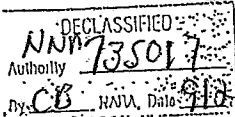

1. Sec III WD Cir. 416, 12-22-42, is quoted for the information and compliance of all concerned:

"III--PHOTOGRAPHS, SKETCHES, ETC., OF MILITARY ACTIVITIES.--The following instructions will govern regarding the taking of photographs and making of sketches or other representations of military subjects, and will apply as well to officers, enlisted men, and civilian personnel of the War Department:

(1) No cameras or photographic equipment of any type will be permitted on any installation, post, camp, station, or military reservation without the express permission of the commanding officer of that installation, post, camp, station, or military reservation.

a. Cameras and photographic equipment in possession of any unauthorized person entering a post will be surrendered until the bearer thereof leaves such post.

b. Films, cameras, and equipment of persons violating or attempting to violate the statute or the regulations issued thereunder will be confiscated immediately and, together with the bearer thereof, turned over to the commanding officer.

(2) Permission to take photographs of military subjects will continue in effect only for the period of time specified by the person granting such authority.

(3) In each instance the person authorized to take specific, clearly defined photographs will be accompanied, while such photographs are being taken, by an officer or competent enlisted man, or by a plant protection personnel.

(4) Examples of subjects of which photographs, drawings, sketches, and maps will not be permitted except when expressly authorized are--

a. United States Army personnel and equipment engaged in maneuvers.

b. Airplanes, munitions, trucks, tanks, etc., in transit from one post to another regardless of the mode whereby such materiel is transported.

c. Wrecks of items of military equipment.

(5) Officers charged with carrying out these instructions may request full cooperation of the local police and law enforcement agencies in discovering and apprehending persons violating or attempting to violate the law or regulations.

(6) Copies of the regulations and instructions will be posted on organization bulletin boards or other prominent places."

2. All officers, enlisted men and civilian personnel will have their cameras removed from the reservation by Saturday January 16, 1943.

3. All officers, enlisted men, and civilian personnel who do not comply with the above will have their cameras confiscated by the Company Commander.

4. Name of owner, make, serial number of confiscated cameras will be turned over to Licut. Levet, Saturday, January 16, 1943.

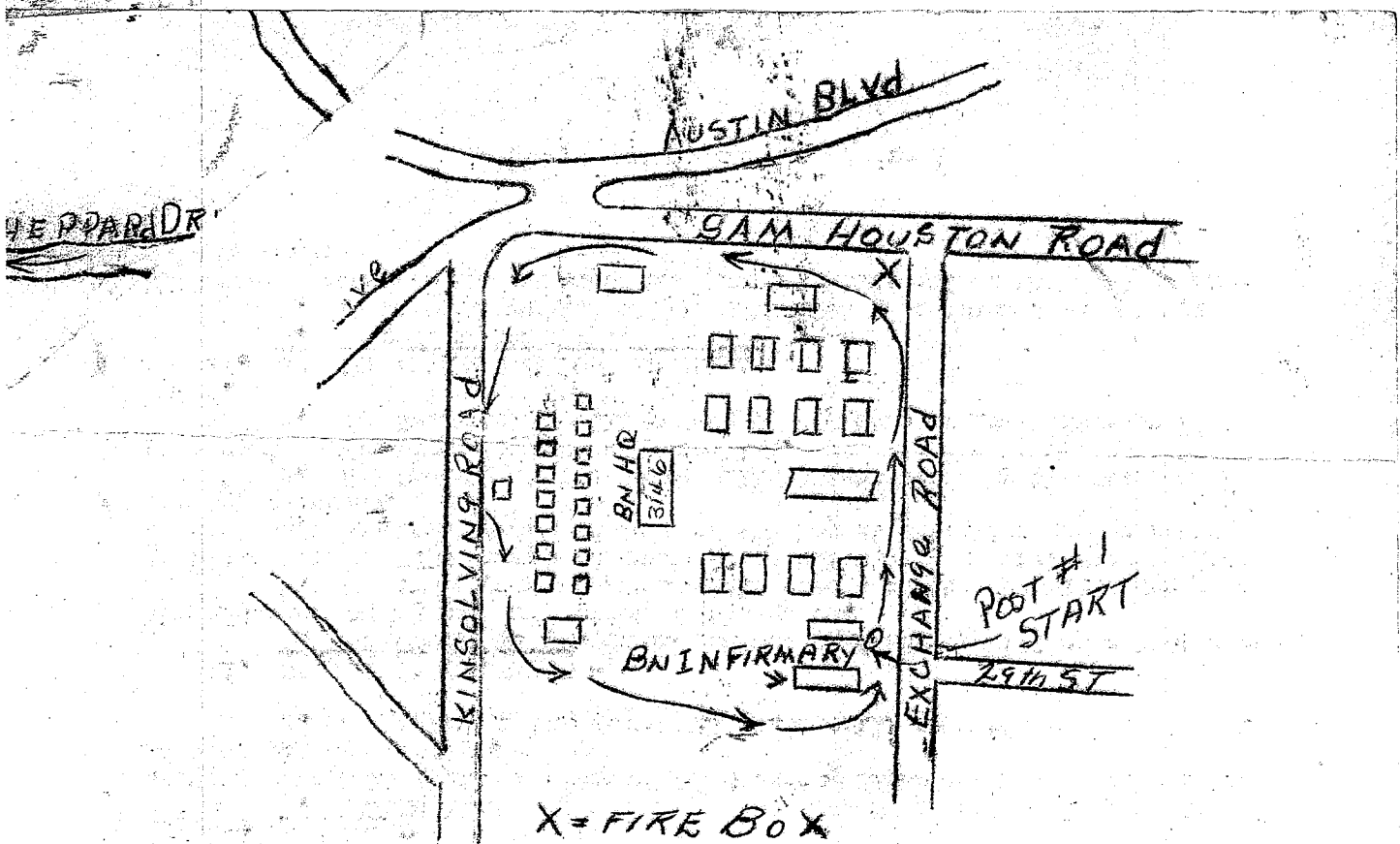

ORDERS FOR THE GUARD.

1. All previous Guard Orders of this Headquarters are rescinded.
2. The Guard will be by Battalion and will consist of an Officer of the Day, ~~1 Officer of the Guard~~, 1 Sergeant of the Guard, 3 Corporals, ~~10-15~~ 15 Privates, ~~1 Orderly~~, 1 Bugler and 1 Supernumary. The Supernumary will act as an emergency man and will return to his Company Area after guard mount.
3. The old and new Officers of the Day will report to the Battalion Commander at 1145.
4. All members of the guard will sleep in the guard ^{tents} ~~hutment~~.
5. GUARD MOUNT will be held at 1700
 - a. ~~First Call~~ - 1730
 - b. ~~Assembly~~ - 1735
 - c. ~~Adjutant's Call~~ - 1740
 - (1) The old guard will attend.
 - (2) Guard Mount will be held in the area south of Battalion Headquarters (Building number 3146).
6. Guards will be posted from 1740 to 1740.
7. The Officer of the Day will perform the duties prescribed in paragraph 13, Field Manual 26-5. He will inspect the guard at least 3 times: Once between retreat and midnight, once between midnight and reveille, and once immediately following daylight.
8. The Officer of the Day will take post ^{IMMEDIATELY NORTHEAST OF BN HQ} ~~in the vicinity of Building number 3142 along Exchange Road~~ at reveille and retreat to receive reports of the Company Duty Officers.
9. The Officer of the Guard will inspect each relief at least once while it is posted and at least once between midnight and reveille.
10. BUGLERS -
 - a. All Buglers will report to the area just ^{WEST} ~~north of Reconnaissance Company Mess Hall (Building number 3110) facing Exchange Road~~ to blow calls at reveille and retreat.
 - b. The Bugler of the Guard will blow calls from the same vicinity.
11. ORDERLY OF THE GUARD -
 - a. An Orderly of the Guard and the Supernumary will be selected by the Adjutant during his inspection of the guard.
 - b. The Orderly of the Guard will report to the Battalion Commander in his office at 0730 except on Sundays and holidays. He will report first to the Staff Noncommissioned Officer of the Day at Battalion Headquarters for instructions.
 - c. The Orderly of the Guard will be instructed by the Officer of the Guard on the proper method of reporting.
 - d. The Supernumary will return to his Company Area after guard mount.
12. SPECIAL ORDERS FOR POST NUMBER 1
 - a. My post is number 1.
 - b. It is that portion of the Battalion Area bounded on the east by Exchange Road, on the north by Sam Houston Road, and on the west by Kin-solving Road.

My post begins on Exchange Road opposite from the intersection of 29th Street and I will proceed north on Exchange Road, west on Sam Houston Road, south on Kinsolving Road to a point opposite the Officer's latrine and east to the intersection of Exchange Road and 29th Street, including the Battalion Infirmary keeping everything on my left.

d. I will be especially watchful for fires in my area and adjacent areas and will awake the occupants of the building and then report the fire by telephone, calling 100 (Wun - Zero - Zero).

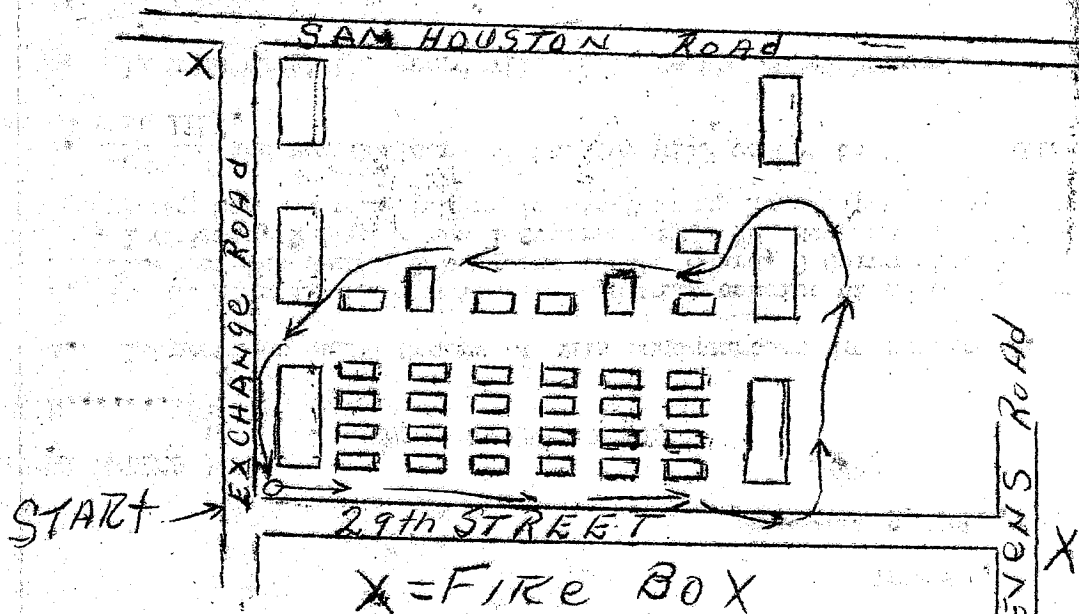
e. The fire alarm phones in my area are in the Battalion Headquarters (Building 3146) and at the southwest corner of Exchange and Sam Houston Roads.

f. I will challenge all persons who act suspiciously.

13. SPECIAL ORDERS FOR POST NUMBER 2

b. It is that portion of the Battalion Area occupied by "A" and "B" Company, bounded on the west by Exchange Road and on the south by 29th Street;



c. My post begins at the intersection of 29th Street and Exchange Road and I will proceed east along 29th Street to the "B" Company Mess Hall (Building number 3134). North around this building and "B" and "C" Company's Orderly Room (Building number 3154), west to Exchange Road and south to 29th Street, keeping everything on my left.

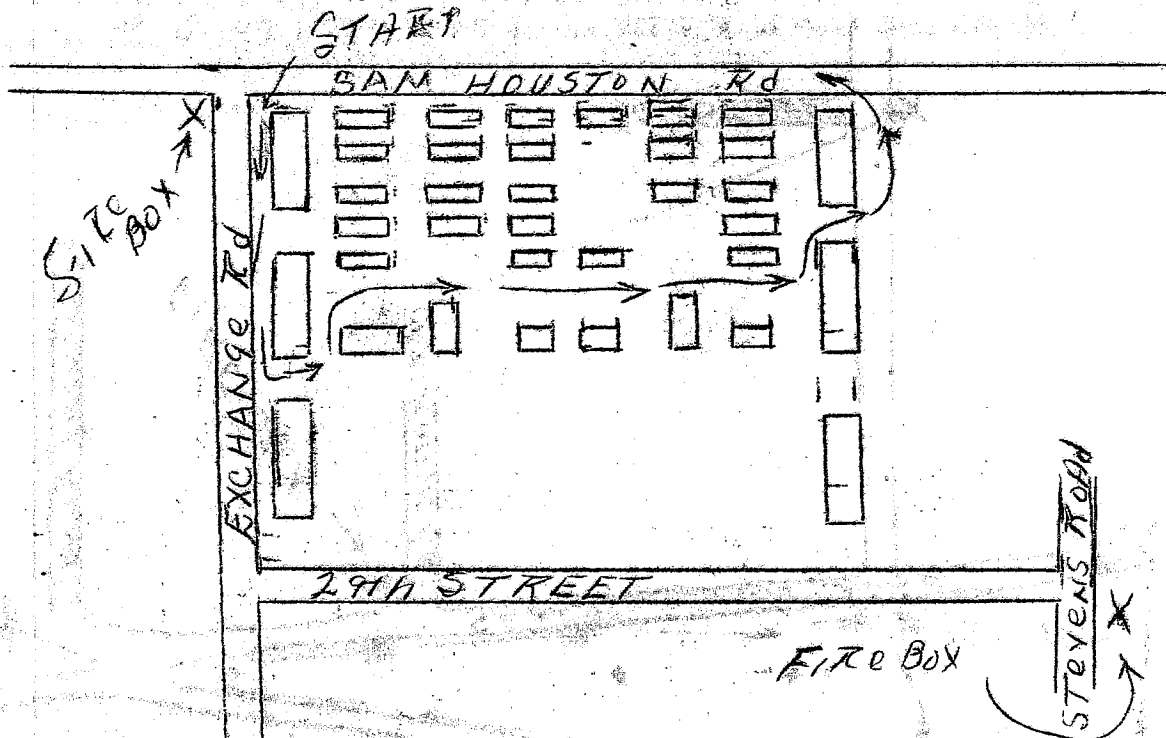

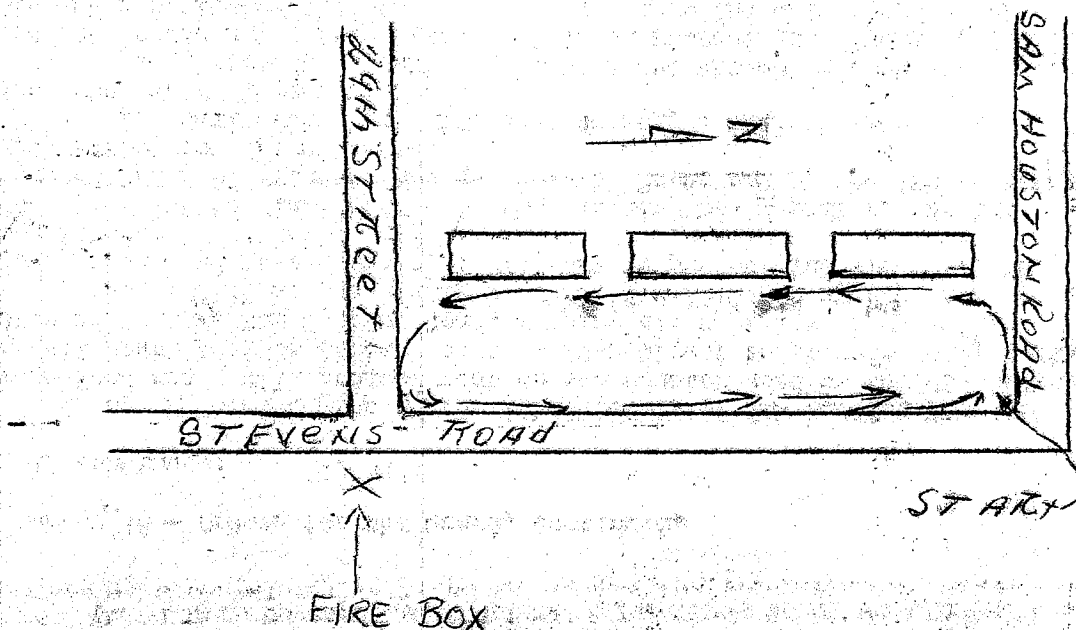
- a. My post is number 3.

f. During the hours for challenging, I will challenge all persons who enter the motor park.

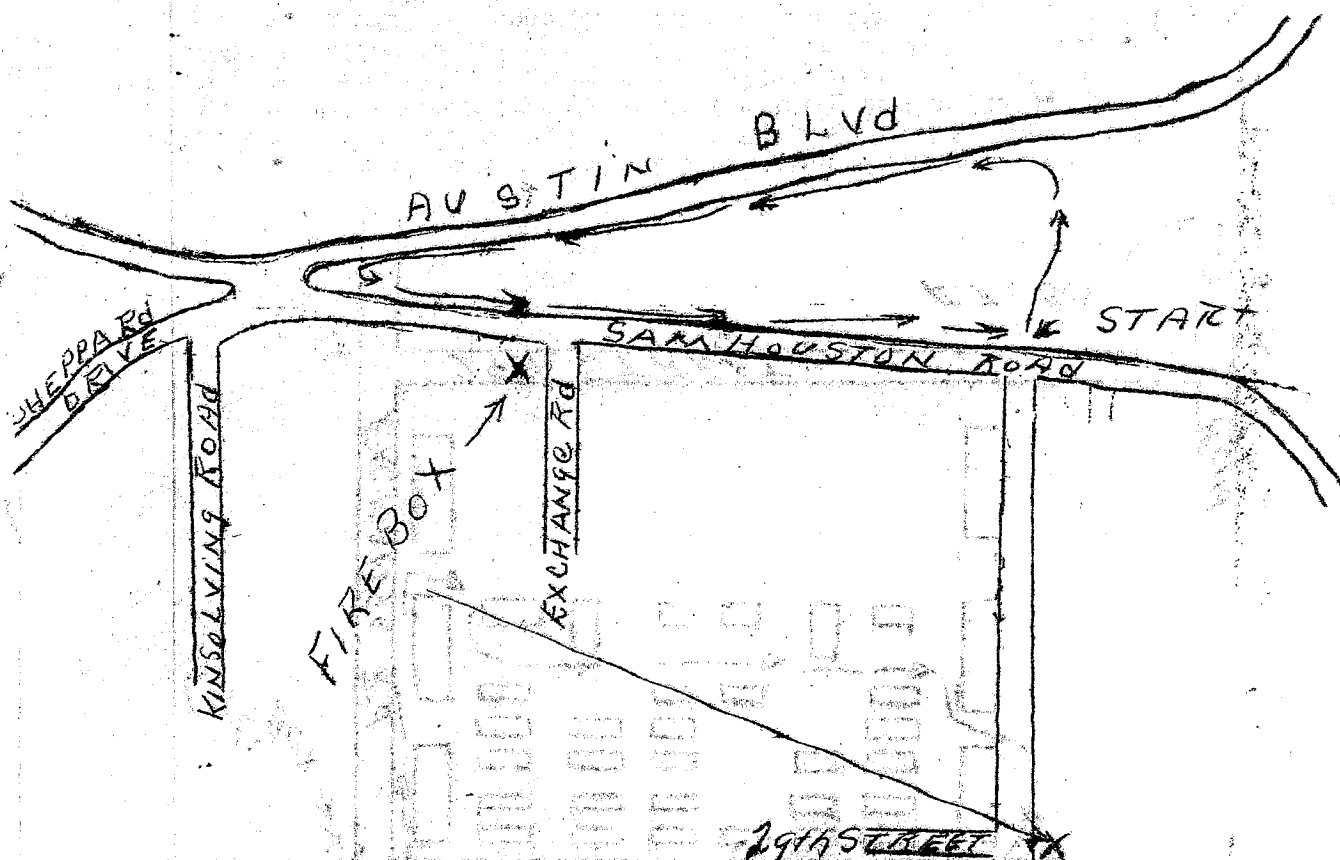

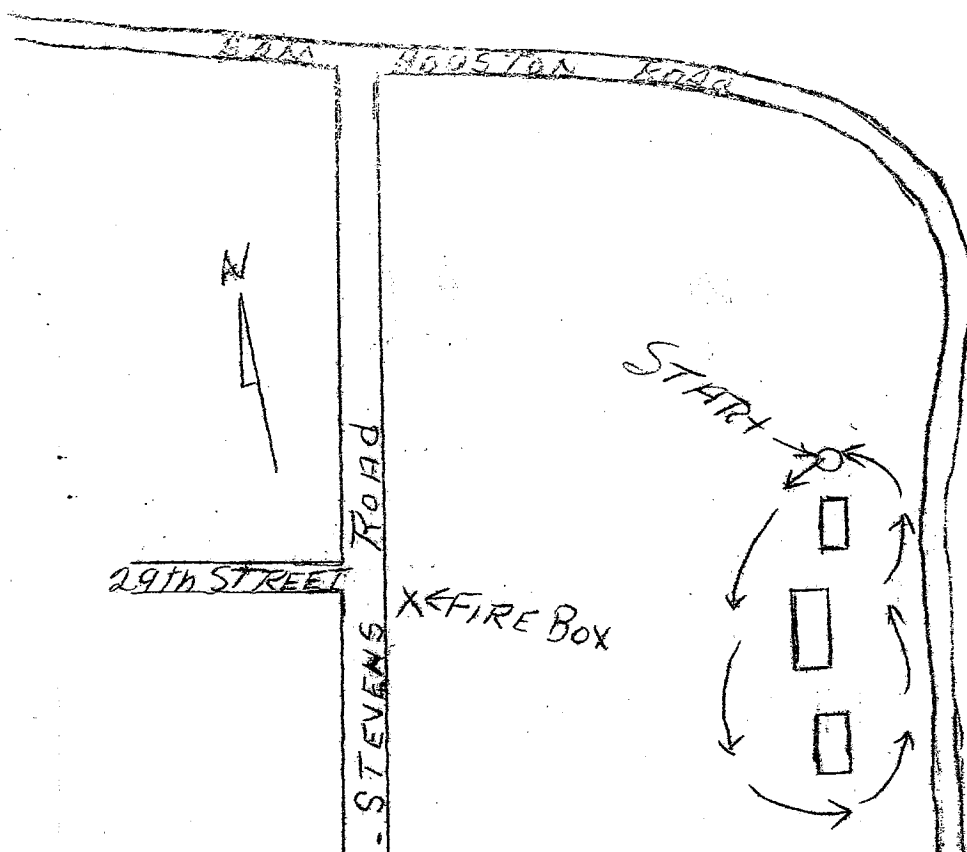
