JANUARY  
1946

- 1 January 1946, Aboard U. S. S. Albemarle: Usual Shipboard duties. Morale: Excellent.
- 5 January 1946, Aboard U. S. S. Albemarle: Ship crossed International Date Line.
- 8 January 1946, Aboard U. S. S. Albemarle: Ship narrowly missed striking floating mine. Mine was detonated by Naval Gun Crews with 20MM and 40MM gun fire.
- 11 January 1946, Aboard U. S. S. Albemarle: Battalion participated in Farewell Happy Hour sponsored by Ship's Chaplain. Troops were addressed by the Ship's Commanding Officer; C. H. DUBORG, Captain, United States Navy.
- 13 January 1946, Camp Stoneman, California: Ship arrived at San Francisco Port of Embarkation at 0755 hours. Troops moved from Ship to Camp Stoneman, California via ferry, arrived at Camp Stoneman at 1730 hours for processing pending shipment to individual separation centers.
- 15 January 1946, Camp Stoneman, California: Battalion deactivated per letter, Subject: "Inactivation of Certain Army Air, Ground and Service Forces Type Units (Category IV)", File: AG 322 (29 Nov 45) OB-I-SPMOU-M, War Department, The Adjutant General's Office, Washington 25, D. C., dated 26 November 1945 and Processing Orders Number SFS - 201, File SPTAE-SCS (OD) Army Service Forces, San Francisco Port of Embarkation, Camp Stoneman, Pittsburg, California, dated 13 January 1945
