

18 to 20 Jul 44. Maintenance, clearing of equipment and resting were accomplished at this time.

19 Jul 44. The 4th Division was re-attached to VII Corps.

21 Jul 44. The companies were assigned to their respective FA Battalions for the purpose of supporting fires. Due to inclement weather and limited visibility the attack did not go as planned.

24 Jul 44. The code-name for the attack was given. "A" and "B" companies remained in their secondary mission while "C" company reverted to Battalion control for anti-tank missions.

25 to 31 Jul 44. The three(3) companies protected the rear and left flank of Division on its move forward. One(1) company was used throughout this phase in a mobile reserve position. Reconnoitered routes and positions were made to the rear and flanks of the other companies. The reconnaissance platoons established outposts and patrols to the front and flanks of the forward companies.
