AFTER ACTION REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH 1945

I SUMMARY OF OPERATIONS

- 1. Continued PHASE IX: The Drive to the North and East from Julich.
- a. During the period, I March 1945 to 31 March 1945, the 821st Tank Destroyer Battalion remained attached to the 29th Division Artillery.
- (1) At the beginning of the period, 1 March 1945, elements of the 821st Tank Destroyer Battalion were employed in the Division zone as follows.
- (a) Company MAN was in assembly position, in Division reserve, in the vicinity of Otzenrath, map coordinates 110755.
- (b) The 1st and 2nd Platoons of Company "B" were in direct fire positions in the vicinity of Wast, map coordinates 130835. The 3rd Platoon of Company "B" was in direct fire position in the vicinity of Sasserath, map coordinates 110810.
- (c) The 1st Platoon of Company "C" was in direct fire position in the vicinity of Wanlo, map coordinates 075785. The 2nd and 3rd Platoons were in direct fire positions in the vicinity of Gudderath, map coordinates 095815.
- (d) The 1st Reconnaissance Platoon was with the 1st and 2nd Platoons of Co $^{\rm HBH}$, the 2nd Reconnaissance Platoon was with the 2nd and 3rd Platoons of Co $^{\rm HCH}$ and the 3rd Reconnaissance Platoon was with Company $^{\rm HAH}$.
- b. On 1 March 1945 the 29th Infantry Division continued to advance and attacked to complete the reduction and occupation of Munchen Gladbach. Riements of the 821st Tank Destroyer Battalion continued to advance with elements of the 29th Infantry Division.
- (1) Company "B" was in general support of the 116th Infantry Regiment. Company "B" is Destroyer Platoons moved forward with the 116th Infantry Regiment to the vicinity of Korschenbroich, map coordinates 145888. The 3rd Platoon took up defensive positions in Kerschenbroich and remained there until relieved of their operational mission. The 1st and 2nd Platoons advanced to the vicinity of Hersbroich, map coordinates 142905 and remained there until relieved of their operational mission.

- (2) Company "C" was in general support of the 175th Infantry Regiment. Company "C" is Destroyer Platoons moved forward with the 175th Infantry Regiment, the 1st Platoon to the vicinity of Dahl, map coordinates 088878, where it remained until relieved of its operational mission; the 2nd and 3rd Platoons to the vicinity north of Munchen Gladbach, map coordinates 105905, where they remained until relieved of their operational missions.
- (3) Company "A", as Division reserve, followed close behind the attacking elements and remained in a position of readiness for immediate employment.
- (4) Reconnaissance Platoons moved with the forward elements of the companies to which they were attached.
- c. On 2 March 1945 the 2nd Armored Division, on the right and the XIII Corps, on the left, closed in on the 29th Division front to pinch off the Division and relieve it of its operational mission.
- d. At 1430 hours, 2 March 1945, all elements of the Battalion were relieved of their operational missions. The Battalion immediately went into an assembly area in the vicinity of Giesenkerchen, map coordinates 1385, for a period of rehabilitation. The Battalion remained in the rehabilitation area from 2 March 1945 to 31 March 1945.
- (1) During the period 2 March 1945 to 31 March 1945 the Battalion engaged in intensive training in preparation for offensive action. Vehicles and equipment were maintained for immediate employment.
- e. On 31 March 1945, the Battalion moved, by administrative motor march, from the rehabilitation area in the vicinity of Giesenkerchen, map coordinates 1385, to an assembly area in the vicinity of Mollen, map coordinates 275322. The Battalion was in assembly position, in this area, at the close of the period, 31 March 1945.


