

GENERAL ORDERS

1. Sec III WD Cir. 416, 12-22-42, is quoted for the information and compliance of all concerned:

"III--PHOTOGRAPHS, SKETCHES, ETC., OF MILITARY ACTIVITIES.--The fol-lowing instructions will govern regarding the taking of photographs and making of sketches or other representations of military subjects, and will apply as well to officers, enlisted men, and civilian personnel of the War Department:

(1) No cameras or photographic equipment of any type will be permitted on any installation, post, camp, station, or military reservation without the express permission of the commanding officer of that installation, post, camp, station, or military reservation.

a. Cameras and photographic equipment in possession of any unauthorzed person entering a post will be surrendered until the bearer thereof leaves such post.

b. Films, cameras, and equipment of persons violatiing or attempting to violate the statute or the regulations issued thereunder will be confiscated immediately and, together with the bearer thereof, turned over to the commanding

officer, (2) Permission to take photographs of military subjects will continue in effect only for the period of time specified by the person granting such authority.

(3) In each instance the person authorized to take specific, clearly defined photographs will be accompanied, while such photographs are being taken, by an officer or competent enlisted man, or by a plant protection personnel.

(4) Examples of subjects of which photographs, drawings, sketches, and maps will not be permitted except when expressly authorized are-

a. United States Army personnel and equipment engaged in maneuvers.

b. Airplanes, munitions, trucks, tanks, etc., in transit from one post to another regardless of the mode whereby such material is transported.

Wrecks of itcms of military equipment.

Officers charged with carrying out these instructions may request (5) full cooperation of the local police and law enforcement agencies in discovering and approhending persons violating or attempting to violate the law or regulations

Copies of the regulations and instructions will be posted on organi-(6)zation bulletin boards or other prominent places."

2. All officers, enlisted men and civilian personnel will have their cameras removed from the reservation by Saturday January 16, 1943.

All officers, chlisted men, and civilian personnel who do not comply w with the above will have their cameras confiscated by the Company Commander.
