I -- AVARD CF-EBONZE STAR MEDAL. Under the provisions of Army Regulations 500-45, 22 September 1943, as Smended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to following named individuals:

Technical Sergeant Roald L. Knien, 6575867, Field Artillery, Headcuarters and Headquarters Company, 776th Tank Destroyer Battalion. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from March 1943 to 8 May 1945, in North Africa, Italy, France, Germany and Austria. Residence: Everett, Washington.

Technician Fifth Grade Fatrick H. Catalan, 37447550, Medical Departmont, Nedical Detachment, Allth Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action. On 20 March 1945, near Nieder Schlettenbach, Germany, Technician Cofalan, working in the aid station supporting attacking troops, was delivered a seriously wounded officer who needed immediate evacuation. To evacuate the wounded man necessitated crossing an area under aniper fire. Technician Cahalan, with the assistance of one other soldier, braved the sniper fire and succeeded in reaching medical treatment with the wounded officer. Technician Cahalan's actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Rockwelly Town.

CAPTAIN STANLEY H. SAMM, 0552849, Medical Corps, Medical Detachment, 409th Infantry Regiment. For moritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 9 November 1944 to 8 May 1945, in France, Germany and Austria. Residence: Brooklyn, New York.

Private First Class Lloyd J. Brown, 32762382, Infantry, Headquarters Company, Third Bettalion, 409th Infantry Regiment. For heroic achievement in action. On 29 Jamery 1945, near Ubersch, France, Private Brown had lod his combat patrol to a friendly outpost house after completing a mission when a barrage of mortar and direct artillary fire struck the building, causing six casualties. Solisting the aid of seven men, Private Brown improvised a litter from two cumbersons bed springs and led the men in carrying two of the seriously wounded 1200 yards through the hostile fire ever an open road. Upon arriving at a foot bridge, the intensity of the fire forced the men to cover. On his mode and knees, Frivate Brown pushed the litter across the foot bridge and these continued on with the aid of the men. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Newark, New Jersey.

On 15 March 1945, near Schillersdorf, Prince, Inivato Mettling, observing a track loaded with animanition with a tire punctured by artillery and portar fire, left his place of cover and rushed to the vehicle. Although the truck was ackin struck by energine, he changed tires and then drove the vehicle to cover. Trivate Mettling's actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Steelton, Jenneylwania.

Staff Gergeant Ascede A Barroll, "157377, Armored, Company "P", 7-1st Tank Satislion. For hervien in action. On 25 January 1965, Sergeant Burrell placed the tanks of his plateon in corefully selected resitions from which fire could be effectively delivered on Bahlbausen, Frier, Seeing a column of about 100 SS troops, he ordered his tanks to oren fire, inflicting same energy essablies and forcing the remainder to utberraw. On 26 January 1965, Sergeant Burrell offsetively supported attacking infentry troops in contring the town of Schillerstorf, France. His ladership and calm efficiency is leated the hig est traditions of the military survice. Residence: Boston, 1 1986chusetts.

CAPTAIN JARNE D. MINBERLY, 01296135, Infantry, Pandquarters, Second Battalion, A09th Infantry Regiment. For meritorious service in connection with military openations spainat the enony from 6 January to 8 May 1945, in France, Germany and Austria. Residence: Gulfport, Mississippi.

As he expended his daminition, he was pinned down by machine gan fire from the tanks. Frivate distoche's actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Detroit, Michigan.

SECOND LIEITENANT ARTHUR L. CORLEY, C2014332, (then Master Serveant), Infantry, Ecadquarters Company, Allth Infantry Regiment. For maritorious service in connection with military operations against the eneny from 19 November 1944 to 13 April 1945, in France and Germany. Realdence: Kansas City, Missouri.

Private First Class Paul N. Moffman, 33235142, Infantry, Company "M", 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroic achievement in action. On 20 January 1945, near Sessenheim, Frence, when elements of the Third Battalion net stiff resistance and were sustaining heavy casualties from artillery, mortar and mall arns fire, a cell for additional unmunition was made. Frivate Hoffman, on his own initiative, left his position of cover and, disregarding the enemy fire, ran 300 yards across an open field and then walked five miles to the nearest company vehicles. Joading a one cuarter ton vehicle



On 21 Jamary 1945, near Sestenheim, France, Private Stanley, with one other man, 1 crossed 600 yards of open terrain under heavy machine gun fire to reach the side of several communities. After administering aid, he assisted in placing a wounded man on a litter and carrying him 1000 yards to the safety of a woods where he was evacuated. Private Stanley then mide three more trins across the fire event terrain to evacuate additional wounded men. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Canton, Ohto.

Private First Class William J. Sauer Wind, 36717-369, Infantry, Company "M", Allth Infantry Legiment. For hereic achievement in action. On 3 Describer 1944, near Ebersheim, France, when communication lines were severed between a forward theoremic post and a mortar observation post. Frivate Sauerland noved forward to repair the breaks. ^Disregarding artillery, mortar and small arms fire, he made his way a distance of UCO yrds ressiring the breaks. Observing eight, heavily ammed, energy soldiers approaching, he coered fire, killing two, wounding four and forcing the remainder to withdraw. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the militury service. Residence: Arlington Heights, Filinois.

-SSCOND LIGHTMANT R. MAILTON "RIGHT, 02005992, Infantry, Company "G", 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroic schievement in action. On 15 March 1945, near lingwiller, France, when an adjacent company was halted By mortar and machine gun fire, LIGUTENNT "RIGHT led his plateon in a flanking novement against the enemy positions. The plateon, under his leadership, captured ton of the enemy and enabled an inglated group to rejoin its company. Directing the withdrawal of his plateon, he remained alone, directing artillery fire to cover their withdrawal. K.s actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Austir, Texas.

Sargeant John Gomola, 36548539, Infantry, Commany "H", Allth Infantry Regiment. For heroic achievement in action. Co I December 1544, near Ebersheim, France, Sergeant Gomola voluntarily crossed 200 yerds of open terrain under artillary, mortar and small arms fire to act as flank security against an anticipated counterattack. Reaching a position, he observed a squad of twelve, neuvily anned, energy soldiers approaching. Helding his fire until they were within 25 yards, he fired a bazooka, killing three, wounding two, and forcing the remainder of the energy soldiers to flee. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Acokwood, sichigan.

Staff Sergeant Roymond T. Grantland, 3331733, Infantry, Company "M", 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroic achievement in action. On 19 January 1945, mear Sessenheim, France, when mortar support was needed for an attacking battalion, Sergeant Grantland established an observation post close to

Sergeant Engens 2. MeFheeters, 34.867974, (then Private First Class), Infantry, Company "K", Allth Infantry Regiment. For heroic a chievement in action. On 15 March 1945, near Muhlhausen, France, when the communications sergeant was wounded by a mine and his radio was left in a mined area, Sergeant McFheeters attempted to some the radio. Contiously entering the mine field and, despite sniper fire, he secured the radio. Returning to the company, he maintained communications with adjacent units embling a coordinated attack to be made. His actions reflected, the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Cleveland, Tannessee.

. Tochnical Surgeant Konneth L. Shafer, 37541925, (then Staff Sergeant), Infantry, Company """, 411th Infantry Regiment. On 16 November 1944, near Les Mortrics, France, when Company "F", was subjected to artillery, mortar and small arms fire it suffered several casualtics. Sergeant Shafer, socing two wounded men lying in an exposed position, crawled 200 sards over open terrain and, disregarding the energy fire, administered aid. He then evacusted the two casualties to safety. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Mintyre, North Dakota.

Technical Sergeant Hrvin C. Hartman, 36283867, Infantry, Headquarters Company, Third Enttalion, 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action. On 19 March 1945, near Bobential, Germany, when the third battalion was held up by mortar, so 11 arms and machine gun fire, and a readblock prevented tarks from supporting the troops, Sergeant Hartwan moved forward to blow up the obstacle. Carrying 25 pounds of dynamite, he crawled 100 yerds under the hostile fire, set his charges, and blow up the readblock. His actions, which enabled the tanks to move forward in support, reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Medford, Misconsin.

FIRST LIEUTEMART ESSIN P. SCOTT, JR., 0545475, Infantry, Headquarters Company, First Bittalion, 411th Infantry Regiment. For meritorious service in connection with military operations against the enemy from 23 November 1944 to 6 May 1945, in France, Germany and Austria. Residence: Atlanta, Georgia.

Starf Sergeant Franklin D. Hobbins, 191;3172, Infantry, Company "B", 411th Infantry Regiment. For hereic achievement in action. On 16 March 1945, note Cumbrecht shoffen, France, Sergeant Robbins volunteered to establish a bridgehead over a river. Although subjected to heavy sniper fire, he comtinued working until the task was completed. Placing his men in strategic positions, he then evered the advance of the recommissance, stud. Then heavy energy fire endangered the entit's percentaissance stud. Sorgeant Robbins remained in an exposed position, laying down evering fire until the squad

Private First Class John E. Prieston, 12087286, Infantry, Anti-Tank Company, 411th Infantry Hegi ent. For haroic achievement in action. On 21 April 1945, near Mirchheim, Germany, a motorized task force was subjected to intense enony fire and an anti-tank prime mover was struck and immobilized. Without heditation and despite the intense enony fire, Frivate Prieston disengaged the 57nm gan from the prime mover. "Aced the gam in position and opened fire on the enemy. He continued is a until & direct hit on his gan forced it out of action. Private Prieston's actions drew the larger part of the enemy fire on his position and enabled other mombers of the task force to take cover. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Bronx, New York.

Private First Class John L. Usehlbec, 35531134, Infantry, Company "F"; 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroic achievement in action. On 4 May 1945, near Meningen, Germany, Private Usehlbec, a FMR man, was particlepting in a company attack when the entire company was planed down by intense enemy machine an fire. Despite enemy observation and the intense fire, Private Usehlbec crawled over 100 yards to within 75 yards of the enemy positions. He then opened fire, effectively allencing the enemy weapon, killing two and capturing five of the enemy. Private Usehlbec's actions were in accordance with the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Cleveland,Ohio.

SECOND 112772 MT JANDE P. MC MEE, 02011583, Infantry, Company ME, 411th Infantry Regiment, (then Technical Sergeant). For heroic schiercment in action. On 13 February 1965, near Muhlhamsen, France, LIETTENANT MC KWE was leading a combat petrol with the mission of obtaining information of energy setion then the petrol was subjucted to intense energy fire. Skillfully leading his petrol to safety, he then returned to recove a man who had been seriously wounded by a mine. Although under direct energy observation and intense fire, LIETTENANT MC KWE carried the bounded men over 150 yards to. a position of safety. Continuing his mission, he secured valuable information concerning energy positions, strength and supporting sepons. LIETTENANT MC KKE's actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Ridgely, Tennessee.

Private Pirst Class John V. Rauseo, 11131726, Infantry, Company, "P", Allth Infantry Regiment, For heroic schievement in action. On 24 Novaber 1944, near St Die, France, Frivate Rauseo, as lead scout for the point, moved forward despite almost constant small arms fire. Surprising eight energy soldiers, he engaged them in a fire flight and held thus pinned down until o ther men of his company assisted in their capture. Continuing on, he engaged three more of the energy, wounding one and copturing all three. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Again moving through the hestile fire, he secured litter bearers for the men. After sup a vising the evacuation of the wounded nen, CAPTAIN "ADLE returned to the company, reorganized it, and then continued the attack. His actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Adrian, Finnesots.

Staff Sergeant Devid L. Feiser, 37245366; Infentry, Company 'B" 411th Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action. On 19 Worch 1945, near Sobenthel, Germany, then his platoon encountered intense fire from an enery fisk gun, Sergeant Feiser Led the men to cover, and moved forward alone to locate the man. Advancing 300 yards and locating the position of the gun, he returned, organized his platoon and, directing effective fire, adlenced the gun and killed three of the enery. Sergeant Feiser's actions reflected the highest traditions of the military service. Residence: Gansas City, Missouri.

Private First Class Charles H. Lockhart, 180/1532, Infantry, Company "E", Allth Infantry Regiment. For heroism in action. On 16 Harch 1945, near Sinewiller, France, when his platoon was sut off from the company by intense fire, Frivate Lockhart organized a three man patrol and want in search of the company. Encountering about 50 of the encay coming in their direction, he ordered his new to cover and, graving forward 50 yards, held off the enemy, killing three and wounding several others. CATTAIN PREDERICT B. D'BA'D, Ol030655, Cavalry, 1036 Reconnaissance Troop. For callantry in action. On 24 April 1545, CUTIT' D'BA'D organized a reconnaissance force of two scene cars and two light tracks and led his men sheed of a task force into inhelinger, Gerwany. Although subjected to small arms and machine gan fire, he continued on into the heart of the city, estering the enemy by surprise.
