel was selected for the Headquarters. The big job, of course, was developing a mailing list and determining the cost for such a big task. Under Harold's leadership, things moved ahead. A large number of the ex-635ers stayed at the Continental where we held a big dinner and gab-fest. Everything went fine except the finances. Harold was hurting financially with an empty billfold when we all departed KC. However, everyone would agree that we had a good time and could only hope the future would hold better things in store for the 635th Reunions. In conjunction with this reunion, President Truman and General Esienhower both spoke to the gathering of 35th Division Veterans.

No.2 - 1971 Salina, Kansas with Headquarters at the Hilton Hotel/Motel.

After a 25 year lapse as well as giving considerable thought and discussion with several of the Troops, Harold Pellegrino again came to the front and decided it would be worth an all out effort to plan a reunion of the 635th. With help of Ray Spangler, Wayne Fender and Joe Crandall, as well as their wives, it was agreed to proceed. Salina Kansas was chosen as a site and Hilton Inn was our Headquarters. Again a big effort was made to update our mailing list. Needless to say this was a great reunion as we gathered in Salina. Seeing your old buddies, talking about the families a great number had started and, of course, re-fighting the war. This was the last appearance of Col. Smith for many of us. He was so proud of his troops to see that they were not only first class soldiers but first class citizens. It was in Salina that Pellegrino

was elected as our first President. We also decided to meet every 2 years and after some discussion, Colorado, Springs was chosen as our 1973 reunion city.

No. 3 - 1973 Colorado Springs, Colo. with Headquarters at the Antlers Hotel.

With the beautiful background of Pikes Peak as well as the many unique sights of the resort city, the 635th moved into the Antlers Hotel eager and ready to again fight the battle of the Bulge (our waist). Joe Crandall, a frequent visitor to Colorado Springs, served as the Coordinator of this reunion. This was in addition to his designing and printing of our 635th invitation, advertising and other literature promoting our reunion. The big highlight of the gathering was a delicious dinner. A surprise for all was when Capt. Van Lanningham made his appearance as a waiter for the dinner. Visits were made to the Air Force Academy, various golf courses and Pikes Peak. Friday evening we had a cookout in the mountains. All officers were reelected and we chose Portland, Oregon as the site of our 1975 reunion.

No. 4 - 1975 Portland, Oregon with Headquarters at the Thunderbird Motel.

Jim MacKay, Kenny Millar, Dick Cheney and Fred Schall led a rather large group of 635th Portlandites which made our 75 reunion in Portland a memorable one. Our Headquarters was located in the beautiful Thunderbird Motel. The accommodations were of the highest and we began seeing members of our Battalion that had never attended previous reunions and a lot we had not seen since the end of the War. Pellegrino had said in Colorado if we go to Portland we would attract a lot of former troopers from the Northwest area. He was right. We had a very nice banquet with dancing, plus a lot of talking and braggin. Sunday we had a delicious charcoaled salmon steak served on the patio of the motel. We voted to hold our 1977 reunion in Kansas City, Mo.

No. 5 - 1977 With Headquarters in the Alameda Plaza Hotel.

Again in Kansas City we could see the value of establishing a current mailing list and asking for everyone's help. A large number of first attendees were evident. This always adds to the excitement of the

reunions. The Alameda Plaza Hotel is one of the best hotels, not only in KC but in the US. The reunion affairs were handled by Joe Crandall, Bob Van Buskirk, Mike Sarras, Joe McKernan and George Corbett all, of course, under the minute direction of Pellegrino. We had a nice steak dinner in the main Ballroom followed by dancing to the 1940 era tunes. Some of the troops utilized their time attending a Royals ballgame, visiting the Truman Library and on Sunday several saw the Chiefs play. Lake Tahoe, Nevada was selected for our 1979 reunion.

No. 6 - 1979 Lake Tahoe, Nevada (North) with Headquarters at the Hyatt Tahoe Hotel.

We all looked forward to our trip to Lake Tahoe. So many of us had heard about the beautiful Tahoe area. It was a delight to see. We were not disappointed. Our Headquarters was the Hyatt Tahoe Hotel, a fabulous layout. A great deal of thanks and our appreciation goes to Harold Duarte, who lives in the area, for his work with the local people in making this reunion one of the best ever. With about 200 in attendance on Friday evening, we had a barbeque dinner at the Bonanza location site of the TV series. While back at the hotel, some of the 635ers were divesting their funds via the one-arm bandits and trips to the crap tables. The reunion was concluded with a nice banquet in the hotel ballroom and featuring the music of the 40's. We elected to hold our 1981 reunion in Little Rock, Arkansas on the 40th anniversary of the 635th. It all began at Camp Robinson in 1941.

No. 7 - 1981 Little Rock, Arkansas with Headquarters at the Hilton Inn.

On the minds of many of our men as we headed for Little Rock was, "I wonder how much the place has changed and what does Camp Robinson look like?" For more than a few of us our 1940 trip to Little Rock was our first venture away from home and it was an experience we could not forget. Jim Schofield and Roxy Hart were the coordinators for this reunion and they both did a remarkable job. There were about 200 in attendance and again we were able to bring out a group that had not attended any previous reunion. This is always good. We had a very nice banquet that was followed by dancing to the music in style when we were stationed at Robinson. Several of us visited Camp Robinson and were totally surprised to find most of our old haunts,

i.e. tents gone, mess halls and the area in general badly deteriorated and it was most difficult to find our old company and battalion areas. We will all remember the most gracious hospitality put forth by the people of Little Rock in 1940-1 and again in 1981. San Diego was chosen for 1983.

No. 8 - 1983 San Diego, California with Headquarters at the Hanalei Hotel.

The beautiful Hanalei Hotel was chosen as our Headquarters site in San Diego. A group of California troops led by Leo Hullihan and Doyle Derr and wives as well as Art Morris made this reunion one to remember. The hospitality room which is a feature of each reunion was outstanding in San Diego. Little favors hand made by the Californians added the right touch to the occasion. It took a lot of work to coordinate this affair as Hooly and the others who live in Los Angeles found out. A very nice and delicious banquet was served and was followed by that great 40's music. A lot of the people visited the famous San Diego Zoo, Sea Land and other points of San Diego. Again we saw former members of the 635th that had not previously attended a reunion. It is sad to think about and hard to accept but we are beginning to lose a number of our buddies. At the Battalion meeting we voted to meet next at Topeka, Kansas in 1985.

No. 9 - 1985 Topeka, Kansas with Headquarters in the Holidome

We were rewarded with the largest attendance at any reunion when over 200 were in Topeka for our 9th reunion. Harold Pellegrino and Ray Spangler along with Virginia and Maxine applied their magic to this meeting and we had a ball. Good food, good booze, great accomodations and to top it off, we were all greeted by the Governor of Kansas as we entered the banquet hall. The Mayor of Topeka welcomed us and we were also congratulated by the Adjutant General of Kansas for our service during World War II. Sites visited by the troopers were the Governor's Mansion, the Eisenhower Library in nearby Abilene, Kansas and the Truman Library in nearby Independence, Mo. It goes really without saying that we were happy to see new faces at this reunion. Some missing but not many. We re-elected the officers and voted, after considerable discussion, to meet in Denver, Colorado in 1987. Our Headquarters site will be the Writers Hotel.

WHO WILL FORGET?

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE 635th T/D BATTALION

NOTE: This writer wishes to thank Major Carl Harder for the use of his notes and his own personal history of the 635th to put this short resume of our history together for inclusion in the 10th Reunion handbook. If by chance you gather that some of the remarks allude only to "C" Company, forgive me. Perhaps later on we can elaborate more and thus achieve input from all.

It was in early Spring of 1940 that the World situation was such that Congress passed a law that all young men should serve a year on active duty in the Armed Forces, then be discharged having fulfilled their commitment. Before the year was over the danger of war was evident and we were retained. Along with all these rookies a number of National Guard units were activated including the parent Division of the 635th, the 35th Infantry Division consisting of men from Kansas, Nebraska and Missouri. A large number of the rookies were assigned to the 127th FA which was part of the 60th Field Artillery Brigade. The other two Regiments of the 60th Brigade were the 130th FA and 161st FA Regiments. Each of the organizations had a number of anti-tank platoons which was the basic core of the 635th T/D Bn. In addition, the 635th consisted of men from anti-tank sections of other 35th Div. outfits, mostly the Infantry Regiments. In addition to these personnel, the Battalion was supplemented by the "Selectees" from Kansas and the States of Oregon and Washington. I remember well our trip to Little Rock, Ark. and Camp Robinson. You see we had been issued uniforms in Topeka and elsewhere that had been used by the 114th Calvary (127th FA Predecessor). We had campaign hats, high boots and jodphuers. Talk about fancy! The supply people soon picked these up and we were back to issue uniforms.

On December 23, 1940 from all parts of the Midwest we departed for Camp Joseph T. Robinson at Little Rock, Arkansas arriving there by rail shortly before the first of the year 1941. For most of 1941 we were involved in building the Camp. We laid gas lines to our tents; we

built sidewalks and we had close-order drill until we were blue in the face. In between we went to the firing range quite frequently. I remember we changed weapons often, we cleaned the weapons and shipped them to troops who were in need, at least that is the way I remember it.

In June of 1941 the 635th was activated and was know at that time as the 35th Division Provisional Anti-Tank Battalion. It was placed under the command of Lt. Col. Wint Smith who retained this command throughout the existance of the Battalion. Most likely this was the only instance of such an assignment. The troops for this outfit were from the 127th, 130th and 161st FA Regiments as well as other 35th Units. The Battalion participated in the 1941 Louisiana Manuevers in support of the Blue Forces. I remember firing on tanks by waving an orange flag from our gun position. Frankly we never missed a shot although some of the umpires never gave us credit. Our gun consisted of a big tent pole painted green and mounted on 2X4 struts and connected to the tent pole by a huge bolt. Who can forget the "Mess-Kit" sickness. We did learn how essential it was to clean our mess-kits. The Battalion was returned to Camp Robinson and on December 15, 1941 pursuant to General Order #1 our outfit was designated as the 635th Tank Destroyer Battalion. You will remember what happened on December 7, 1941.

On December 27, 1941 the Battalion was moved by rail to Fort Ord California and after a short 16-day stay we were then moved over the road to Camp San Luis Obispo, California. The 635th as assigned to Camp San Luis Obispo until April 1941.

In April, the 635th T/D Bn was assigned a Defensive Mission and moved to Burbank Calif. In the next few months we served in that capacity with Battalion Headquarters locataed at March Field, Riverside, Calif. and the companies of "B & C" in Burbank and rest of the Battalion located in Ontraio, Calif and some Companies assigned to other Defense araeas and War plants. Who will ever forget the Lockheed Air Plant, the Vega Aircraft Co. and Bendix in Van Nuys. Also the hospitality of the Southern California populace. After being relieved of our Defensive Mission in August 1942 we were moved to Oak Grove Park in Pasadena

The 635th departed from the New York Point of Embarkation and Camp Shanks on February 9, 1944. We sailed on the ship ANDES without the benefit of convoy and arrived, without incident, in Liverpool, England on February 19, 1944. On board ship who will ever forget the breakfast menu of creamed liver, the crowded sleeping conditions in that at least one company of the 635th had to sleep in the mess hall and on mess tables, the English selling us diluted tomato juice which did help reduce sea-sickness. Do you remember as we left the Andes the large number of red-faced kids along the streets asking for gum?

The Battalion was billeted in Neissen Huts situated on the Tracy Estate, Toddington, which was near the much larger town of Cheltenham and relatively close to the famous Shakespeare town of Stratford-on-Avon. The 635th T/D Bn. basketball team participated in the South England Tournament and progressed to the finals before elimination.

We stayed at Toddington until May 16, 1944. During this period between landing in England and May 16 we entered into all phases of combat training and physical conditioning and was outfitted with all TO vehicles and weapons which brought our strength to 100%. We then assembled in Marshalling areas for further outfitting and briefing. The Battalion then embarked from Falmouth and Plymouth, England on 3 LST's numbered 55, 381 and 392 on June 2, 1944 for the invasion and assault of France on the Normandy Beachhead. After several attempts to move forward to the beach the 635th landed at the FOX-GREEN portion on OMAHA BEACH on June 7 & 8, 1944 in Support of the three Regiments of the 1st Infantry Division. You will recall we had planned to land on June 4th but weather caused Gen Esienhower to back off until the 6th.

Major Harder has secured from the Historical Division of the Dept. of Defense the book titled "OMAHA BEACHEAD". This book provides a graphic description of the initial assault and the actions from June 6 thru June 13, 1944. Major Harder says the book mentions the 635th several times and that it would be of particular interest to all.

The Battalion supported the 1st Inf. Div. throughout the Northern France Campaign until August 31, 1944. During this period you will recall the jump-off at St. Lo, the

closing of the Falaise Gap, the sealing off of the Cherbourg Peninsula and the backing off of our Battalion's anticipated entrance into Paris wherein we were supplanted by the French 2nd Armored Division in our uniforms and our equipment. Needless to say we were disappointed. It was a strange coincidence that we entered Germany at the same place as the 1st Inf. Div. had in World War I. After August 31, 1944 we were assigned to the 4th Cavalry Group as it continued the drive through Belgium to Butgenbach near Malmedy. From there the 4th Cavalry Group was shifted to the Roetgen-Aachen Sector and assisted in the drive through the Hurtgen Forest. Who will forget the day of December 16, 1944. With our Battalion in the Hurtgen Forest overlooking the City of Duren across the Rohn River.

The Germans started their ill fated counter-attack with the goal of capturing the port city of Antwerp and thus splitting the Allies Defenses. The Battalion was then rushed from the Hurtgen Forest to Belgium to help counter the German's attack. Some of us were wounded and evacuated at this time. You will recall this is the time the Germans were using our uniforms, guns and English speaking German Soldiers to penetrate our lines. I remember an MP stopping our ambulance asking several questions such as "was Babe Ruth a Halfback or Tackle". Our GI's would know immediately the answer. After Cologne fell, the 635th was transferred from the 1st Army to the 7th Army and assigned to the 71st Inf. Div. One of our Captains and 20 enlisted men were selected as part of a detail to raise the American Flag over Cologne. Shortly after or about April 1, 1945 the 71st Inf. Div. with the 635th were transferred to the 3rd Army. The Battalion supported the 71st in the drive across the Rhine near Mannheim through Central Germany and into Austria. Elements of the 635th with the 71st Inf Div were among the Troops who advanced further East than any of the Troops on the Western Front.

V-E Day found the Battalion in Lambach, Austria after 11 months on the line and in action against the enemy. Only the 635th was given a 10-day rest period immediately after active participation in the Ardennes Campaign. At this time the 635th was assigned the duty of guarding, feeding and administering the Prisoner of War Cages in Lambach. On May 7, 1945 the Lambach PW Cage had within its perimeter in excess of 50,000 PWs. After discharging 10,483 Enlisted

Men and 575 Officers, 792 Volkssrum and 67 WACS through May 31, 1945 we still had in the PW cage 785 Officers, 20,392 Enlisted Men and 92 Political Prisoners. Also, in auxiliary hospitals there were approximately 1800 Officers and Enlisted Men under the supervision of the 635th. Under special guard and in a segregated cage, 65 SS Officers and 2,540 SS Troops. There was also a displaced persons program under the 635th which was responsible after proper screening for shipment of the displaced persons to their homes.

Battle casualties throughout the WWII campaign were 1 Officer killed and 8 Enlisted Men killed in Action. 1 Officer and 8 Enlisted Men died of wounds received in action making a total of 2 Officers and 36 EM who made the supreme sacrifice. 5 Officers and 115 EM were wounded in action and evacuated. 3 Officers and 79 EM were wounded in action but not evacuated.

The 635th T/D Battalion was awarded the Bronze Service Award for participating in the initial assault at the Normandy Beachheads and was commended by the 4th Cavalry for a high degree of combat efficiency throughout the entire campaign on the Continent. The Battalion participated actively in the ETO Campaigns: Normandy, Northern France, Ardennes and Central Europe. We took 4,639 Prisoners of War and knocked out a large number of German Tanks. We fought sometimes as Infantry and were used to organize Anti-Tank defenses. We were used as screening missions, as road patrols, as combat patrols, outposts and road blocks. We were dismounted and used as Infantry in the Battle of the Hurtgen Forest. Our 3" guns were used to advance the Infantry through wooded areas and towns. The 635th captured towns, secured bridges, knocked out tanks and generally supported every action the Infantry Regiments participated in.

The Troops of the 635th were awarded a large number of decorations including Purple Hearts, Distinguished Service Award, Silver Stars, 574 Bronze Service Arrowheads, Bronze Star Medals, including Special Awards and Unit Citations from both the Belgium and French Governments.

Again I thank Major Carl Harder for the use of his notes and resume of our Battalion's efforts, especially in the ETO. Also, I appreciate the help of Capt. Pellegrino in this endeavor. I thank Joe Crandall for his great art work. Without a doubt, there are perhaps some inaccuracies and some important actions, dates and happenings that have been omitted.
