1. a. Pursuant to the authority contained in WD letter AG 322 (30 Nov 44) OS-I-GMGCT-M, subject: "Reorganization of Tank Destroyer Battalions," dated 2 December 1944, with 1st Indorsement, Hq ETOUSA, AG 322 OpGC, dated 13 December 1944, and letter, Hq Twelfth Army Group, file 322 (Arty) same subject, dated 20 December 1944, effective 28 February 1945 the 774th Tank Destroyer Battalion, previously organized in accordance with T/O & E 18-35, 1 September 1944, is reorganized in accordance with T/O & E 18-25, 15 March 1944, with 2 changes, with an authorized strength of thirty-five (35) officers, two (2) warrant officers, and six hundred seven (607) enlisted men.

b. The reorganization of this unit does not affect any existing authorizations for personnel in excess of table of organization strength.

2. a. Additional personnel required to complete the reorganization will be requisitioned in the normal manner. Surplus personnel will be reported to this headquarters for disposition.

b. No enlisted personnel will be reduced in grade as a result of this action.

### 3. Equipment:

a. Additional equipment authorized as a result of reorganization will be requisitioned through normal supply channels.

b. Equipment rendered surplus due to reorganization will be turned in to the nearest appropriate Third U S Army depots.

c. Items of equipment authorized under T/O & E 18-35, dated 1 September 1944, may be temporarily retained as substitutes, when deemed necessary, until such time as the new equipment authorized under T/O & E 18-25, dated 15 March 1944, becomes available. When new equipment is received, substitute items will be turned in as in 3 b, above.

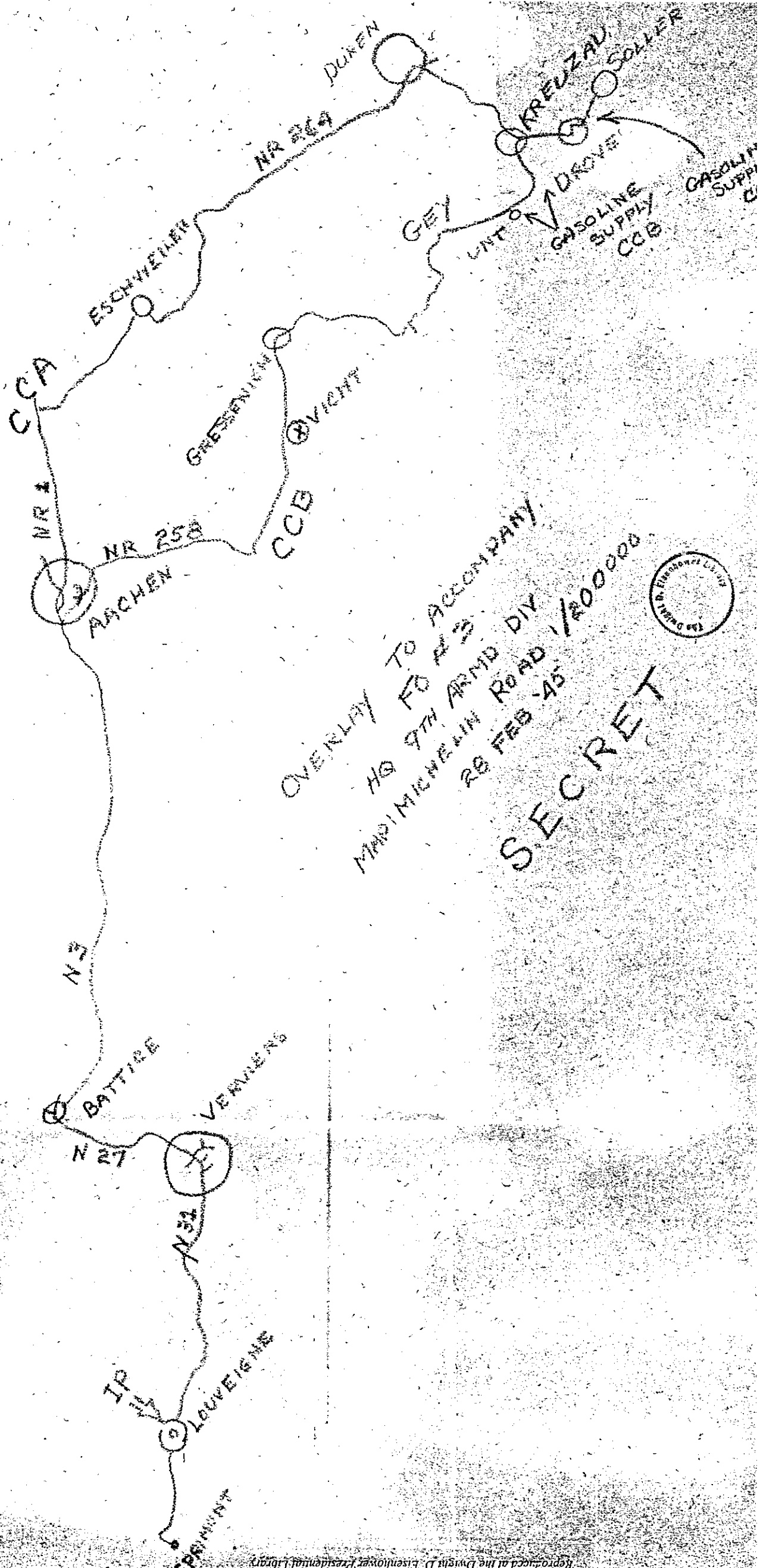

ORDER OF THE DAY



Soldiers of the First, Third, Ninth, and Fifteenth American Armies:

At 1640 hours on April 25, 1945, in the twenty-ninth month of our land war against the German government, American troops of the 12th Army Group joined forces with Soviet elements of Marshal Koniev's First Ukrainian Army Group.

These armies have come to you from the ruins of Stalingrad and Sevastopol--across the scorched cities of the Ukraine. In two years they have smashed 1,400 miles through the German armies to drive the enemy from Russia and pursue him to the Elbe.

Their achievements--and they have given immortality to a people that would not be conquered--are made more meaningful by your own deeds.

Across 3,800 miles of an ocean supply line, you forced a coast the enemy had been years preparing against you. Within four months after landing you destroyed whole armies--to take Paris, free France, and give the world a symbol of freedom. When the enemy raised a new army and threw it into the winter battle of the Ardennes, you smashed it and flung its remnants back. You have beaten and broken down his mighty Siegfried Line. You crossed the Rhine in your stride, encircled and reduced the Ruhr.

While demonstrating new lessons in mobile warfare, you have annihilated whole groups of German armies in the West on their own German soil. In ten months you have fought your way 700 miles from the beaches. These accomplishments were secured by your courage, your resourcefulness, and by your comrades who died to achieve them.

You have shared in the liberation of four nations, given hope to others, and conquered half of Germany.

The people of America, who armed you, have had great faith in you. You have justified that faith as you will in the battles that follow.

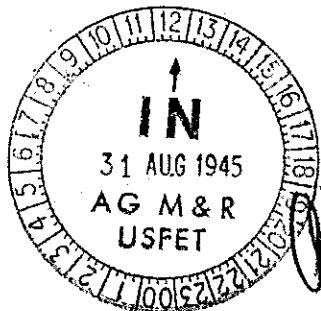

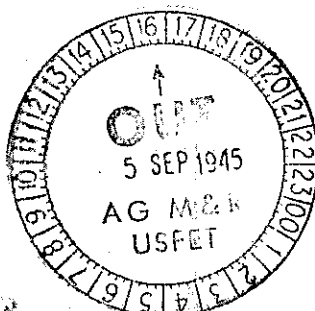

3. Instructions and details regarding the preparation and movement of the above units are contained in Part V, ETO-POM-RED, dated 19 May 1945, unless modified herein, in which case this order will govern.

4. a. A personnel roster will be prepared by each unit on dual mimeograph stencils in the manner prescribed in paragraph 14a, Readjustment Regulations 1-2. Such roster will provide the personnel data required by paragraph 13b of those regulations and in the form indicated in Inclosure No 2 hereto. Two (2) copies of the roster (produced from the No 2 stencils), the No 1 stencils marked "Advance Copy", and two (2) copies of this directive, together with a certified WD AGO Form 66-2, 66-3 or 66-4 for each officer listed, will be furnished by the unit commander to the Commanding General, Theater Service Forces, European Theater (port commander concerned) in such time as will enable dispatch by air

mail or air courier at least five (5) days prior to embarkation. One (1) copy of the rosters (produced from the No 2 stencils), the No 1 stencil marked "Advance Copy" and one (1) copy of this directive will be forwarded to port of debarkation commander concerned. The other documents referred to will be forwarded to The Adjutant General, Attention: Officers Branch (PO-A), Washington 25, D.C. A copy of the corrected personnel roster (produced from the No 2 stencils; corrected as of embarkation), together with additional forms 66-2, 66-3 and 66-4, as necessary, will be furnished to the Commanding General, Theater Service Forces, European Theater (commanding officer of port) for dispatch within twenty-four (24) hours after embarkation by air mail or air courier, to The Adjutant General, Attention: Officers Branch (PO-A), Washington 25, D.C. The No 2 stencils of the personnel rosters and two (2) copies of the roster corrected as of embarkation will be retained by unit commanders and will be corrected aboard ship to agree with the Transport Commander's certified passenger list. The No 2 stencils will be delivered by the unit commanders to the proper authority at the United States port (disposition center). At the appropriate time the No 2 stencils of this directive will be furnished the commanding officer of each unit concerned for delivery to the proper authority at the United States port.

b. Category IV units returned under the provisions of this directive will be processed under Part V, ETO-POM-RED, 19 May 1945, except as provided herein. All enlisted personnel above the critical score who do not possess MOS appearing on the current War Department letter of critical specialists as announced by this headquarters and all personnel returning for discharge as over 38 years of age, and other enlisted personnel being returned for discharge under specific directives other than RRL-1 (for example AR 615-368), will be listed on rosters by Separation Center groups in the manner prescribed in paragraph 130b of ETO-POM-RED. All other enlisted personnel and officer personnel will be listed on rosters by Reception Station groups as prescribed in paragraph 130a of ETO-POM-RED. Identical administrative procedures will be followed for both groups except that personnel rosters for Separation Center groups will bear a heading similar to: "FOR SEPARATION CENTER NUMBER 26, FORT DIX, NEW JERSEY". For these purposes List A of Appendix M, ETO-POM-RED, as amended, will be used and the appropriate Separation Center code designation will be taken from List B, Appendix M, ETO-POM-RED, as amended. It is essential that Separation Center groups be carefully screened to avoid including low-score personnel and personnel with critical MOS, since upon arrival in the United States, these groups will proceed directly to Separation Centers.

c. Instructions contained in paragraphs 147 and 155, as amended by EXT-9002, 8 July 1945, ETO-POM-RED, 19 May 1945, are superseded as set forth in Inclosure No 1 hereto. Model forms for preparation of passenger lists are also attached to Inclosure No 1. Detailed instructions for preparation of personnel rosters are set forth in Inclosure No 2.

5. a. Clothing and Equipment:

(1) Organizational equipment is authorized as prescribed in paragraph 125c, less sub-paragraph (3), ETO-POM-RED, 19 May 1945.

(2) Clothing and individual equipment is authorized as prescribed in columns 5 and 6, Inclosure 1c, Appendix I, Change 5 to ETO-POM-RED, 19 May 1945. Clothing and Equipment accounts will be adjusted in accordance with the C and E Adjustment Form prescribed in Circular 72, War Department, 1945.

(3) All other clothing and equipment (except individually owned items) will be turned in to collecting points designated in Messageform RED-152, 2 September 1945.

b. Prior to turn-in, all equipment will be returned to serviceable condition to the extent possible with available maintenance facilities, and prepared for temporary storage.

c. Unit impedimenta will be packed, tagged and marked as directed in paragraph 127, ETO-POM-RED, 19 May 1945 (sub-paragraphs 35h and 36b are rescinded). Paragraph 127b, ETO-POM-RED, 19 May 1945, is changed to read: "b. The baggage of personnel of the units will be tagged and marked as prescribed in Standard Operating Procedure No 45 (Baggage), Headquarters, European Theater of Operations, US Army, dated 1 July 1945".

d. Paragraph 126e, ETO-POM-RED, 19 May 1945, is changed to read:

"Four (4) copies of the Report of Equipment Authorized for Return (Appendix J) will be prepared by units returning to the United States for demobilization, copies to be distributed as follows:

(1) One (1) copy to Headquarters, US Forces, European Theater, (Rear) (AC of S, G-4), through Staging Area Commander.

(2) One (1) copy to port commander prior to embarkation.

(3) Two (2) copies will be returned to the United States with unit"



6. Shipment RE7368 will be under the control of the Commanding General, Army Service Forces, from time of departure from oversea station until released to proper authority in the United States.

#### 7. Mail:

a. Paragraph 135, ETO-POM-RED, dated 19 May 1945, is rescinded. Postal instructions contained in Section V, ETO-SOP No 17b, subject: "Postal Procedures for Redeployment and Readjustment", dated 9 May 1945, are to be followed.

b. Immediately prior to departure for a staging area the unit commander will prepare a roster in triplicate, in alphabetical order regardless of rank, of personnel transferred from the unit during the preceding sixty (60) days, showing rank, name, serial number, new unit and new APO number. If no personnel transfers were made during this period a negative report will be submitted to that effect. One (1) copy of the roster, or negative report, will be forwarded by official air mail to The Adjutant General, The Army Postal Service, Washington 25, D.C. One (1) copy will be sent by official air mail to the commander of the port of debarkation in the United States, Attention: Port Postal Officer. If the port of debarkation is not known, the roster, or negative report, will be sent to the Commanding General, New York Port of Embarkation, New York, New York, Attention: Port Postal Officer. One (1) copy of the roster or negative report will be delivered to the Assembly Area or other APO postal officer serving the unit.

8. Movement to the Assembly Area Command and to the port will be by rail and/or motor transportation, as provided by the Commanding General, Theater Service Forces, European Theater (Chief of Transportation, US Forces, European Theater).

a. Date of departure of unit from home station.

b. Strength (officer, warrant officer and enlisted men, male and female) to indicate number of each type personnel by color with ASR scores in groups as follows:

44 - 0, all inclusive.

c. Expected time of arrival at Assembly Area.

11. The Commanding General, Theater Service Forces, European Theater (Commanding General, Assembly Area Command) will report by teleprinter to this headquarters and to the commanding officer of the port of embarkation as early as practicable.

b. Strength (officers, warrant officers and enlisted men, male and female) to indicate number of each type personnel by color.

c. Expected time of arrival at port of embarkation.

SUBJECT: Inclosure No. 1 to Movement Directives for Category IV Units returning to the United States from the European Theater for demobilization.

1. ETO-POM-RED, dated 19 May 1945 is amended as indicated below:

"147. PASSENGER LISTS AND FINAL PERSONNEL REPORTS.

Passenger Lists are required for embarkation. It is essential that the lists be prepared accurately and be immediately available upon arrival at the port in order to ensure a rapid and orderly embarkation and an accurate record of the personnel departing.

- a. As near to the embarkation date as practical (not less than five days), each unit or regularly constituted detachment will prepare passenger list stencils precisely in the form illustrated in attached Model Form No. 1.

- b. Deletions from the passenger list stencils will not be made but after copies have been mimeographed personnel transferred from the unit or detachment will be redlined on all copies. Personnel assigned to the unit or detachment after the preparation of the list will be added in red pencil, on all copies.

- c. Fifty (50) copies of the list and a recapitulation of the contents showing the unit serial number, officers, nurses, civilians, females and enlisted men together with a recapitulation of the total number of enlisted personnel above the critical score will be delivered to the port commander upon arrival in the port area.

- d. Army Air Force units will prepare seven (7) copies of final report of AAF personnel (WD AAF Form 127) in every detail except for the insertion of the date, immediately prior to departure from the port. Passenger List will be attached to the two final personnel reports. Final personnel reports are to be prepared on each separate coded unit, even though the coded unit be a squadron within a group. These final reports will be taken to the port and delivered at the time of embarkation to the AAF Statistical Control Officer on duty there.

- e. All action by AAF units in sub-paragraphs a through d above will be accomplished at the unit station immediately prior to departure for the staging area by AAF units stationed in the United Kingdom and those stationed on the continent which by-pass the Assembly Area."

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PREPARING PERSONNEL ROSTER: (SEE MODEL FORM ATTACHED)

1. Where SEPARATION CENTER groups are formed, instead of RECEPTION STATION groups, follow the same forms and procedure, except that in lieu of "FOR RECEPTION STATION AND RECEPTION STATION CODE NUMBERS", use the heading: "FOR SEPARATION CENTER NO. 26 FORT DIX, NEW JERSEY", taking the Separation Center code number from list B, Annex "N", C-1, ETO-FOL-RED, dated 8 June 1945.
2. The physical lay-out of the roster must be exactly as shown in the model form.
3. The heading of the roster must contain the words "Personnel Roster", the unit designation and the unit shipment number as shown in the model.
4. On the No. 1 (unused) stencil only, type the words "advance copy" immediately above "Personnel Roster".
5. Repeat the heading in full on each page exactly the same as the first page.
6. Below the heading on each page show the Reception Station to which the unit is being sent. The proper Reception Station must be determined from paragraph 4, Change 1 to ETO-SOP No. 61, 8 June 1945.
7. The headings, name, grade and arm or service, ASN, Company, MOS number, ASR Score and address are to be shown on each page of the roster in exactly the same order as shown.
8. Name: For all names, both officers and enlisted men, show the last name first, in capital letters; first name last in small letters.
9. Grade and/or Arm or Service: Show the grade and immediately below it show the arm or service of both officers and enlisted men.
10. Address: Show both the street address and immediately below it, the city and state. The address of personnel on the roster must be within the geographical area served by the Reception Station shown at the top of the roster.
11. The pages are to be serially numbered at the bottom of each page even though the roster may consist of only one page.
12. Use 8" x 13" paper only in reproducing rosters.
13. Use one side of the paper only in reproducing roster.

Report of Period 1 Jan 45 to 20 Sept 45

This unit started the year in defensive positions along the Siegfried Switch. The firing companies with their attached medical soldiers were scattered over a front of about 20 miles. Three medical soldiers were with each company divided two men with the forward firing platoons and one man with a 1/2 ton litter truck remaining with the company headquarters. The Battalion Aid Station remained with the Battalion forward echelon and was located approximately 1/2 miles to rear of left flank company. Casualties are few and sick call held by Bn. Surgeon traveling to the farther companies daily as much as possible. One aid man was with the Bn. rear echelon located about 3 miles behind the forward echelon.

During the first week in January the 94th Inf. Division moved into the area and the Bn. became attached to them.

Due to a change in the T/O of the unit, the Dental Officer was transferred to another unit. At the time of his transfer the dental service was functioning well and a greater part of the Bn. was in Dental Class IV. Following this there was considerable difficulty in getting dental work done. Arrangements finally being made with the Medical Bn. of the 94th Inf. to take a few men per day. Following a severe siege of trench mouth the Bn. was surveyed and energetically with cooperation of dental officer of the 1st Inf. Divisions 26th Regiment.

After a short period of about a month of patrol action and minor skirmishes a drive began to take the Saar Moselle triangle. This was successfully completed the Bn. forward and Aid Station moving long close behind the firing companies. The Aid Station was set up for about 3 days in Kollersleuken and then for about 2 weeks in Saarburg. During this latter period the firing companies and their attached medics, one per platoon were in defensive position on the east side of the Saar River. A counter attack by the German forces developed during this time and isolated two of the platoons for two days. During this action the fighting was heavy; but except for three fatalities the casualties were light and not serious. For coolness and bravery under fire and in emergency one aid man was awarded the Silver Star and another aid man was awarded the Bronze Star.

Following this action and the taking of Trier the Bn. was converted into a Self-propelled Bn. with M-36 T.D.'s. During the conversion the Bn. started with the 94th Inf. Div. on the push to the Rhine River. This scattered the Bn. considerable and one company stayed behind until the Rhine was reached. Medical peeps travelled with each of two companies on two different routes most of the time out of contact with the Bn. Aid Station. In spite of many efforts to maintain contact the company medical soldiers could have had to evacuate casualties to infantry Aid Stations direct. Fortunately there were only minor cuts and bruises encountered all of which were ably treated by attached medical men.

After the taking of Ludwigshafen and a short rest the Bn. along with the 94th Inf. Div. was moved to control of 15th Army and after a two day road march moved into positions to fire into the Ruhr pocket.

After collapse of Ruhr pocket the Bn. took up Military Government duties in the Kreis of Ratingen. Medical Detachment undertook management of the medical service of 3 D.P. camps and one large hospital which was cleared for use of D.P.s for entire Bezirk of Dusseldorf Mettmann. At the largest camp, which contained Russian D.P.s were stationed two medical soldiers with an ambulance. They acted as medical liaison between the three Russian Doctors in the camp and the American Commandant. They also took care of the evacuation of serious illness and casualty from the camp to the D.P. hospital. Two other medical men were stationed in an Italian D.P. camp of about 400. They helped a local German Doctor with sick call and transported emergencies to hospital. One other medical man was stationed in a third camp of Russians.

When the Bn. first took control of this third camp it was a Typhus isolation camp. In a short period of a couple of weeks the camp was cleared and all sick typhus cases moved to a typhus hospital in Dusseldorf. Camp was thoroughly scrubbed, cleaned and disinfected and Russians moved in.

Bn. Aid Station group managed sick call for the Bn., inspection and control of medical and sanitary facilities of the D.P. installations; procured and issued medical supplies for the use of D.P.s.

On June 15th these missions were all taken over by a British unit and the Bn. moved to Zdikov, Czechoslovakia. Here the mission was border patrols accomplished by a few men. The remainder of the Bn. including the Medical Detachment conducted training. It was here that redeployment began and the Medical Detachment lost one man.

During the last week in July the Bn. moved to Windshiem, Germany, under 1st Inf. Div. where training continued. The detachment gained two men here.

Two weeks later the Bn. moved to Nurnberg, Germany to take over control of the Nurnberg, Stadium and sports arena. Training ceased as all men were needed to work to prepare for coming track and swimming meets. While in this area the detachment redeployed another man and also received another man.

About the 5th of September the detachment redeployed all but four of its men. Following this the units category was changed to four and the detachment received almost a complete complement from 629th TD Bn. Other medical men were also received from other units to bring unit strength up to 23 at present date for return to the United States.
