RECONNAISSANCE COMPANY FROM OCTOBER 3, 1942 TO JANUARY 30,1943

After "B" and "G" Companies had left the Battalien under centrel of Combat Command "B", the remainder of the Battalien prepared for movement from Northern Ireland; and on October 27, 1942 Battalien Headquarters, Headquarters Company, "A" Company, and Recommaissance Company(less one plateen) entrained at Tullymurry, County Down, under cover of darkness for Belfast. The unit them embared at Belfast and crossed the Irish Sea, landing at Strangaer, Sectland, there entrained, and detrained at Steke on Trent, England, and traveled by motor convey to Tytherington Hall, Masclesfield, Cheshire, England, where the Battalien was to be quartered. The whoeled vehicles crossed the Irish Sea, via Lame, to Strangaer, and them by convey to Encelesfield. At Tytherington Hall the Battalien assumed usual garrison duties, conditioned and prepared equipment for combat. Here the Battalien was again split into two groups (one group consisting of Eradquarters Company, the other group of "A" Company and Recommaissance Company).

On the 9th of Nevember the Headquarters vehicles left for Liverpool, England, for shipment, via earge vessels, to North Africa, while the remainder of the Battalien remained in Macelesfield for later shipment. Headquarters personnel followed on the 22nd of Nevember and boarded the H.M.T. "Otrante". The ship lay suchered in the River Mersy until the 27th, when she set sail in convey for North Africa, at noon. It. Gelemel King was appointed OG of all troops aboard ship.

The H.N.T. Otrante arrived in Gibralter on the 5th of December, and remained there until the 8th(during the veyage she had developed meter trouble and had fallen behind her convey). On December 9th, the Otrante sailed again and arrived on the 18th at Mers-el-Kebir mear Oran, Algeria. The Headquarters group mered to a new bivouas area in the vicinity of Salines D'Arzu on December 11th, and there awaited the arrival of the remainder of the Battalien from England.

In the meantime, the group left in Ragland had propered for merchant, and the meantime of December harder the H.M.f. "Ampress of Canada". The "Ampress" of the little for Merth Africa. The voyage was rough and the seas more for all ost the entire voyage, and there was much seasickness among the cooler, disembarked, and moved into bivorac with the fest of the Battalien at Jalines D'Arzu. Here the Battalien (minus "B" and "C" Companies) spent Christmas. The Battalien had a short alert on the 24th when Admiral Darlan was an assinated.

Ab Jalines J'Arzu the treeps spent perhaps the most miserable menth of Media lives. It was the rainy season in North Africa and the rains were incommunity. The Battalion area became a sea of mud.

On January 8, 1943, to the delight of both efficers and men(after such a misserable wanth), the track vehicles left the area for Oran, and there were loader aboard Karacaibe boats for shipment to Phillipville. The vehicles is added there on January 11th. On January 9th the remainder of the Battalian left Salines D'Arzu on a four day nevement to Oued Sogum area(mear Constantine) by war of Orleansville, Affreville, L'Arba, Bouira, Setif. Here they were rejelmed by the track vehicles from Phillipville.

The Battalian neved from this area on the 18th of January, and in a two day neverent arrived at Bou Chebka, Tunisia, in the 1st Armered Division Assembly Area.

"A" Company left Battalion control on the 21st of January and moved with elements of the 1st Armored Division (Combat Command "A") to Sheitla, Tunisia, but the less was balanced by the gain of "C" Company the following day. On the 25th, four new 75mm 3/P's were received and assigned to Lt. Romani's Platoon of "C" Company. (Lt. Romani, ex-Sgt. Romani of "C" Company, had been demaissioned for his good work near Modjez El Bab).

On January 30th, the Battalien(new composed of Headquarters, Headquarters Jongany, Reconnaissance Company(less one plateon), and "C" Company(less one plateon) was assigned to Combat Command "D" under the command of Colonel Maraist

(Division Artillery, 1 AD) for an attack on Sened weigh was to be the hours the following morning.
