AWARD OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL

By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded by the Commanding General to the following for heroic achievement:

GUY W. ADAMS, 02006055, Second Lieutenant, Infantry, Company "A", *** Infantry Regiment, for heroic achievement in action on 24 February 1945, in the vicinity of Kleinblittersdorf, Germany. During movement preparatory to attack, Lieutenant Adams' platoon came under enemy mortar, artillery and small arms fire. They immediately sought cover in an area which was heavily mined. With utter disregard for personal safety, Lieutenant Adams mustered his men and evacuated the area to reorganize and continue the attack. Due to his personal supervision and control throughout the encounter, the platoon was able to by-pass the area and continue on its mission. Entered military service from Miami, Florida.

MORSE G. ARCHER, 17036815, Staff Sergeant, Medical Department, Medical Detachment, *** Infantry Regiment, for heroic achievement in action on 16 February 1945, in the vicinity of Hanweiler, Germany. Sergeant Archer crossed the Saar River in an assault boat with the platoon to which he was attached. He helped with the treatment and evacuation of the wounded, carrying them to a point of safety although continuously exposed to intense enemy machine gun and mortar fire. His outstanding heroism and utter disregard for personal safety while treating the wounded reflect great credit upon the Medical Corps. Entered military service from Menomonie, Wisconsin.

WILBUR S. BROWN, 01031060, First Lieutenant, Infantry, Company "B", *** Infantry Regiment, for heroic achievement in action on 24 February 1945, in the vicinity of Bubingen, Germany. Although Lieutenant Brown was not expected to join his company on the attack on Bubingen, he did so. During the attack, several men were wounded and Lieutenant Brown personally secured medical aid men to care for them. He then marched thirty prisoners to the rear, thus relieving the company so that it could proceed unhindered. When this mission was accomplished, he safely guided a one-quarter ton truck loaded with ammunition to his company by walking in front of it searching for mines. Entered military service from Cincinnati, Ohio.

CHARLES H. CHAVES, 31372023, Technician Fifth Grade (then Private First Class), Medical Department, Medical Detachment, *** Infantry Regiment, for heroic achievement in action on 4 January 1945, in the vicinity of Gros Rederching, France. Technician Fifth Grade Chaves, an aid man attached to the third platoon of Company "K", moved across exposed terrain in the midst of a barrage of German artillery and mortar fire to care for three men hit by shell fragments. This act was performed while the remainder of the company was pinned down and before the barrage lifted. Entered military service from New Bedford, Massachusetts.

ROLAND L. COUTURE, 20148994, Private First Class, Infantry, Company "C", *** Infantry Regiment, for heroic achievement in action on 18 February 1945, in the vicinity of Hanweiler, Germany. Private First Class Couture, alone and with utter disregard for his personal safety, investigated smoke emitting from a building in an area previously cleared of the enemy and returned with two prisoners. Later, he removed eight German booby traps from the body of a deceased American soldier, thereby saving the lives of a burial group. Entered military service from Springvale, Maine.

PAUL CULBRETH, 34679126, Staff Sergeant, Infantry, Company "B", *** Infantry Regiment, for heroic achievement in action on 24 February 1945, in the vicinity of Bubingen, Germany. Sergeant Culbreth led his squad against an enemy machine gun which was holding up the advance of his platoon. Working under direct machine gun and mortar fire and with utter disregard for personal safety, he directed fire on the machine gun position, inflicting wounds on one enemy and causing other enemy to surrender. Sergeant Culbreth's action was responsible for the progress of his platoon. Entered military service from Fayetteville, North Carolina.

→ RALPH DERRICK, 36377426, Sergeant (then Private), Field Artillery, Company "A", *** Tank Destroyer Battalion, for heroic achievement in action on 7 March 1945, in the vicinity of Fechingen, Germany. Sergeant Derrick, who had been assigned the mission of expelling the enemy from a strongly fortified position, without regard for personal safety, remained alone with the gunner after ordering his men to take cover in anticipation of return fire. The fire they placed on a house caused an immense explosion, indicating it to have been an ammunition dump. Murderous bursts of enemy fire wounded one of the men ordered to take cover in the rear, but between the bursts, Sergeant Derrick and his gunner managed to fire a total of sixty rounds. Under heavy fire, he and the gunner returned and removed the breech block, rendering the gun unserviceable to the enemy. Entered military service from Converse, Louisiana.



I. AWARD OF THE FIRST OAK LEAF CLUSTER TO THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL - By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the First Oak Leaf Cluster to the Bronze Star Medal is awarded to the following for heroic achievement:

JOSEPH S. DELANEY, 33795093, Technician Fifth Grade, Field Artillery, Headquarters Battery, 863d Field Artillery Battalion, for heroic achievement in action on 16 March 1945, in the vicinity of Ensheim, Germany. When wire communication between the battalion command post and the liaison section was destroyed by enemy fire, Technician Fifth Grade Delaney, member of a wire crew, assisted in attempting to repair the line under severe enemy artillery fire. Unable to successfully repair the line, Technician Fifth Grade Delaney, with utter disregard for personal safety, assisted in laying a new line by vehicle, establishing a communication link between the infantry forward observers and battalion command post at a most critical time. Entered military service from Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

II. AWARD OF THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL - By direction of the President, under the provisions of Army Regulations 600-45, 22 September 1943, as amended, the Bronze Star Medal is awarded by the Commanding General to the following for heroic achievement:

VICTOR A. COWDELL, 39140524, Sergeant (then Private First Class), Infantry, Company "B", 253d Infantry Regiment, for heroic achievement in action on 5 March 1945, in the vicinity of Sarreguemines, France. In an attack, Sergeant Cowdell was squad leader of a light machine gun squad. He expertly placed his squad in advantageous positions to give supporting fire which enabled his company to repulse an enemy counter-attack and take its objective. Entered military service from Redwood City, California.

CHARLES T. NUGENT, 0516640, First Lieutenant, Field Artillery, Battery "B", 863d Field Artillery Battalion, for heroic achievement in action on 16 March 1945, in the vicinity of Ommerheim, Germany. As forward observer during an infantry attack on a row of pillboxes, Lieutenant Nugent, under heavy machine gun and rifle fire, moved to the trenches surrounding the pillboxes and assisted in directing effective fire on enemy strongpoints. He also exposed himself fearlessly to assist in removing wounded men to trenches. His actions were a great inspiration to all who observed him. Entered military service from Indianapolis, Indiana.

STANLEY M. ZOLL, 36676390, Corporal, Field Artillery, Battery "B", 863d Field Artillery Battalion, for heroic achievement in action on 16 March 1945, in the vicinity of Ommersheim, Germany. While with a forward observer section during an infantry attack on a row of pillboxes, Corporal Zoll, under heavy machine gun and rifle fire, moved to the trenches surrounding the pillboxes and assisted in directing effective fire on enemy strongpoints. He also exposed himself fearlessly to assist in removing wounded men to trenches. Corporal Zoll's actions reflect great credit upon himself and are commensurate with the finest traditions of the military service. Entered military service from Allegan, Michigan.
