Lt LEE received report from civilians at SANTA DOMINGO that 10 Japs were 300 yards E of the town. Lt LEE and 10 guerrillas made an investigation but found no definite evidence of Japs.

2. Maximo Gonzales was picked up by Co A patrol in RIZAL on charges of harrassing the civilians. Prisoner was turned over to CIC, CABANATUAN.

Co A Patrol at LICAB confiscated 1 carbine, cal. .30, serial no. 3456830 from Filipino laborer, Pedro Layog, who got the gun at SANTA FE.

1. Enemy Action and Countermeasures -

Co A patrol at LUPAO received a report that 6 Japs were in the area. Patrol investigated and contacted 3 Japs at 1530 approximately 9 kilometers (0878.9-1921.5) east of LUPAO. The patrol opened fire and killed one Jap - two Japs escaped.

Dead Jap was armed with a rifle cal. .25 (Jap). His body appeared to be well fed and his uniform is believed to be that of a Japanese Naval Marine Officer. In his possession were found maps, overlays, unidentified papers, and one small booklet, all of which were written in Japanese and are attached with this report.

1. Enemy Action and Countermeasures -

At 0950 civilians brought 1 Jap prisoner to Co A Det Hq, RIZAL. Civilians said they had captured the Jap in the barrioc of SICIONG (0909.0-1884.5) and that two additional Japs had escaped.

The Jap was dressed in dirty shantung pants and shirt, armed with U.S. pistol cal. .45 Colt w/o ammunition, was in good physical condition and had in his possession several papers typed in English that appeared to be passes and permits to carry arms previously issued to Guerrillas.

Papers and Jap were turned over to 775th Tk Bn 1700.

Patrol was dispatched 1000 to check remaining two Japs. No contact or evidence of Japs observed.

Arrangements have been made to send mounted patrols daily from RIZAL to UMINGAN.

2. Record of Events - friendly

Roderigo Pascual, formerly a member of the 103rd Regt (Guerrilla) was taken into custody and turned over to CIC, CABANATUAN.

Roderigo Pascual is reported by civilians of CAANAN to have had in his possession recently 2 Jap pistols, 2 Jap rifles, 1 Garand rifle M1, and to have been demanding food and shelter in exchange for protection he was giving the community from Japs.

Pascual was taken into custody on grounds of complaint rendered by barrioc Lt of CAANAN.

1. Enemy Action and Countermeasures-

LAUR:

1400 4 June Co A Detachment in LAUR (904.5-1885.5) received report from civilian "some Japs" were in vicinity SULAPA(904.8-1886.6) 5 Japs were surprised and killed by Co A patrol along north bank of Nabae River at map coordinated (905.0-1887.25). It is believed all Japs present were killed.

Japs armed with a total of 2 cal. 25 rifles (in good condition) and 5 hand grenades (Jap). Uniform worn by enemy consisted of ragged dirty Jap Field uniform about the color of our (US) fatigues.

Bodies of Japs appeared to be well fed and healthy.

No papers or identification taken from the bodies.

Casualties- Co A- None.

One (1) Guerrilla received minor wound from fragment of Japanese grenade.

1. Enemy Action and Countermeasures-
LAUR:

0930 5 June Co A Detachment received civilian report that 10 Japs were in area near barrier of SAGANA (902.85-1883.75). A nine man patrol under command of Sgt McKay surrounded the Japs in a small valley at map coordinates (900.85-1882.75). The valley was sprayed with 30 Cal. M.G. fire and Japs were fired upon with individual small arms. At 1330 a number of our men moved unmolested through the valley and the bodies of eight (8) Japs were observed. The bodies exhibited recent hair cuts, cleanly shaven faces, appeared to have been well fed and in excellent health.

Uniform of Japs consisted of Jap Field uniform about the color of our (US) fatigues with wrap leggings and field packs. The uniforms were clean and in good condition.

The group of Japs had in their possession a total of two (2) cal. 25 Jap rifles and a U.S. Garand M1 rifle, serial no: 228147., plus several documents that accompany this report.

1. Enemy Action and Countermeasures

RIZAL - At 1000 civilians reported to have shot and killed two (2) Japs at 0630 in barrio SANPALOC (0894.5-1906.0). Co A patrol investigated and found the dead Jap bodies - dressed in Jap fatigues, in good physical condition and armed with a bayonet.

At 1800 9 June 8 Co A men captured 2 Japs (unarmed) 1 kilometer (0894.3-1901.85) west of RIZAL. One map was taken from their possession and is attached to this report.
