Subject: Historical Records and Administrative History.

To : Commanding General, SOS NAT , APO 750.

1. Hitherto there has been no specific directive to Headquarters SOS or to Base Sections to compile their histories or to submit to this Headquarters monthly reports of their activities, such as are required of combat units. Letter, this Headquarters, file AG 314.7/322 B-0, dated 8 January 1944, subject: "Historical Records and Histories of Organizations", directed (paragraph 3c) that Base Sections and units thereof keep records and files in such form as to permit the compiling of histories. Annex I to the above letter outlined suggestions in paragraph 4 for the content of histories and journals of administrative organizations.

2. Lest the important and valuable contributions of the non-combat units in this theater be lost to the history of the army it is directed that all units in the SOS compile the records of their activities from activation to 1 May 1944. Starting with 1 June 1944 these units will submit monthly journals in duplicate to the NATOUSA Historical Section, G-3, this headquarters.

3. These monthly journals will indicate the major activities of each section, the problems faced and the methods devised to deal with them, the changes in organization and in methods, the services operated by the section.

4. When a unit is inactivated, or disbanded, its historical record will be brought up to date, and accompanied by a final roster, forwarded without delay to the Historical Section, NATOUSA.

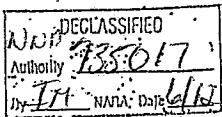
5. The NATOUSA Historical Section will be available to advise and aid the SOS units in their historical reports. An officer of this section will visit your headquarters and each base section in the near future.

SUBJECT: Historical Records and Administrative History.

TO : See Distribution.

1. Attention is directed to paragraph 3c and paragraph 4, Annex I, of letter Headquarters, NATOUSA, 8 January 1944, AG 314.7/322 B-O, and to letter Headquarters, NATOUSA, 11 May 1944, AG 314.7/540 C-O, to Commanding General, SOS NATOUSA (a copy inclosed).

2. To secure the history of all units of this Command, it is desired that base section commanders have the following historical reports prepared and forward them in triplicate to Headquarters SOS, NATOUSA, to arrive on or before 30 June 1944.

a. History of the base section from activation to 1 May 1944.

b. Histories of all organizations under base section command to 1 May 1944.

3. Organization histories will be kept up to date by the submission each month, beginning with 1 June 1944, of monthly historical journals covering the activities of the previous month. These journals will be forwarded in triplicate to this Headquarters. The existing monthly narrative report is considered sufficient to keep the base section, as distinct from individual organizational, history up to date.

4. Supporting documents will accompany the original historical report. They will include such documents as directives, important orders, special reports, statistics, overlays, charts, tables and photographs. They should be selective, covering significant items. Photographs are particularly desirable, and each one submitted should be accompanied by its identification number and caption, and a statement as to where negative is filed or to what headquarters negative has been forwarded.

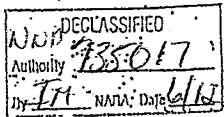
5. Suggestions:

a. The purpose of these historical reports is two-fold; to preserve the history of the Army in this Theater and to provide a basis of experience for the future. It is desirable that the histories go below the surface of bare events. They should show the reasons for adopting practices and for changing them. They should give the story behind the figures, the reasons for ups and downs of statistics, and the significance of any mass of facts.

b. With the aim of planning for future installations, the histories should record failures and mistakes as well as successes. Frequently more can be learned from errors rectified than from initially successful operations. The histories are not for publication but for Army use alone.

c. Histories of initial operations of large installations should cover:

- (1) Organization, including reasons for inclusion of various elements.
- (2) Command; setting up of military areas.
- (3) Training and development.
- (4) Problems of assembly, embarkation, movement, debarkation.
- (5) Character of country and terrain occupied.
- (6) Attitude of military and civil officials and of population of region, intrigues; degree of cooperation.
- (7) Resources of country, products available locally for U.S. use to save transportation; products available for return cargoes.
- (8) Methods employed to restore operation of damaged facilities such as ports, bridges, etc.
- (9) Engagements or operations.
- (10) Methods adopted for control of discipline, police, fire protection, health (disciplinary training centers, disease control, etc.)

d. Subordinate units under the base sections will cover such of the points enumerated above as are pertinent to their activities.

e. After the history to 1 May 1944 is written, the monthly historical journals of organizations should treat changes, movements, civilian problems, and running comment on important events. The existing monthly narrative report will be sufficient from the standpoint of the base section as distinct from subordinate organizations.

f. Material included in the histories should be of clear importance and the extraneous should be excluded. Detail is desirable; too brief accounts and merely stereotyped, formalized reports leave out too much to give an adequate history. It is desired particularly that history in SOS (Communications Zone) NATCUSA be recorded while records are still at hand, and while participants are still on the scene.

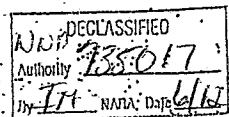

To: See Distribution.

1. Reference: Letter SOS NATOUSA, 314.7 (SSDCS) dated 23 May 1944,
Subject: Historical Records and Administrative History.

2. All organizations under Base Section command, with the exception of PBS Headquarters sections, Headquarters Command, Headquarters Sixth Port, Staging Area and Metropolitan Area, will prepare historical reports covering activities up to 1 May 1944. Reference paragraph 5 c and d of attached letter, all suggested phases may be covered if relevant, but special attention will be given to (1), (2), (3), (4), (7), and (9). The period while under command of this Base will be particularly stressed.

3. As stated in paragraph 4 of attached letter, supporting documents will accompany the narrative account. Photographs, if submitted, will have full and explicit captions, and will not be mounted with ordinary paste or glue. Rubber cement, scotch tape, or diagonal slits in the page should be employed in mounting photos. If serial numbers or other identification are available for photos, they should be given.

4. These historical reports, complete with supporting documents, will be submitted in quadruplicate to the Historian, PBS, APO 782, to reach him not later than 20 June 1944. Double spaced typing on legal-sized paper is preferred.

5. Appropriate security classification will be assigned these reports in accordance with AR 380-5, and they will be strictly safeguarded.

SUBJECT: SOP - BEACH PATROL.
TO : ALL OBSERVATION POSTS.

I. Effective upon receipt.

II. General Mission

(A) The mission of this patrol is counter-intelligence. The prevention of landings on the beach covered by this patrol is the primary mission. The arrest of suspicious persons and the accurate reporting of all ships, flares, or other activity along the beach as quickly as possible must be done.

(B) All personnel on OP duty will be alert during their tour of duty.

III. Reports:

(A) An accurate record of all ammunition, (i.e. 37mm, 50 cal, 30 cal, 45 cal, hand grenades and flares) expended will be kept and turned over to the rations truck driver each day.

(B) Before firing on any boat clearance from Commanding Officer OP #2 must be gotten.

(C) (Use Observers Report Form) during daylight-every three (3) hours beginning at 0700 til 1900
At night-every hour from 1900 to 0700.

IV. Evacuation.

Evacuate sick or wounded personnel to nearest first aid station.

Notify Commanding Officer OP #2-

- (a) Name, Rank, ASN.
- (b) What happened.
- (c) Present location.

V. Maintenance of Material.

(A) All personnel will clean their weapon daily.

(B) Vehicle 1st echelon maintenance will be performed daily.

(C) Any motor vehicle failure or weapon breakdown will be reported immediately.

(D) Ammunition will be kept dry and free from sand and dirt.



VI. Uniform.

- (A) All personnel will wear, at all times, clean clothing.
- (B) Web equipment will be kept clean and not worn unless ordered by Commanding Officer, Beach Patrol.
- (C) Steel helmets will be worn on duty.

VII. Rations.

- (A) Food, Water, Gas, Dil delivered daily.

VIII. Miscellaneous.

- (A) Mail delivery with rations.
- (B) Passes.
 - (1) 2 Men authorized to be absent during the day, 0900 to 1700.
 - (2) 1 Man authorized to be absent from 1730 to 2100.

All personnel going on pass will be in class A uniform. Uniform will be clean and neat with chevrons sewed on.

SECRET

1. One half track, USA #4028145, blown up by anti-tank mine on 11 April 1945.
 - a. Suspension assembly on right side completely destroyed.
 - b. Body and chassis damaged to such an extent that a replacement was necessary.
2. One 1/4-ton, USA #20116529, struck by fragments of artillery shell.
 - a. On 22 April 1945, between 1000 and 1700 hours, approximately 400 rounds of 88 MM and 6 rounds of 305 MM shells were dropped in the Company area, the bulk of these shells landing in the first platoon, "C" Company, area. As a result of this shelling the 1/4-ton sustained the following damage.
 - (1) Radiator pierced by shell fragment.
 - (2) Two tires cut by shell fragments.
 - (3) Engine hood and carburetor both pierced by shell fragments.
3. Glass in panoramic sight on gun #209 broken on 22 April 1945.
 - a. This gun was hit in several places, including shield, panoramic sight, tube and recoil cylinder, by shell fragments but the only real damage sustained was the glass in the panoramic sight being broken.
 - b. Circumstances surrounding the damage to this panoramic sight are the same as those given above for the 1/4-ton.
4. Two 1/4-tons, #W-20372191 and #W-20643646, were hit by shrapnel on 2 April 1945 from 75 MM or 88 MM shells. Damage: holes through radiators, hoods, gasoline sediment bowls, windshields and seats. Vehicles parked in vicinity of Querceza. 12 to 18 enemy guns were estimated to have fired all night.
5. One 2 1/2-ton GMC hit a Schu Mine in the vicinity of Aulla, on 30 April 1945. Only damage blew hole in one rear tire and tube. Vehicle USA #W-4186995.
6. One 3/4-ton truck hit a Schu Mine in the vicinity of Sarzana, on 30 April 1945. Only damage blew hole in rear tire and tube. Vehicle USA #W-2280019.
