

History of the 795th Tank Destroyer Battalion Fort Custer, Michigan December 16, 1941-December 31, 1942

1. Original Unit

a. Designation: date, place and authorities for organization:

The 795th Tank Destroyer Battalion, Heavy, Self-Propelled, was activated and organized on December 16, 1941, at Fort Custer, Michigan, by order of the Secretary of War and under the direction and supervision, respectively, of the Commanding Generals, Second Army, Memphis, Tennessee and 5th Infantry Division, Fort Custer, Michigan.

b. Sources of Personnel

The original officer and enlisted personnel of the organization was obtained by transfer (Auth: Paragraphs 4b and 7, Letter, Headquarters Second Army, Office of the Commanding General, AG 322.09-16 (F), December 10, 1941, subject, Organization of Tank Destroyer Battalions. Letter, Headquarters 5th Infantry Division, Fort Custer, Michigan, 322.6, December 16, 1941, subject, Activation of the 795th Tank Destroyer Battalion. Paragraphs 1, 2, 9, 10, Special Orders No. 234, Headquarters 5th Infantry Division, December 16, 1941.) from the Anti-tank Batteries of the First and Second Battalions, 184th Field Artillery Regiment, Fort Custer, Michigan, the latter organizations having been inactivated on December 15, 1941. pursuant to paragraph 2, General Orders No. 33, (Corrected Copy), Headquarters Fifth Infantry Division, Fort Custer, Michigan.

a. Change in designation


The official designation of the organization was changed as of June 25, 1942 as follows:

b. Table of Organization Changes


Table of Organization 18-25, War Department, December 24, 1941, provided for an officer strength of thirty-five (35) officers and an enlisted strength of 884, including an enlisted cadre of seventy-seven. By Table of Organization 1825, War Department, June 8, 1942, the authorized officer strength was increased to thirty-eight (38), the most significant change being the authorization of a dental officer. By the same directive the authorized enlisted strength was increased to 933, including an enlisted cadre of seventy-seven.

c. Other Changes.

The battalion was selected on October 2, 1942 to operate a Tank Destroyer Enlisted Replacement Pool pending the establishment, early in 1943, of a permanent tank destroyer replacement depot. A total overstrength of 55-1/3 percent of table of organization strength was authorized for this purpose. 

4. Stations

The permanent station of the organization since its activation has been Fort Custer, Michigan. During the period July 20, 1942 - July 29, 1942, inclusive, the battalien was temporarily stationed, for firing and tactical exercises, at Camp Grayling, Michigan. 

Paragraph 5, Special Orders No. 194, Headquarters Fort Custer,

Michigan, July 17, 1942.)
(2) Length of March: 456 miles (total)

(3) Points between which marched, with dates: From Fort Custer, Michigan - 0600 July 20, 1942 (departure) To Camp Grayling, Michigan - 1525 July 20, 1942 (arrival) From Camp Grayling, Mich. - 0600 July 29, 1942 (departure) To Fort Custer, Michigan - 1725 July 29, 1942 (arrival)

Shield: Vert, a rhinoceros passant argent, armed or,

incensed proper.

Crest: None.

Motto: Res Mortis Delemus (Tanks, We Destroy)

DESCRIPTION

The 795th Tank Destroyer Battalion, Heavy (SP), was constituted pursuant to instructions contained in letter from the War Department, AG 320.2 (11-17-41), dated 3 December, 1941, the Battalion being made active at Fort Custer, Michigan, 16 December, 1941. It has no other history and is entitled to no battle honors.

The shield is green and white, the colors of the Armored Forces. The infuriated charging rhinoceros is symbolical of great ferocity when aroused and, in defense of itself or its fellows, will fight at all odds. The armored animal embodies the characteristics and objectives of the organization, that of destroying tanks, in that it is the most difficult of all animals to stop after charging. The golden horn is representative of its supreme piercing qualities.

SUPPLEMENT

History of the 795th Tank Destroyer Eattalion Fort Custer, Michigan

December 31, 1942 - February 28, 1943

1. Organizational Changes

a. Termination of Replacement Pool Status

The status of the organization as an Adjutant General's Tank Destroyer Enlisted Replacement Pool ended as of midnight, January 31, 1943. (Authority: Telegram, The Adjutant General, War Department, Washington, February 1, 1943.)

b. Change in Headquarters Assignment

The battalion was assigned to Second Army effective February 15, 1943 per Letter, Army Ground Forces dated February 1, 1943, being released thereby from General Headquarters Reserve, Army Ground Forces. (Authority: Letter, Headquarters Second Army, AG 322-12 (GNMBF), February 13, 1943, subject, Status of Units (Serial No. 2, cs). Previous attachment to Headquarters XI Corps was continued.
