6. Medical Requirements:

Personnel of this unit have been screened in compliance with Para 6 Sect II, Inc No. 1 to Annex B, Redeployment Movements. Of the total personnel authorized for this movement by WD M/D, 100% of the officers and 100% of the enlisted men are physically and mentally qualified for further overseas service in an active theater of operations.

7. Training:

With due consideration being given to the standards of training prescribed for this type unit prior to its departure from the Zone of Interior for overseas service; to current WD training directives; to missions assigned the unit and the assignment and experience of the personnel thereof during overseas service; and, to the additional training given in preparing the unit for redeployment, this unit and the individuals, specialists, technicians, crews, sections, and teams thereof are ~~not~~ qualified in all functions essential to the performance of the unit's primary missions in an active theater of operations.

Additional training required:

Specialist:

Radio maintenance and Operators, 6 weeks; Heavy Maintenance Personnel, 4 weeks; Fire Direction Center Personnel Training; Gun Mechanics, 4 weeks; Elementary Survey Training, 2 weeks; Crew Training: 4 weeks M-10 Crew Training for Direct Fire Missions, 4 Weeks Secondary Crew Training for Field Artillery Role; Dismounted Training for Reconnaissance personnel.

General:

Japanese Tactics, Malaria Control, Individual Small Arms Training, Map Reading, FM Radio Procedures, Mine Warfare, Interior Guard, and Local Security. Security and Patrolling, night operations. Replacements received to date and still enroute to unit are either from armored units or armored training centers. A minimum of two months training will be necessary to train and organize combat crews. Specialist training must take place in specialist schools. This unit is not properly qualified to train such personnel.

9. Unit is turning in combat vehicles at LIVUNO while enroute to redeployment area. At redeployment area unit will turn in all but essential organizational equipment.
10. Assigned missions:
This unit has performed in combat primary missions consistent with the basic purpose for which organized for 25 months. For 18 months 1 or 2 Cos of the Bn were continually performing as artillery. Since redeployment the Bn has had 85% turnover of personnel, the replacements coming from tank and infantry units and replacement pools.

11. Summary:
Unit has not received readiness date, and whether unit will be qualified for perform all phases of its primary mission by said personnel readiness date is not known.
